

Morris' return bad for UK basketball

When UK basketball center Randolph Morris failed to show up for an Atlanta Hawks' summer camp Monday, Wildcat fans across the Commonwealth and beyond no doubt breathed a sigh of relief.

And when UK head coach Tubby Smith announced Morris wanted to return to Lexington for his sophomore season, and he would welcome him with open arms, those sighs of relief turned to dreams of an eighth national championship.

But, as talented as he is, and as desperate as the program is for an inside presence next

as the program is for an inside presence next season, Morris' return to UK, and Smith's acceptance of his actions, should not be

acceptante of an actuols, sound not be applicated.

In the weeks leading up to this summer's NBA Draft Morris made several choices regarding his future.

He chose, after one mediocre season at UK, to enter his name in the draft and explore his professional options. That was his choice.

Morris notified his coaching staff and teammates not by a visit to the offices at Memorial Coliseum or a meeting at Wildcat Lodge or even a simple phone call to Smith. He did so by faxing his intentions and cutting

off all communication with his college coaching as and teammates. That was his choice. Then, seven days before the draft took place, Morris had one last chance to with draw from the process with his eligibility interest and summand the process with his eligibility interest and Jamaal Magloire did before him. Had Morris been selected in the draft, as many draft analysts thought he would, he probably never would have set foot in Rupp Arena again. His actions over the past few weeks have made his intentions crystal clear—Randolph Morris is simply using the UK basketball program as a lifeboat until the NBA is finally ready to the decision of the control of gram. Not only would Morris be gone, but the program would no doubt be faced with NCAA sanctions. That's a scenario Smith and ath-

letic director Mitch Barnhart can't afford.

And even if Morris' dealings with SFX were completely legit, another loophole in the draft rules could lead to trouble for the team. Since Morris went unselected in the team. Since Morris went unselected in the team, the is technically a free agent even if he returns to UK and cannot be considered in tuture drafts. That means if Morris gets off to a hot start next season, he could actually jump ship again and sigm with an NBA franchise midseason. Again, something Smith and the program cannot afford.

Randolph Morris has been given plenty of chances and plenty of leeway as he pursued his professional career. Now it's time for Tubby Smith to step up, bite the bullet, and tell Morris to continue his basketball acreer somewhere other than UK.

Smith is too good a coach and too good a man to be treated as he has by Morris in the past weeks. And UK's basketball program is too prestigious to be held hostage by a 6-foot 19-year-old who averages eight points and four rebounds per game.

For Smith, the choice to deny Morris'

Rove's days in the White House are numbered

In the last six years, Karl Rove has achieved the unthinkable.

The 2000 election saw President Bush's top adviser take the bumbling son of a not-so-popular former president all the way to the White House despite an opponent who had served in the nation's second highest post for eight years of relative peace and economic growth.

Four years later, Rove orchestrated a campaign so flawless that his boss once again won the presidency over a qualified adversary even with the country mired in two wars and a stretch of economic uneasiness.

ic uneasiness. But the stupidity that has been running r oant at 1600 Pennsylvania Avenue finally found vay to Rove's office.

Now that everyone's assumptions have been con-firmed and we know that Rove leaked the identity of

firmed and we know that Rove leaked the identity of a CIA operative to the press, it appears as if the end is near for the "brain behind the president."

Yesterday in Washington, while Time reporter Matthew Cooper was testifying before a grand jury investigating the leak of the identity of CIA operative Valerie Plame, President Bush sat in a cabinet meeting, with Rove sitting less than ten feet away, and refused to comment on the investigation.

No vote of confidence for his Deputy Chief of Staff. No support for his most trusted adviser. Not a word of encouragement from a man who has never shied away from protecting his inner circle, regardless of the circumstances.

actually disclose the name of a covert CIA operative working overseas for purely political reasons is unfathomable, and his behavior and the rhetoric he's used in the months since the investigation into the leak began has been equally deplorable.

First, a few months after his conversation with Cooper regarding the identity of Plame, Rowe spoke to White House Press Secretary Scott McClellan and said he was not at all involved in the leak. While McClellan told the press this at the time, he has refused to comment on Rove's denials since Time released the e-mails in which Rove told Cooper about Plame's occupation.

And now, we have Rove's lawyer saying that the president's adviser could not be at fault because he did not disclose Plame's name, he only told Cooper that former ambassador Joe Wilson's wife was a CLA operative.

Yeah, that's a good defense. I mean, how many wise could Joe Wilson possibly have? As Sen. Joe Biden said, with that information it 'doesn't take a rocket scientist to figure out' 'Plame's identity. Whether Rove actually broke any laws is questionable at this point, but there's no doubt that he violated the standards of his office and should be punished accordingly.


