Over the past decade, thirteen UK faculty members' proposals have been funded by the NEH Summer Stipend program. William Y. Adams, professor of Anthropology, held a stipend for the summer of 1990.

This year the University will nominate three proposals for the national competition. Faculty are

encouraged to apply. Before applicants draft their proposals they should pick up a copy of the 1992 application guidelines from the office of the Associate Dean for Arts and Sciences. Interested faculty should submit a proposal and a curriculum vita to that office by Thursday, September 12, 1991. The proposal should follow the application guidelines and should be written to appeal to educated

nonspecialists. A faculty committee will evaluate each proposal and select the three to be submitted to the NEH.
