History/Governance

- Founded in 1865 as a land-grant institution.
- Located in the heart of the beautiful Kentucky Bluegrass region on a 764-acre campus just south of downtown Lexington.
- 14 community colleges are a part of the University.
- The University also has a large medical center in Lexington with a 472-bed hospital.
- Policy is set by a 20-member Board of Trustees which includes alumni, faculty and student representation.
- Charles T. Wethington Jr. is the tenth president of the University.

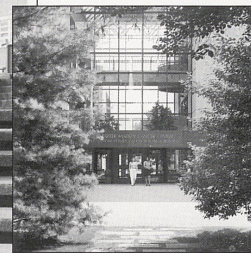
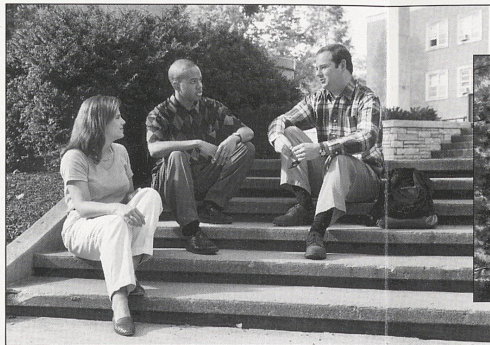

- 96 master's and 60 doctoral programs.
- More than 5,000 graduate students.



The Library

- UK's library system now has 2.6 million volumes.
- The UK library ranks 49th among research libraries in the nation.
- A new \$58 million library, the William T. Young Library, is under construction and will open in the fall of 1997 on the campus in Lexington.

Faculty

- 1,796 full-time in Lexington.
- 1,128 in the Community College System.
- 97% of the faculty in Lexington have the highest degree attainable in their field.
- UK faculty generated more than \$114 million in grants, contracts and gifts during 1995-96.

Students

- Enrollment at UK in Lexington is more than 24,000.
- Enrollment in the UK Community College System is about 43,600.

- More than 3,100 students are enrolled in the five colleges of the UK Chandler Medical Center.
- UK educates 39% of all students going to public and private colleges and universities in the state.
- UK consistently ranks at the top nationally in the number of National Merit Scholars in the freshman class. In the fall 1996 class there are 73 of them.
- There are 125 Kentucky Governor's Scholars and 118 high school valedictorians in the fall 1996 freshman class.
- The average ACT score for incoming freshmen is 24.8 — four points above the national average.
- For extra-curricular activities, students have more than 250 organizations in which to participate.
- 5,200 students live on campus in one of the 18 residence halls and the Greg Page Apartments.
- There are 25 fraternities and 17 sororities on the campus in Lexington.
