CLR ANNOUNCES PROGRAMS FOR LIBRARIANS

The Council on Library Resources recently announced three special programs for librarians for the 1977-78 academic year. The Academic Library Management Intern Program, created to assist in the development of managers for the nation's large research and academic libraries, will pay the librarian's salary while he/she spends a year working with the director of one of the country's top academic libraries; application deadline is 22 Oct. 76. The Advanced Study

Program for Librarians was created to further the development of subject specialists for the nation's research and academic libraries. The program pays the librarian's salary while he/she pursues a year of full-time graduate work in a scholarly discipline; applications are due by 1 Oct. 76. The Fellowship Program is intended to aid in the professional development of midcareer librarians who have potential for library leadership. The fellowship enables a librarian to pursue a self-developed study or research project aimed at improving his/her library skills; application deadline is 12 Nov. 76.
