Tar Heels can't handle the pass but Kentucky will probably run

"If God isn't a Tar Heel, then why is the sky Carolina blue? bumper sticker.

"It doesn't look like North Carolina has any weaknesses. They have a good kicking game and a great offense. On top of that, their defense is a lot like Georgia's. They scramble all over the place and they're bigger physically." Perry Moss, UK assistant football coach.

Perhaps Moss was a little hasty in his assessment of the Tar Heels, because they do have at least one weakness.

Pass defense. North Carolina doesn't play it. The secondary gave up 155 yards a game through the air, worst in the Atlantic Coast Conference this season.

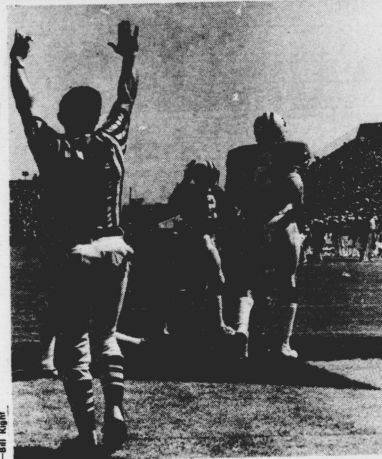
But it's doubtful that UK will throw the ball up more often when the two teams meet in the Peach Bowl, Dec. 31 at Atlanta. The Wildcats will use what has gotten them this far—run, run, and run.

And that's exactly what North Carolina will do, too. Coach Bill Dooley wouldn't have it any other way.

"As a team, you're nothing if you can't run the football on an opponent," he said. "You've got to be able to knock people down and run over them. It's a game for men. You've got to out-tough people to beat them."

Fullback Mike Voight has been knocking people down for four years, setting an ACC career rushing record of 3,971 yards in the process. He also tied a league record with 42 career touchdowns.

This season Voight rushed for 1,407 yards and scored 110 points, third highest in league history. "I knew (Voight) would get the yardage for us this year," said quarterback Matt Kupec. "You

know, he's such a great runner that he doesn't get credit for the other things he does."

Voight said he doesn't pattern himself after anyone else.

"No, everybody has a different pattern to running," he said. "You just have to find what's natural for you. For example, Ken Willard (ex-runningback with the San Francisco 49ers of the National Football League),

Don McCauley (Baltimore Colts back) and I all are basically the same type runners. They ran from the I-formation just like I do. The plays are almost the same. But we're entirely different runners. They had their style and I have mine. In fact, I'm still developing it."

Certainly Voight wouldn't have gotten his two miles of yardage if he didn't have an excellent of-

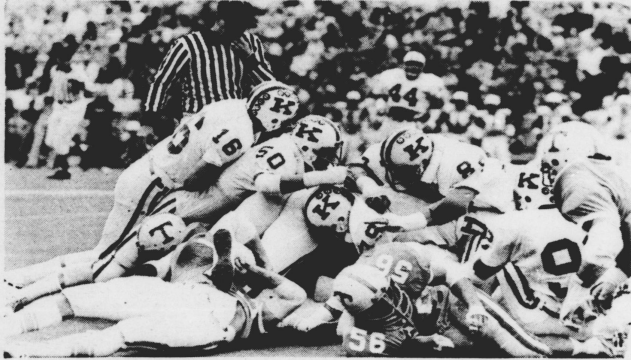

Because it's only nine-years-old, the Peach Bowl has neither the prestige nor the tradition of the other major post season classics—a la Rose, Orange, Cotton and Sugar.

If one really wanted to be cynical, he could say that the Peach Bowl is not really big time because it's not covered by any of the three major networks. Something called Mizlou, an independent company with a 150 station hook-up, handles the television coverage.

And finally, the Peach Bowl has never been able to attract fans en masse. There have been no sell-outs in the nine games at 60,000 seat Atlanta Stadium,

proving once again that Atlanta is anything but a good sports town.

