

Preparation a must for surviving Add/Drop

Dexter says don't panic:
"we haven't lost one yet"

Preparation is the key for surviving Add/Drop — being prepared for long lines, that is.

Beginning tomorrow, students who advanced registered may alter schedules at Memorial Coliseum. Before starting Add/Drop, however, they should be aware of the problems that may arise from lack of preparation.

For the uninitiated, Add/Drop may seem an example of organized chaos. Coming prepared, however, eases the anxiety and allows for a quick and usually trouble-free experience.

The most important thing, associate registrar George Dexter said, is for students to know what they want before coming to Add/Drop. Students should arrive at Memorial Coliseum, where Add/Drop is held, at the appointed time and follow signs to the proper line. After receiving an Add/Drop permit card at station one, the next step will be to obtain a computer card (the card is required for each class change) at departmental tables on the concourses and central floor of the coliseum.

Now the fun begins. Students should be prepared not to get all the classes they want. Usually, many classes are filled and students must make alternate choices (check the schedules inside this edition). Having alternatives planned out before

arriving at Add/Drop is a good way to avoid frustration.

After getting the cards, students should complete them with No. 2 lead pencils. The cards must be filled out completely, including correct name and Social Security number.

Students should also remember the following:

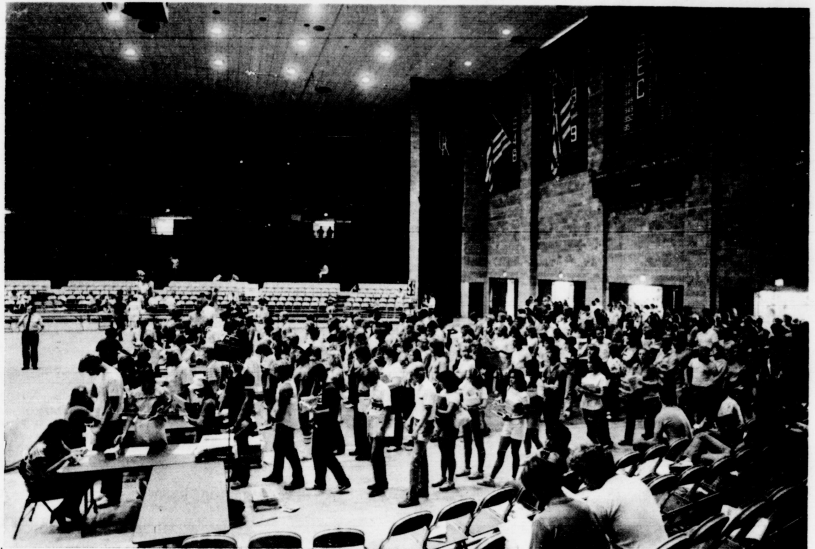
- Always have a student ID.
- Pick up an instruction sheet at the entrance to Add/Drop. The sheet includes a map and step-by-step instructions.
- Pick up an IBM permit card at the entrance. These cards must be used to complete the process.

Dexter said students must be sure they have registered in advance before coming to Add/Drop, and recommended that they bring class schedules.

He also said students should find out if their college requires the approval of an adviser before participating in Add/Drop.

Regarding time and course alternatives: If a class is full, students should not lose hope — instead check every day for openings. Also, they should check with instructors of desired courses. Depending on departmental guidelines and a professor's preference, they may sometimes squeeze into a class listed as full, Dexter said.

Dexter's final advice to students is not to panic. He said about 6,000 students go through Add/Drop every semester and that the University has suffered no casualties — so far.

Kinks worked out of new system - hopefully

Financial aid recipients will find shorter lines, less hassle

Students receiving financial aid should find the going a little easier this semester, David Stockham, director of student financial aid, said. The endless lines of Fall, hopefully, will be a thing of the past.

"Before the new system, students went to one table and got their checks, and then went to another where they had to pay their fees," he said. "This system allows students to apply their grants directly to their accounts."

The University tried this system for the first time in the Fall, he said. "Of course, there are problems the first time you do anything," he said. "We were trying to do too much in too narrow a period of time. The changes we have made are part of an attempt to give better service."

But Stockham warned that because of changes in the system to make distribution easier, recipients will have to wait a little longer for their checks. They should plan to have enough money to cover ex-

penses for books, meals and incidentals for at least the first two weeks of this semester, he said.

The new system permits students who have advanced registered, paid the \$50 advanced registration fee and do not owe the University money from a prior semester to obtain their aid today through Jan. 19 in the Student Center Grand Ballroom.

