BOT: It's Christmas for UK funds

University has built up more than \$50 million in its coffers, all available for matching funds under governor's program

More than \$50 million in private gifts and contributions are now eligible for matches by the Research Challenge Trust Pund after the UK Board of Trustees met yesterday afternoon.

A total of \$31,829,350 was accepted and allocated by the board. Over 20 newly announced gifts and pledges to the University were approved by the board, totaling \$9,570,250. The board also allocated gifts and pledges previously accepted for a total of \$82,056,900.

Kentucky General Assembly, allocates up to \$86.7 million to UK in matching funds through gifts and pledges.

The University now has approximately \$16 million to raise in gifts and pledges to meet the challenge.

"You can see why this was such an exciting meeting for the board. This is the first time in our history we have reached such high levels of these gifts," Burch said.

UK President Charles Wethington said after the meeting that the goal is to complete the challenge by the end of the calendar year. Wethington said he hopes to report to Gov. Patton and the General Assembly the success of the project.
"I want the University of Kentucky to have a record of success to meet the match. It's been important to the University to make a positive change," Wething-

As a result of the challenge, Wethington said there was much more interest in private fund-raising and an incentive to those who are raising funds.

"We are very pleased with the positive reaction we have received from private donors — individuals, corporations and foundations," Wethington said. 'I believe it shows that our alumni and friends realize the importance of this Research Challenge Trust Fund program and what it means to the future of our University."

Contributions aided multiple areas, from agriculture to the William T. Young Library Endowment.

With only \$16.7 million left to meet the challenge, members of the board remain confident of their success, not only of meeting the goal, but of the positive results already received through its incentive.

Finding the right chord

Rabchevsky can help fulfill dream of helping those with spinal injuries through grant approved by UK Board of Trustees

Alexander Rabchevsky was a junior in college when his motorcycle crashed.

Fifteen hours later, he said he was still moving his legs. But later, Rabchevsky said the area around his spinal cord injury swelled, leaving him in a wheelchair, paralyzed from the chest down.

Rabchevsky, who was already a premed student, said he immediately began looking for opportunities to enter the field of spinal cord injury research.

That was in 1985. Now, Rabchevsky is a 32-year-old post-doctoral fellow at UK, studying the effects of a drug he hopes will eventually minimize the effects of spinal cord injury for others.

Thanks to a recent grant from the state's Spinal Cord and Head Injury Trust, Rabchevsky's work might be secure for the future.

The UK Board of Trustees yesterday accepted the \$2.5 million gift, which will be used to create a proposed Spinal Cord and Brain Injury Research Center.

"The (Spinal Cord and Head Injury Trust advisory) board really wants to get a head start in bringing together a strong group of people" to study these injuries,

said Phyllis Wise, chair of the physiology department and serves on the trust's advisory board.

"Ultimately, we'll find ... a way to treat the people that suffer from this faster," she said.

The funds for the proposed UK center will be distributed over a period of five years and used to establish "a center without walls," which will include allocations for endowed chairs for: a clinical director, two faculty members conducting spinal cort and prain injury research, and post dectoral and gradient spinal cort and prain injury research, and post dectoral and gradient spinal cort and prain injury search, and post precise of anatomy and neurobiology and interim director of the proposed center.

The University of Louisville will receive a similar grant for spinal cord and head injury studies, although it does not plan to use the money in the same way, Wise said.

The trust, which was established four years ago, has accrued the funds from a \$12.50 surcharge added to all Kentucky speeding tickets.

The Kentucky legislature was the first to adopt this kind of plan, and a number of others have followed suit, Geddes said.

Senate studies Y2K outlook

WASHINGTON — The Senate yesterday fo-cused on the Year 2000 computer problem. By 990, the Senate passed a bill establishing a Small Busi-ness Administration program to provide loan guarantees to small companies trying to repair computers or prevent interruptions in supplies. Sen. Christopher Dodd (D-Conn.) and Sen. Bob Bennett (R-Utah), who head a special Senate panel on the "Y2K" problem, issued a 160-page report outlining serious potential problems in health care, energy supply and government services. But they also emphasized that, for most Americans, disruptions in vital services will be minimal.

The former White House intern whose sexual encounters with President Clinton led to his impeachment spoke to Barbara Walters for an interview to air on "20/20" tonight, Lewinsky had harsh words for Linda Tripp, who secretly taped their conversations, "I would hate to be her," Lewinsky said.

WASHINGTON — The Clinton administration withdrew its support for the independent
counsel law yesterday, saying the Watergateinspired investigations statute "has falled in its goal
of removing politics from the process." Congress
should let the law expire on June 30, officials said.
Less than three weeks after the Senate acquitted
President Clinton of perjury and obstruction of
justice impeaciment charges that were approved
by the House on the recommendation of Independent Counsel Kenneth Starr, Deputy Attorney
General Eric Holder's remarks underscored the
bipartisan crumbling of support for the act.

Eight tourists killed in Uganda

KAMPALA, Uganda — Eight tourists were killed and six others were rescued after being kidnapped by Rwandan rebels. Ugandan polices aid the deaths came in a shootout, but an American survivor said that the rebels brutally hacked some victims to death with machetes. A U.S. State Department spokesman said two Americans were murdered as they were being marched away by their captors. The remaining six victims were killed the same way, he said. The tourists were abducted by the Rwandan rebels at campgrounds on the edge of Bwindi National Park.





It seems extremely repetitive and dull. If Oleander had chosen to scrap this song, along with the first two tracks, then *Pebraary Son would have been a great CD.

It would seem this band has a future, especially if they favor lighter material over the hate-society type songs, and the society type songs are to make another album, hopefully they will keep the success of "Down When I'm Loaded" and create a less tragic album.

Overall, this CD is like any other, full of ups and downs. Certain tracks seem to contain excellent music while others leave you terribly disappointed.