But these facts mean little to the UK football team and its fans. For the Wildcats, the Peach Bowl offers national television exposure and lots of money (about \$220,000).

Followers of the Wildcats seemed pleased with the club being invited to the Peach Bowl. They gobbled up about 10,000 tickets in less than two hours (sorry, Rolling Stones). Another 5,000 tickets went to VIPs.

Several Atlanta hotels were flooded with reservations from Kentuckians within a few days. "You people are incredible," said one hotel manager, who had been answering telephone requests all night. "We've never seen anything like it."

And there are other reasons why Kentucky is happy to be going to Atlanta this New Year's Eve.

For one thing, UK last went bowling New Year's Day 1952. With quarterback Babe Parilli

completing passes at will, UK beat Texas Christian University 20-7 (yeah, those Horned Frogs again) in the Cotton Bowl. To give you an idea of how long ago that was, consider the events that appeared on the front page of

the Louisville Courier-Journal that day.

—The United Nations was trying to negotiate a truce for the end of the Korean War.

Parties, dances headline activities planned at UK bowl headquarters

Even though getting to Atlanta and finding a place to stay may be somewhat difficult, once you're there all kinds of festive activities are planned for UK students, alumni and friends during the long weekend.

Getting there—A UK alumni charter flight is sold out. Commercial reservations out of Lexington and Louisville are

booked solid. The only possibility to get an airline seat is to get on a waiting list and hope someone backs out.

A slim possibility exists that the airlines might add an extra flight or two. The UK Student Center Board has a package bus trip, including tickets and hotel accommodations, with some

seats still left. UK students, faculty and staff get first priority.

Thursday night in Atlanta—The Marriott Hotel is official UK headquarters. It's long been sold out, but all UK activities will take place there. The UK Atlanta alumni club will sponsor a reception at 6:30 p.m. in the Marriott's Tara Room. It will be followed by a "listening party" for radio (maybe TV) pick-up of the UK-Notre Dame game in Louisville.

Following the listening party, the Peach Bowl President's Ball, which is co-sponsored by the hotel and the Peach Bowl committee, will begin in the Marriott's Hall of Nations and grand ballroom. Tickets are \$10 a person.

Highstepping

UK's band marches on Atlanta

The recent histories of the UK football team and the UK "Wildcat" Marching Band read much the same way. Although it could not happen another way, it is fitting that both groups' turnarounds should culminate with a Peach Bowl appearance. In 1962, the band only had 49 members at the end of the season. Needless to say, the band was not particularly impressive. Most UK supporters regarded the band as embarrassing to the university, as was its football team. William Harry Clarke was chosen to direct the band in 1964. Clarke, who came to the band from another position at the College of Fine Arts, persuaded 120 students to join the group that year. The band grew steadily under Clarke's direction and in 1975, it unveiled new uniforms, abandoning the traditional military look in favor of the

more casual "Kentucky Colonel" style. The flashy new outfits were designed by a committee of alumni and students, and cost about \$90 each, according to Clarke.

This season has established the band as one of the nation's top marching units. Clarke said, "We've grown steadily better over the last few years," he said, "and have now reached the point where we can march with anybody."

Success has made Clarke's annual talent search for new musicians much easier. "We are now forced to turn away many quality musicians—we just don't have enough room for everyone who wants to join," he says.

Clarke and Assistant Director Gordon Henderson are already working to fill next year's limited vacancies. They have a list of about 1,000 high school musicians who might be interested in UK's program.

These students are invited to either audition at UK in May or to submit a tape recording of performance. The band's recruiting is also aided by six scholarships which total \$3,000 yearly. Private donors also contribute to the band's scholarship fund. The band's operation is funded by both the Athletic Association and UK's general fund. "We have the same budget now as we did in 1962," Clarke pointed out, "and while I'm not complaining, our budget is very tight and money is starting to become a real problem."

