god's night -

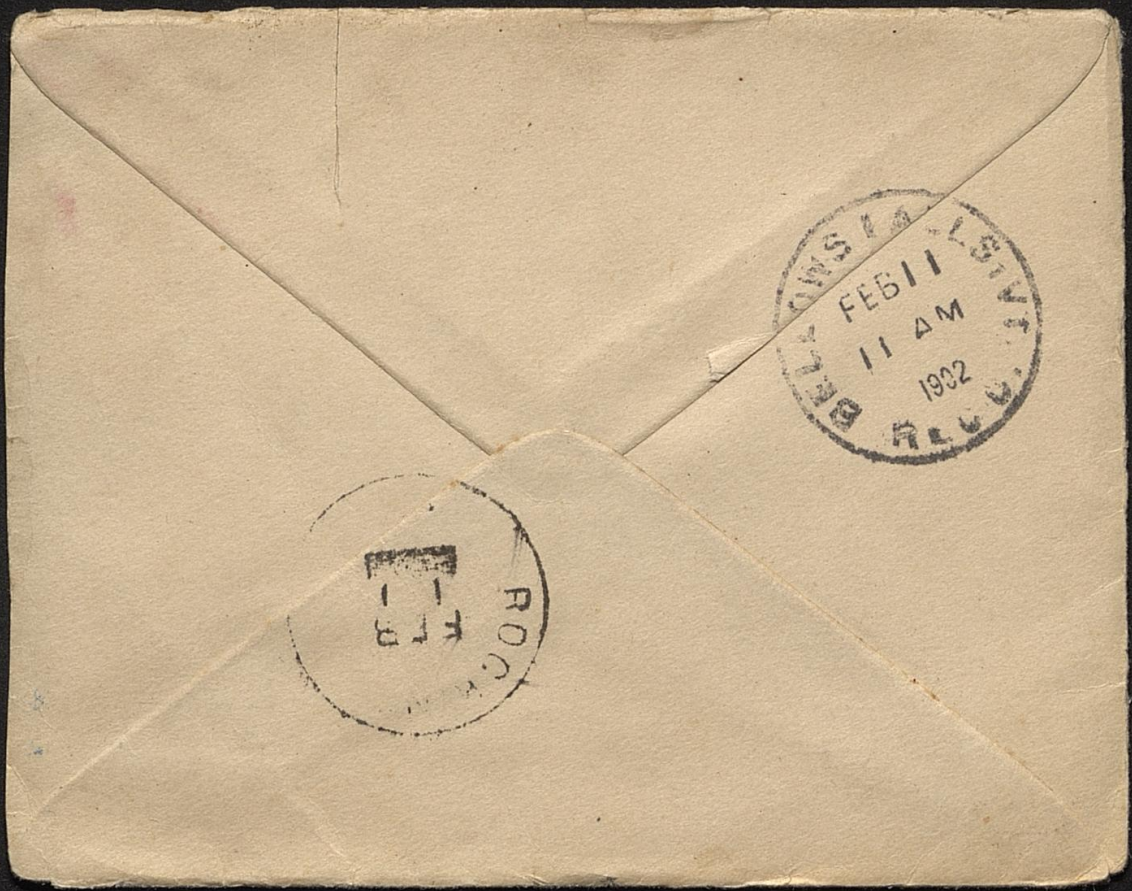
