Minutes of the Meeting of the Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky, May 22, 1957.

The Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees of the University met in the President's Office at 9:30 a.m. CST, Wednesday, May 22, 1957, with the following members present: R. P. Hobson, Chairman; Louis Cox and Harper Gatton. Absent: Dr. Ralph J. Angelucci and J. Stephen Watkins. President Frank G. Dickey and Secretary Frank D. Peterson met with the Committee.

A. Approval of Minutes.

Upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, the minutes of the Executive Committee of March 11, 1957, were approved as published.

B. Financial Report

Vice President Peterson made the financial report for the ten-months period ended April 30, 1957. The report consisted of a balance sheet for current funds, restricted, plant and other funds. A statement of realized and unrealized income was given, as well as a report on departmental appropriations, expenditures and encumbrances.

Each member examined the report and, being advised, upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, the financial report was received and filed.

C. Various Purchases Approved.

Mr. Peterson submitted a list of purchases made from January 1, 1957, through March 31, 1957, and advised that all purchases had been made in accordance with approved policy of the Board of Trustees, and that the documents were available for examination. He recommended confirmation and approval.

Upon motion duly made, seconded and carried,

were confirmed, ratified and approved.

D. Injuries: -- Taylor, Griffin, Henderson, Hess.

Mr. Peterson submitted doctor's and hospital bills for services rendered to Louis G. Taylor. He advised that Mr. Taylor had in 1952 injured his spine and had from time to time been under the care of a physician. Upon the advice of various doctors, including Dr. Ralph J. Angelucci, Mr. Taylor received surgery to relieve pressure on a nerve in his back. The invoice was rendered by Dr. Ralph J. Angelucci for examination, x-ray-lumbosacral spine, operation and post-operative care, in the amount of \$272.00. St. Joseph Hospital rendered invoice for room, board and general care in the amount of \$224.20. Dr. Charles Moller rendered an invoice for anesthesia in the amount of \$35.00. Mr. Peterson recommended that the claims be paid with the expressed understanding that the University does not admit negligence nor liability.

Members being advised, on motion duly made, seconded and carried, the claims listed were authorized paid, with the expressed understanding that the University does not admit negligence nor liability.

Mr. Peterson reported an accident on February 16, 1957, in the kitchen of Boyd Hall to Mr. Ethelbert Griffin, an employee of the Women's Residence Halls. Mr. Griffin struck his head on the door of a metal fuse box, cutting a deep gash that required immediate attention. He reported to the Emergency Room of the Good Samaritan Hospital for treatment. Dr. D. M. Royalty performed the necessary medical services and submitted an invoice for \$10.00. The Hospital submitted bill for \$6.75 for the use of the Emergency Room. Mr. Peterson recommended that the account be paid, with the expressed understanding that the University does not admit negligence nor liabilativ.

Upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, the two invoices were authorized paid with the expressed understanding that the University does not admit negligence nor liability in paying these bills.

Mr. Peterson reported an accident to Mr. John A. Henderson, a janitor in the Division of Maintenance and Operations. The accident occurred on January 7, 1957, in the basement of the Coliseum-Swimming Pool. He was putting Celite Powder in the swimming pool equipment. A type of explosion resulted. Powder was blown into his eyes, causing an irritation of both eyes. The University Health Service washed out his eyes and called Dr. Claude W. Trapp, who rendered the necessary medical service. Dr. Trapp submitted an invoice for \$10.00. Mr. Peterson recommended that the account be paid with the expressed understanding that the University does not admit negligence nor liability.

Upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, the invoice of Dr. Trapp was authorized paid, with the expressed understanding that the University does not admit negligence nor liability in the payment of this account.

Mr. Peterson reported an accident to Mr. E. Walter Hess, an employee of the Division of Maintenance and Operations. The accident occurred on March 20, 1957, under the Social Sciences building. Mr. Hess was spraying for termites when the hose on the container he was using broke and insecticide was blown into his right eye. The University Health Service washed out his eye and sent him to see Dr. Claude W. Trapp who rendered medical service. Dr. Trapp submitted invoice for \$5.00 for medical services rendered. Mr. Peterson recommended that the account be paid, with the expressed understanding that the University does not admit negligence nor liability in paying the bill.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried, the Executive Committee concurred in the recommendation, with the understanding that the University does not admit negligence nor liability in connection with this account or by paying this claim.

