Dear Sir: The barrel of Golden Seal Root which you describe as hand picked large and heavy has been received but we must say that we are very much disappointed with the quality thereof. It is no better than root that we have bought here in the last few days at \$4.50 per 1b. and frankly we do not think that you should expect us to pay you on a basis of \$5.25. The best evidence that it is not much better than the ordinary run is that the goods are in a large barrel tightly packed and that the net contents is only about 90 pounds. If it was actually bold, heavy selected root the weight should be nearer to 150 pounds. As a matter of fact we set next to it a barrel from one of our purchases here which came in in a package of about the same size and that barrel contains more than 10 pounds more than yours. We are very sorry that this condition has arisen but are sure that you would not expect us to pay for something that we are not getting. We would really much rather return the goods to you if that would be satisfactory because otherwise we are afraid you will be disappointed and you know from your past dealings with us that we have always tried to do the best possible for you.
