I am glad Bennie Woods has a good oil well and hope ^{he} may get 20 more just as good.

We got Willies sweeter and the potatoes all right. Donnie since I was down there I have been out selling glasses and have done real well.

I sell to good people and expenses traveling & eating is little. I can make more money and sleep at night. That is better than Thompsons.

In Southern Indiana the women pride themselves on being good cooks and clean house-keeping. They put up all kinds of meats fruits and vegetables in cans.

Here is one receipt for putting up cucumbers or mango peppers.

Take a 4 gal jar and fill it with clean cucumbers that have been dried. (over)

Take one gallon of apple vinegar and dissolve in it one cup of salt, one cup of sugar, and then put in it one cup of ground mustard seed. ^{mix} Then pour this on the 4 gal of cucumbers put a weight on them to hold them down. Tie a cloth over the top and in two weeks they will be ready for use. Then when you want cucumber pickles just go and take them out.

This is a good receipt and worth money to the the house-keeper. I was sorry to hear of Mr. Denham being sick, I dont believe he will every be real well again.