Students who register today may obtain their aid Jan. 17-19 in the ballroom, or thereafter in Room 245 of the Student Center.

Students not receiving financial aid should not go the ballroom, but should pay their tuition at the new Student Billing Services office, 257 Student Center.

Students who register between Wednesday and Jan. 18 may obtain their aid Jan. 24 and 25 in the Billing Services office. Financial aid checks will be distributed there after Jan. 25.

Although the new system should be more convenient, Stockham said it will not be absolutely foolproof. As

always, processing delays may still occur and some aid will not arrive on schedule.

He said, however, that the University believes the new schedule will provide better service for a majority of aid recipients.

Effective this semester, students receiving National Direct Student Loans must come to the Worsham Theatre in the Student Center Addition for the signing of promissory notes and the completion of the required forms (see the schedule at right for times).

Recipients must bring:

- a student ID and driver's license
- complete address and phone numbers of three references (other than students)
- credit card number(s)
- bank account number.

Stockham said students who do not report at the correct time with all of the above information will not receive their loans.

Students who register late or who must add classes to complete their schedules and who receive Pell

Grants and/or Kentucky Higher Education Assistance Authority grants must come to the Financial Aid Office with proof of the number of hours they are taking in order to have their aid processed.

Many recipients of the Pell Grant, Stockham said, will receive slightly more money in the fall because of decisions made by Congress during the last few months.

"The decision-making about various categories has been made on a rather 11th hour basis," he said. "What we had in Fall was not everything we eventually distributed. Now we have it all straightened out."

He said recipients not returning for this semester were notified through newspaper ads last semester that they might be entitled to more money. "But we didn't want to go through business of putting a little more money in everybody's account in Fall, so now we'll put it in this Spring," he said.

"It's not for everybody," he said. "It could be as little as \$5 and as much as \$100."

Late fee payers will find no amnesty, Student Billings office head says

Last semester, the University found itself in an awkward position — it had enacted a new rule, but it couldn't enforce it in good conscience.

The rule, part of a more convenient payment system made possible by a new computerized system, requires that all students pay a \$50 registration fee in advance. The penalty for non-payment is cancellation of one's class schedule.

But several hundred letters notifying students that they should mail in the fee were lost in the mail, so the University granted a blanket amnesty to all advanced registered students who had not paid it — no class schedules were canceled, and the University allowed all who had not paid in advance to pay tuitions as usual.

This time, however, the requirement will be enforced, Ben Crutcher, director of Student Billing Services, said.

"This partial payment tells us who is coming back next semester and who is not," Crutcher said. The balance of tuition and fees must be paid by Jan. 25, and student IDs will not be validated until the balance of tuition is paid.

Payment can be made at the new Student Billings Services office, 257 Student Center, between 8:30 and 4:30.

IDs for students who have paid in advance will be validated in the Student Center Grand Ballroom today through Jan. 19.

For students receiving financial aid, the University will automatically apply the appropriate amount of aid received to their accounts for housing or tuition.

New students should pay registration fees between Wednesday and Jan. 25, the deadline, and students registering late should pay either Jan. 24 or 25 (the last two days to pay) at the billings office.

Students who haven't taken care of their payments in advance or who make last-minute changes — particularly those who change from full-time to part-time status or vice-versa — should notify the registrar's office. Students who change their meal plans should notify the housing and dining office.

Failure to notify either office will delay the requested changes, Crutcher said.

Crutcher said students who include payment for the Student Health Services in their checks should note this on the back of their checks along with their names and Social Security numbers.

"Sometimes we just have to guess what the money is for if it isn't written on the check," Crutcher said.

• New students who haven't pre-registered must do so today. Returning students who did not advance register can register on Jan. 12 and 13 on the Mezzanine of Patterson Office Tower or on Jan. 14-18 in the Advising Conference Office, 204 Miller Hall.

All fees should be paid at the new Student Billing Services, 257 Student Center, before Jan. 25 to avoid cancellation of registration. IDs can be validated at the Stu-

dent Center Ballroom today through Friday.

The Financial Aid Office has a new schedule for distribution of awards. Students who have advanced registered, paid their \$50 advanced registration fee and do not owe the University money from a prior semester can obtain their aid Jan. 10 through Jan. 19 in the Ballroom. Students who register Jan. 10 may obtain their aid Jan. 17-19 in the Ballroom or thereafter in Room 245 of the Student Center. Students who register Wednesday through Jan. 18 may obtain their aid Jan. 24 and 25 in Room 245 of the Student Center.
