

S. M. College March 5th 1883.

The Faculty met in called session at 12 M. in the President's room. There were present Pres^r Patterson, Prof^r Kirby, Rev. Mr. White, Peter H. Patterson, Mr. Garland, Grace and Melodi. Cause of meeting, to hear charges brought by the Board of Discipline against,

1. Carol J. P. Whitehead. Charge, being absent from quarters without leave on March 1st. Moved and sec. that he be put under arrest for 5 days. - Carried - so ordered.

2. Consideration of the case of the Students who joined State Guards. Executive Committee (to whom the case had been submitted as per resolution of Febr. 25th) advise as follows: Inasmuch as the Students referred to had taken the Military oath before the publication of the order passed by the Committee, and inasmuch as the obligation to obey the State when called upon to do service is imperative - that the Students aforesaid be excused from the operation of any penalty that might otherwise be inflicted and that be required to obtain if possible lawful release from the service of the State Guards. - Moved and seconded, that the advice be acted upon. Carried. Moved and seconded that the Faculty as such apply to the Governor of the State, asking the discharge of all Students of the State College who are now members of the S. G. Carried.

In the case of H. S. Foreman (dismissed from school for having more than 100 demerits in the first term) there was received from the Executive Com. the following communication:

The Executive Committee having under advisement a communication from Thos Foreman Esq. father of H. S. Foreman, from which it appears that a large part of the demerits, which by the operation of Sec 65 of the Regulations excluded the son of said Foreman from College, was given for absence from chapel and the g. r. recitation and was due to unavoidable absence by service rendered to his father and required by him - direct that the President of the College revise said demerits and cancel such as were given for absences covered by the statement of said Thos Foreman.