E. Increase of Fees for Nursery School.

Mr. Peterson submitted a recommendation concerning the University Nursery School, operated by the School of Home Economics. He stated the school is set up to take care of 13 children per semester and is staffed by one assistant professor, one instructor, a maid or cook and some student help. The current fee is \$50.00 per semester per child and \$10.00 per summer session per child. With the approval of Associate Dean Wall of the College of Agriculture and Home Economics and the concurrence of the Director of the School of Home Economics, Doctor Marlatt, Mr. Peterson recommended that the fees be increased to \$60.00 per semester and \$15.00 per summer session, effective for the summer session, 1957.

Members of the Committee discussed the recommendation. Upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, they approved the fee of \$60.00 per semester and \$15.00 per summer session, effective June, 1957.

F. Assignment of Copyright, South from Hell-Fer-Sartin.

Mr. Peterson reported that Mr. Bruce F. Denbo, Director of the University of Kentucky Press, had recommended sale of about 500 copies of the book, South from Hell-Fer-Sartin by Leonard Roberts, including assignment of copyright, to the Council of the Southern Mountains, Inc., of Berea, Ky. The price is \$800.00. Mr. Peterson stated that the book is now selling at the rate of about 60 copies per year and it would be eight or ten years before we could sell the remainder of these copies, even if the current rate should continue. By disposing of these copies, we would gain space now used by the books and would have \$800.00 immediately to invest in other scholarly studies. The \$800.00 will reimburse the University for all capital outlay in connection with publication of the book and we shall have made a contribution to the literary field. President Dickey concurred in the recommendation.

Upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, the Vice President was authorized to sell to the Council of the Southern Mountains, Inc., of Berea, Ky., the remaining copies of South from Hell-Fer-Sartin for \$800.00 and to assign the copyright on the book.

G. Purchase of Various Properties.

Mr. Peterson recommended purchase of house and lot at 426 Columbia Avenue from Mr. and Mrs. Manville M. Duncan for the sum of \$8,000.00. The lot is 36 feet wide and $185\frac{1}{2}$ feet deep. The house consists of six rooms and bath. It fronts on Columbia Avenue and extends to the alley in the rear. The house is constructed of wood, the roof is good, and the house is in fair state of repair.

Mr. Peterson recommended purchase of a lot and four houses located on the east side of Sellers Street in Pralltown for the sum of \$800.00 from Esther Greenfield, through Virginia C. Wolking, Agent. He stated that the four small residences, not in a good state of repair, were situated on a lot having $118\frac{1}{2}$ feet on the north side, $88\frac{1}{2}$ feet on the south side, 51.7 feet at one end and 96.6 feet at the other end.

Mr. Peterson recommended the purchase of house and lot at 166 Virginia Avenue from Mrs. Minnie L. Moore, for the sum of \$19,000.00. This lot has a seven-room weatherboarded house and two utility houses. These are situated on a lot having a front footage of $108\frac{1}{2}$ feet on the north side, 117 feet on the south side, $463\frac{1}{2}$ feet on the east side and 466 feet on the west side. This is a very fine piece of property. It joins the building owned by the Kentucky Seed Stocks Association. It is within about 400 feet of the Experiment Station property.

Mr. Peterson recommended purchase of house and lot at 508 Rose Street from Mr. and Mrs. J. B. Campbell for \$8,800.00. The property is between Columbia and Clifton Avenues and has a front footage of 30 feet and a depth of 140 feet. There is a six-room house with bath.

Mr. Peterson recommended purchase of a house and lot at 414 Rose Street on the corner of Rose Street and Rose Lane from Mr. John R. Dale, for the sum of \$20,000,00. This property has a one and one-half story frame residence with garage, a front footage of 50 feet and a depth of 150 feet. This is a strategic piece of property and can be traded to the Westminster Foundation Board for property in the 500 block on Rose Street. Members of the Committee, President Dickey and Mr. Peterson discussed the above recommendations and the desirability of the University acquiring the property.

Upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, the Treasurer was authorized to purchase the property at 508 Rose Street for \$8,800.00; 426 Columbia Avenue for \$8,000.00; 166 Virginia Avenue for \$19,000.00; 414 Rose Street for \$20,000; and the houses on Sellers Street in Pralltown for \$800.00; and pay for same with Haggin Fund money.

H. Purchase of Property at 510 and 514 Rose Street as an Exchange for University Property at 412 and 414 Rose Street.

Mr. Peterson stated that the Westminster Foundation Board (Presbyterian) owned two adjoining lots on Rose Street, Nos. 510 and 514. These lots have a weatherboarded house on each, a front footage of 40 feet and a depth of 185 feet, which cost the Foundation approximately \$29,000. He stated that the University had requested the officers of the Westminster Foundation Board not to construct a student center house on this property since the University desired to acquire the property in this area for academic purposes, the lots having a depth of 150 feet and a front footage of 50 feet each.

President Dickey, members of the Committee and Mr. Peterson discussed the advisability of acquiring property in the 500 block and the obligation that the Westminster Foundation Board felt might exist by reason of their deferring construction. They discussed the value of the property and, being duly advised, upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, the exchange, at even trade, of University property at 412 and 414 Rose Street for the property owned by the Westminster Foundation Board at 510 and 514 Rose Street was approved and authorized.

I. Approval of Degrees of Graduates at May Commencement, 1957.

President Dickey submitted the list of candidates for degrees at the May Commencement, 1957, and recommended that they be authorized granted with the concurrence of the Faculty. He submitted the list.

Upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, the list of candidates was approved and the President was authorized to confer upon each the degree to which he is entitled at the May Commencement, 1957.

J. Summer Scholarship for Pyung Ho Pak.

President Dickey submitted a request from the Foreign Student Adviser, Dr. A. E. Bigge, asking for assistance for Mr. Pyung Ho Pak for the summer term. He recommended that a free-fee scholarship be granted to Mr. Pak for the summer term, 1957.

Upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, the President's recommendation was concurred in and the summer session fees waived for Mr. Pak.

K. Resignation of Dr. Robert L. Mills.

President Dickey submitted resignation of Dr. Robert L. Mills, Dean of Admissions and Registrar, effective June 12. Doctor Mills will accept a teaching position at the University of Texas. The President stated that the University sincerely regretted Doctor Mills' decision to leave, but that he thought Doctor Mills feels that he prefers teaching to serving in an administrative capacity.

Upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, the resignation of Doctor Mills was accepted, and the Executive Committee extended to him their best wishes in his new endeavors.

L. Dr. Charles F. Elton Appointed Acting Dean of Admissions and Registrar.

President Dickey submitted communication from Vice President Leo M. Chamberlain recommending Dr. Charles F. Elton as Dean of Admissions and Registrar to succeed Dr. Robert L. Mills.

Doctor Elton came to the University in June, 1956, as director of the University Counseling Service. He had formerly been employed in a similar position in the University of Mississippi. Doctor Elton is 37 years

of age, is married and has two children. He received his doctorate in psychology from Ohio State University in 1951. His master's and bachelor's degrees were also taken at Ohio State. President Dickey recommended the appointment as Acting Dean and Registrar, effective June 1, 1957, with an adjustment in salary.

Upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, Dr. Charles F. Elton was appointed Acting Dean and Registrar, effective June 1, 1957.

M. Extension Centers Discussed.

President Dickey reported on the Northern Kentucky Extension Center and the proposed extension centers in Harlan County and at Ashland, Ky. He stated that a committee was studying the location for the proposed center in Harlan County and undoubtedly would be ready to make a report in June. Negotiations had been going on with the Ashland Board of Education concerning the possibility of the University establishing a center at Ashland.

The information was received. No action was taken.

N. Regulations Governing Student Motor Vehicles.

President Dickey submitted proposed changes in the regulations governing student motor vehicles as prepared by Dean L. L. Martin. The regulations were discussed at some length and the Committee, seeming to be uncertain as to what should be done at this time, tabled the recommendation with permission to bring it up at some later date.

