Former Mickie DeMoss assistant Matthew Mitchell becomes seventh head coach of women's program

Two years ago, Matthew Mitchell asked Athletic Director Mitch Barnhart whether he thought Mitchell should leave UK to take over the Morehead State women's basketball program.

Barnhart told Mitchell, then an assistant to former coach Mickie DeMoss, that he should stay at UK.

Ultimately, going against Barnhart's opinion, Mitchell left to take over the Eagles' program.

Yesterday he returned to UK, this time to fill the role that DeMoss left wacant, and Barnhart admitted Mitchell made the right decision two years ago.

"I think Matthew is better off for having been a head coach and earning his stripes and learning the very difficult path of being a head coach." Barnhart said.

Mitchell, a 36-year-old native of Louisville, Miss., takes over the helm at UK after a 30-29 record in his two-year tenure at MSU. Last season, the Eagles went 13-7 in the Ohio Valley Conference and made the conference tournament for the second straight season.

Mitchell's contract will pay him \$250,000 annually over five years, plus incentives.





\$6 per gallon gas: Not high enough to fight global warming?

It's hard to say which is scarier—apocalyptic global warming scenarios or the economic impact of some of the proposals designed to prevent them.

Even with gas prices more than two times what we have in the U.S. proper is falling short of its global-warming goals.

If \$6 a gallon gas isn't high enough to discourage European drivers, then what would it take to make U.S. drivers cut back? The only public university in the state of-fering domestic-partner benefits is the Uni-versity of Louisville, which began its program on Jan. 1. UK's decision to add the benefits to its health care packages has drawn criticism.

"It seems to us sort of arrogant that the university thinks that it can go against what voters voted for in 2004 in the state marriage

amendment," said Martin Cothran, senior pol-icy analyst for The Family Foundation of Kentucky. He was referring to the 2004 gen-eral election vote to add an amendment to the state constitution making it illegal for the state to recognize or perform same-sex mar-riages or civil unions.

state to recognize on performs anise-sex mar-riages or civil unions.

"I think that this decision amounts to kowtowing to special interest groups at the expense of taxpayers, not to mention violating the state constitution," Cothran said.

UK General Counsel Barbara Jones ar-gued in an earlier committee meeting that the plan did not conflict with the constitution be-cause it did not establish an institution like marriage.

cause it do normariage.

"What we are providing is just access to benefits," Jones said. "It doesn't establish any type of relationship."

Cothran said the foundation is considering taking legal action if UK and U of L's policies are not addressed in a special legislative ses-

sion expected later this year.

But some state legislators feel differently.
"I think the legislature should respect these decisions," said state Sen. Ernesto Scorsone (D-Lexington). "I feel very strongly that the university should make their own decisions in these matters."

Williams also said he hopes the General Assembly will let UK make its own decisions about domestic partner benefits.

"The university — and the Board of Trustees — has to take care of its business, and that's what we did today," Williams said. "If other people have a problem with that and want to take some kind of action against us, you know, I can't sop it."
Student Government President Jonah Brown, one of the four absent board members, was not at the meeting because of strep throat, he said. He later did not wish to comment on how he would have voted on the package.

Seminary's students told to charge in case of an attack

DALLAS — The president of Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary in Fort Worth has told male students there that in a situation like last week's Virginia Tech shootings, he would expect them to charge the assailant, sacrificing their lives if necessary.

salant, sacrificing their lives if necessary.

Paige Patterson made the remarks at Wednesday's seminary chapel service, two days after the shootings.

"All you had to do was have six or eight (students) rush him right at that time and 32 people wouldn't have died," Patterson said of Cho Seunghui, who went on a lethal shooting spree, then shot himself.

The seminary president added:

don't let things like that happen,
We just don't do it."

Patterson's comments have caused a buzz on Baptist blogs and Web sites, including EthicsDally com, which published a story about the remarks Monday. Some posting blog comments faulted him for implying criticism of Virginia Tech students who fled or pre-tended to be dead.

Patterson declined an interview request Monday but Issued a statement. In it, he emphasized that he was not criticizing the conduct of any of the survivors.

as courageously as the Israeli professor. We cannot bring back the dead, but we can determine in our hearts if there is even the slightest chance we ever find ourselves in such an unfortunate situation, we will be prepared to prevent some of the carnage to the best of our ability.

Patterson also elaborated on why the thought Christian men should rush an assailant in a similar situation.

"My own perspective is that Christians — who believe that heaven is their real home and that they are prepared for eternity as result of a life changed by Christ — are even more obligated to act courageously and sacrificially. And I am still just old-fashioned enough to believe that men are responsible to protect women and children.

"The best advice you could probably give to somebody in those type of situations is to look for a way to escape and get help immediately," he said.

Bob Taylor, chairman of the criminal justice department at the University of North Texas, said he regretted any public statements that could be interpreted to suggest Virginia Tech students didn't measure up.

"It's so critically important to err on the positive side of people who make decisions in these situations," he said.

Administrators and Lexington authorities should start now in developing a foolproof plan to protect students and employees here on campus. Planning now could go a long way to-draw assuring our safety.
