The faculty met in special session in the faculty rooms, Friday, September 17, 1915.

President Barker presided. Quorum present.

President Barker stated that the main purpose of the meeting was to consider the applications of certain students to be excused from drill, who were required to work to defray their expenses in the University. The Committee of Deans was appointed, with power to act, as a special committee, to consider these applications, and 3:30 Monday, September 20", was set for the time of the first meeting.

Lieut. Underwood offered the following motion which was referred to the Committee of Deans with the request that they make recommendations to the general faculty:

"Moved that the members of the Battalion be required to drill five days a week, for two years, during their course at the University."

President-Barker read a letter from Robert Mitchell, requesting that he be allowed to sell tobacco on the University campus. The request was refused.

On motion of Professor Melcher, it was voted-

That all notices, bulletins, advertisements &c posted on the University campus, be posted on the regular bulletin-boards only, and with the exception of departmental and professors' notices, all notices, bulletins &c, must bear the Registrar's stamp of approval, and that the Registrar be instructed to approve only such notices, bulletins, advertisements &c, that pertain to regular University affairs.

The Secretary read a letter from Dr. Kastle, recommending that no student registered in the two year Agricultural course be eligible to Creek letter fraternities.

On motion of Professor Anderson, it was voted:

No undergraduate who is a special student or a matriculate in a two year course of study, is eligible to membership in a Greek letter society having a chapter in this University.

Dr. Kastle also recommended that certain students in the College of Agriculture be excused from the late registration fee. The Secretary requested that this recommendation be postponed until the next general faculty meeting, so that Dr. Kastle could be heard.

On motion of Professor Melcher, it was voted:

That another period aside from the regular chapel hour, be designated as convocation period, for meetings pertaining to the interest and welfare of the student body and University activities in general, and that said period be so scheduled that it will not fall in the same trio of recitation days as the chapel period, and that the chapel committee be empowered to call such meetings at the designated period when there is a proper request for such a call.

There being no further business, meeting adjourned.
