Opponents of several proposals to reform federal student aid won the help of U.S. President Bill Clin-

UK student Alison Crabtree met with Clinton yesterday morning to lobby against cuts on the Federal Direct Lending program, Student Government Association President Shea Chaney said.
Crabtree, the executive director of External Affairs for the National Association of Students for Higher Education, was part of a contingent of about a dozen students who met with Clinton at the University of Southern Illinois.
Crabtree could not be reached for comment as of press time last night. She is expected to return to UK today.

Details of Clinton's meeting also were not available yesterday. Chaney said.

The meeting occurred on the first day of "Save State Mich was declared yesterday by Clinton and several national student organizations.

The television station reported that Ms. Booze claims her husband was negligent in leaving their child in the vehicle and says that should be covered by the insurance policy.

Enrollment increases slightly

Enrollment figures for the 1995 fall semester show a slight increase since last year. The total enrollment for the University system, including the Lexington campus and the Medical Center, was estimated at 24,435 compared to 24,217 last year or a one percent increase.

This year's average ACT score for incoming freshman was 24.8, which is four points above the national average. The average score was down one tenth of a point from 24.9 last year.

The total black student enrollment at the Lexington Campus was estimated at 1,170. This is an eight percent gain over last year.

Galbraith has many plans for the future. He plans to work on his firm near campus, as well as become politically involved after the election for governor in November.

It was a big victory for the Cats, big enough for a major soccer publication to open its eyes and take notice of a young team hun-gry for recognition.

For the first time since becoming a varsity sport in 1991, the UK men's soccer team has been ranked in a national polit.

Succer News, a national magazine coverting soccer in the United States has placed the Cats No. 25 in this week's polit. The appearance in the national ranking comes after head coach Ian Collins' squad downed the fifth-ranked Indiana Hoosiers 1-0 in double overtime Sunday night.

It was strong defense and a confidant squad which helped create what Collins called UK's biggest win in history.

'I think this (victory) is going to give us some recognition, Collins said. "People are going to sit up and take nottee."

The victory over IU, coupled with wins last week against Valparaiso (Ind.) and North Carolina-Asheville puts the Cats at the 3-0 mark, their best start since the program began in 1991.

Senior striker Brian Dausman, who had two shots on goal, said beating IU was an "indescribable feeling."
"Every year we want to beat them and we plan to beat them, but we never beat them," he said.
"And this year, to finally beat them... it was incredible."

"We had no doubts going into the game," he said. "And everyone in the stands and in the country did. We outplayed them. We deserved to win. This wasn't a fulke game."

Collins was optimistic about the rest of the season but said he was approaching every game with the same attitude the Cats had when they played IU.


This notorious reputation is may have the world down various offers including animal the world down various offers including animal deeply rooted feelings of hate.



Grants increase for UK researchers

By Aaron O. Hall

In the face of decreased federal and state funding for educational institutions, UK's faculty received \$117 million from grants, loans and fellowships last year.

This year's total marks an increase of about 15 percent over last year's amount.

"(The 15 percent increase) in the face of constant contractions in federal funding is incredible," said Jerry Bramwell, vice president for research and graduate studies.

The amount increase stems from the school's consistency (to reinvest its money back into the "fabric of the college," Bramwell said.

This also could help UK hire good faculty members and attract top-notch researchers, he said.

The funding will assist 945 new projects this fiscal-year, in addition to a large number of projects.

"What's happened is that many of the grants and contracts that have been in the works for years have finally come through," Bramwell said. "Also, the dollar amounts of some grants have

increased."

UK's College of Dentistry received the second largest award of \$1.8 million from the Government of Kuwait for its five-year "Oral Health Program for Schoolchildren in Kuwait" pro-

Schoolchildren in Kuwait" program.

UK's campus is not the only one seeing big increases in research awards. The community colleges went from 56.1 million to \$13 million in funding in the past our years, Bramwell said.

UK will probably have to rely more on outsiders for contributions, Bramwell said, because of

continuing decreases in funding from the federal government. These areas may include funding from international sources and royalty licensing.

UK will have to design its own ideas and market them to outside companies, Bramwell said.

"Certain ideas we will transfer to, say, Toyota for royalty licensing," Bramwell said. "It can be a big or small company."

Other top recipients include Kentucky's Transportation Center, the College of Engineering and Sanders-Brown Center on Aging.

One way to retain students is to make them satisfied with their educational environment.

In order to gauge student feelings toward UK, Wethington said the University is working to develop a student survey to find out about students' experiences and perceptions both in their undergraduate studies and non-instructional environments. Wethington also introduced a committee developed to study the strengths and weaknesses of the graduate school.

The committee will also study whether the money being spent by the graduate program is being spent efficiently and effectively.

"Our primary focus is not to focus negative attention on existing programs, but adding quality to a graduate school I feel is already quite good," Wethington said.

The Senate also unanimously approved a position paper from the Kentucky Advocates for Higher Education that calls for a \$106 million boost to fund higher education.


