Dear Brother

Tomorrow is Thanksgiving

will be devoured. I am still at Thompson  
and everything seems to be  
running smooth. Its a good  
winter job. Are you killing many  
rabbits? I have not seen any of  
Grover's folks lately.

Lots of robbing in Louisville  
now.

Can you give me Henry Venham's  
address? Do you hear of any  
oil development down there?

Has the wet weather hurt the corn?  
Corn is selling at 85¢ here, from  
feed stores about 70¢ from farmers.  
I understand the whole South is  
taking on a boom. San Antonio  
will be boomed next so I hear.  
Fort Smith is to be the Pittsburg of  
the west. over

is increasing 10% pr. year  
in Ark. It will eventually