O. Degree, Specialist in Education, Authorized.

President Dickey submitted a proposal from the College of Education and a recommendation from Dean Herman E. Spivey that the University authorize a new degree "Specialist in Education", (Sp. Ed.). He stated that the degree is an intermediate one between the master's and the doctor's and is intended to help lift the educational proficiency of some of our public school teachers by providing a well-planned sixth year of work. He reported that Dean Ginger had worked with the Graduate Dean in bringing about the sixth-year degree program in Education. President Dickey recommended that the degree be authorized, and upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, the University was authorized to grant the degree "Specialist in Education".

P. Transfer of Dr. Jane Haselden to Full-Time Teaching Position.

President Dickey stated that Assistant Dean Jane Haselden, who is also an assistant professor in the Department of Modern Foreign Languages, wished to be relieved of administrative duties, effective July 1, 1957. He recommended, with the approval of the Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences and the Department of Modern Foreign Languages, that she be assigned

to full-time duties in that department, effective July 1, 1957. The salary now being paid for the position of part-time Assistant Dean of Women is to be transferred to the budget of the Department of Modern Foreign Languages. Dean Haselden is needed full time in this department, not only because the enrollment in French is great but because she is well qualified as a teacher and as a research student in the field of French literature.

Upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, the recommendation was concurred in and the necessary transfer authorized.

Q. Professor Laura K. Martin to Do Off-Campus Work.

President Dickey presented a request from Dean M. M. White that Associate Professor Laura K. Martin be permitted to make a survey of the Frankfort and Shelbyville public libraries. He stated that this request had come from the Director of the State Library Extension Division and the work would be done as part of the library development program in the State. He stated that there seems to be no other person available to do this work and that Associate Professor Martin will receive \$150.00 per month for the survey work. The time required will not interfere with her duties at the University.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried, the request was granted.

R. Eric Mangelsen Appointed,

President Dickey submitted request from the Aeronautical Research Laboratory that Mr. Eric Mangelsen, son of Fritz Mangelsen, be employed temporarily to work in the Aeronautical Research Laboratory.

Upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, permission was given to employ Mr. Eric Mangelsen on temporary basis to work in the Aeronautical Research Laboratory.

S. Dr. Angelucci Reappointed to Board of Directors of Kentucky Research Foundation.

President Dickey advised the Committee that the term of office of Dr. Ralph J. Angelucci as member of the Kentucky Research Foundation expires this year. He stated that a member of the Board of Trustees should be appointed to fill the vacancy.

Upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, Dr. Ralph J. Angelucci was reappointed to represent the Board of Trustees as a member of the Kentucky Research Foundation.

T. Student Loan Fund Maximum Raised.

President Dickey reported a communication from Dr. Cecil C. Carpenter, Chairman of the Student Loan Fund Committee, recommending that the limit of loans to students from the Student Loan Fund be increased from \$50,000.00 to \$60,000.00, in the aggregate, effective September 1, 1957. President Dickey reported that the Committee has 231 loans amounting to \$48,255.36. He stated that the Committee felt that the maximum amount of the fund that can be loaned to students should be raised at this time. President Dickey reported that he felt that the Committee is doing a good job administering the Student Loan Fund and recommended that the request be granted. He also reported some delinquents on former loans made.

Members of the Executive Committee discussed the work of the Student Loan Fund Committee, and upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, authorized the amount to be used for student loans increased to \$60,000.00 and directed the Vice President, Business Administration, to make an effort to collect delinquent payments on notes, and, if necessary, to take legal action.

U. Appointments to Graduate Faculty.

President Dickey read a communication from the Graduate Council recommending additions to the Graduate Faculty as follows:

Professor Bernard Fitzgerald, Department of Music Professor Samuel C. Hite, Head of the Department of Chemical Engineering

> Assistant Professor W. C. Royster, Department of Mathematics Associate Professor Kurt W. E. Starke, Department of Chemistry.

President Dickey concurred in the recommendation, and upon motion duly made, seconded and carried

Professor Bernard Fitzgerald, Department of Music Professor Samuel C. Hite, Head of the Department of Chemical Engineering

> Assistant Professor W. C. Royster, Department of Mathematics Associate Professor Kurt W. E. Starke, Department of Chemistry

were appointed to the Graduate Faculty of the University of Kentucky.

V. Budget Adjustments.

President Dickey recommended that \$2,500.00 be added to the Health Service budget; \$5,000.00 be appropriated to the College of Pharmacy for purchase of equipment; \$1,200.00 be appropriated for administrative travel; \$8,000.00 be added to the Department of Chemistry budget to be used for the purchase of equipment; and \$50.00 be appropriated for expenses in connection with dedication of the Barkley Room in the Library.

Upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, the Executive Committee concurred in the recommendation and the necessary funds were authorized allotted from the unappropriated surplus of the General University Fund.

W. College of Pharmacy Building, Louisville, Used for Extension Classes.

President Dickey reported that the College of Pharmacy in Louisville would be moved to the Lexington campus in June. He stated that the cornerstone for the new College of Pharmacy building was laid on May 17 and that the building was ready for occupancy. He stated that the University had been conducting extension courses in Louisville for a number of years and recommended that the College of Pharmacy building be used hereafter as a location for extension classes.

Members of the Executive Committee expressed the thought that this was a good use to make of the property, and upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, the facilities of the College of Pharmacy, located in Louisville, were assigned to house extension classes conducted by the University in the City of Louisville.

X. Gifts.

From: Foundry Educational Foundation -- \$500.00.

President Dickey presented to the Executive Committee check for \$500.00 from the Foundry Educational Foundation, and explained that the Foundation had designated it for use in the Department of Metallurgical Engineering. He recommended that the gift be accepted.

Upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, the check for \$500.00 was authorized accepted and the President was requested to write a letter of appreciation to the Foundation.

From: Knott Coal Corporation - \$1,000.00.

President Dickey reported receipt of \$1,000.00 from the Knott Coal Corporation, given in support of their scholarship plan. He recommended that the gift be accepted.

Upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, the gift of \$1,000.00 from the Knott Coal Corporation was ordered accepted and the President was asked to thank the donors.

From: Wesson Metal Corporation--\$2,000.00.

President Dickey presented check for \$2,000.00 from Wesson Metal Corporation and recommended that it be accepted.

Upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, the gift of \$2,000.00 was ordered accepted, and the President was asked to write a letter to the donors, thanking them for their generosity.

From: Merck & Company, Inc. --\$500.00.

President Dickey presented check for \$500,00 given by Merck & Company, Rahway, N.J., to be used to assist in the Experiment Station's research concerned with the response of tobacco with gibberellic acid under field conditions. He recommended acceptance of the gift.

Upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, the gift of \$500.00 from Merck & Company was ordered accepted, and President Dickey was requested to thank the donors.

From: Union Carbide and Carbon Corporation, New York--Two Checks of \$1250.00 Each.

Z. Purchase of Storage Building

Mr. Peterson reported that it would be necessary to move out of the red storage building in order to make room for the site of the Medical Center. He stated that it would be necessary to acquire storage facilities and that an all-metal storage building 50° x 200° could be purchased. He stated that it would cost about \$32,500 to buy and erect such a building.

Upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, the sum of \$32,500.00 was appropriated from the unappropriated surplus for the purchase and erection of a storage building at the University.

A-1. Transformer Station for Kentucky Utilities Company.

Mr. Peterson reported that it would be necessary to move the transformer station now located at the intersection of Rose and Limestone streets to a site southeast of the new Medical Sciences-Hospital building. He stated that the Kentucky Utilities Company was willing to move the station at its own expense but that it would be necessary to bring a line from the new location back to the intersection of Rose and Limestone streets in order to connect with the existing electric loop around the University campus. He reported two conferences with Kentucky Utilities officials concerning connection of the existing station to the new site. The Kentucky Utilities Company desires that the lines be installed on poles, the University thinks that the lines should be underground. The Kentucky Utilities Company has agreed to put the lines underground at a cost of about \$40,000 to \$50,000 and the University will pay the cost of putting the connection necessary for the University electrical loop underground. The Kentucky Utilities will be given an easement to the site selected southeast of the Medical Sciences-Hospital building.

The involved problem was discussed at some length, and upon motion duly made, seconded and carried, the Kentucky Utilities Company was granted an easement to the site for the new location of the transformer station, with the understanding that all lines going to the transformer station and extending from the transformer station back to the University loop are to be underground.