Like the football team, the band returns to campus in mid-August to prepare for the upcoming season. Two-day practices are generally held until classes begin, with the band learning its pregame routine and familiarizing itself with the first three or four shows. Practice lasts for one hour a day after classes begin, while there is a good deal of laughter and general foolishness.

very little time is wasted. Clarke said he believes that the week preceding a performance should be spent "polishing" the routine. The routine is marched again and again, sometimes to a tape recording of the music and sometimes with the band playing.

The majorettes' routine is choreographed by head majorette Linda Love, a senior from Oak Ridge, Tenn.

Assistant Director Henderson determines the flag positions on the field, while Chan Shearer and Debbie Stevens, the band's "flag" two years ago, handle the choreography.

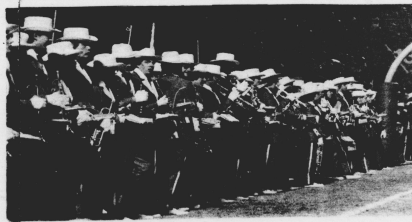
Jimmie Yeter, a forestry graduate student from Ulica, N.Y., has served as the band's drum major for the past five years. Yeter is leaving UK after this semester, so the Peach Bowl will be his final performance—at least he is leaving in style.

fensive line in front of him. And UNC has that.

Probably the most important member of that line is center Mark Cantrell, considered THE best at his position in the country.

Two weeks ago, it was reported that Cantrell wanted UNC to reject its Peach Bowl invitation. Not true, he insists.

"We're really excited that we got the bid, especially to the Peach Bowl," said the 6-3 senior. "The newspapers quoted me as saying that I wanted to go to another bowl, but that wasn't true. I wanted to go to the Peach Bowl and so did the vast majority of the team."

"We know Kentucky is an excellent team and I really don't know exactly what kind of game to expect from them. Our team

has been up and down this year. Sometimes our offensive unit is up and our defense is down and sometimes it's the other way around, so I'm never sure whether it's going to be a high-scoring game or a low-scoring one. But we're really looking forward to playing in Atlanta—that's for sure."

Other players on the UNC offense to watch are Kupec, who completed 52.5 per cent of his passes (52-95) and wingback Mel Collins, the leading receiver with 14 catches. Those stats may not look that impressive, but remember the Tar Heels rely on their ground game.

North Carolina has appeared in the Peach Bowl before (1970) and embarrassed itself. It fell to Arizona State 48-26.

The Tar Heels hold a 4-2 series lead over Kentucky.

—The Kentucky Pollo Drive was being organized.

—Russian Premier Joseph Stalin sent holiday greetings to the Japanese.

—The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board ordered the Hi-Dee-Ho Club, a "notorious"

Campbell County night spot to be padlocked for six months.

—UK football coach Bear Bryant had 12 years remaining on his contract.

—You probably were not conceived.

Secondly, Kentucky wasn't supposed to have a winning

record this season, let alone go to a bowl.

Coming off a 2-8-1 record, beset by nationally publicized off-field activities, playing a tough schedule and being investigated by the NCAA seemed to kill any chances for a successful year.

Those who predicted good

things for UK were considered a little demented.

Even head coach Fran Curci was apprehensive. At one point, he thought that his team would go winless.

Despite all this adversity, Curci had the team playing good football. Derrick Ramsey operated the wishbone effectively

and the Wildcat defense became one of the best in the South.

UK defeated nationally rated Penn State, Louisiana State, Florida and arch rival Tennessee. This was enough to convince Peach Bowl official A.L. Kirkpatrick to invite the Cats.

He received no complaints.

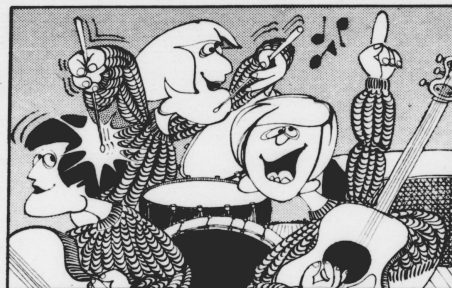

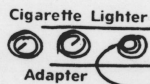

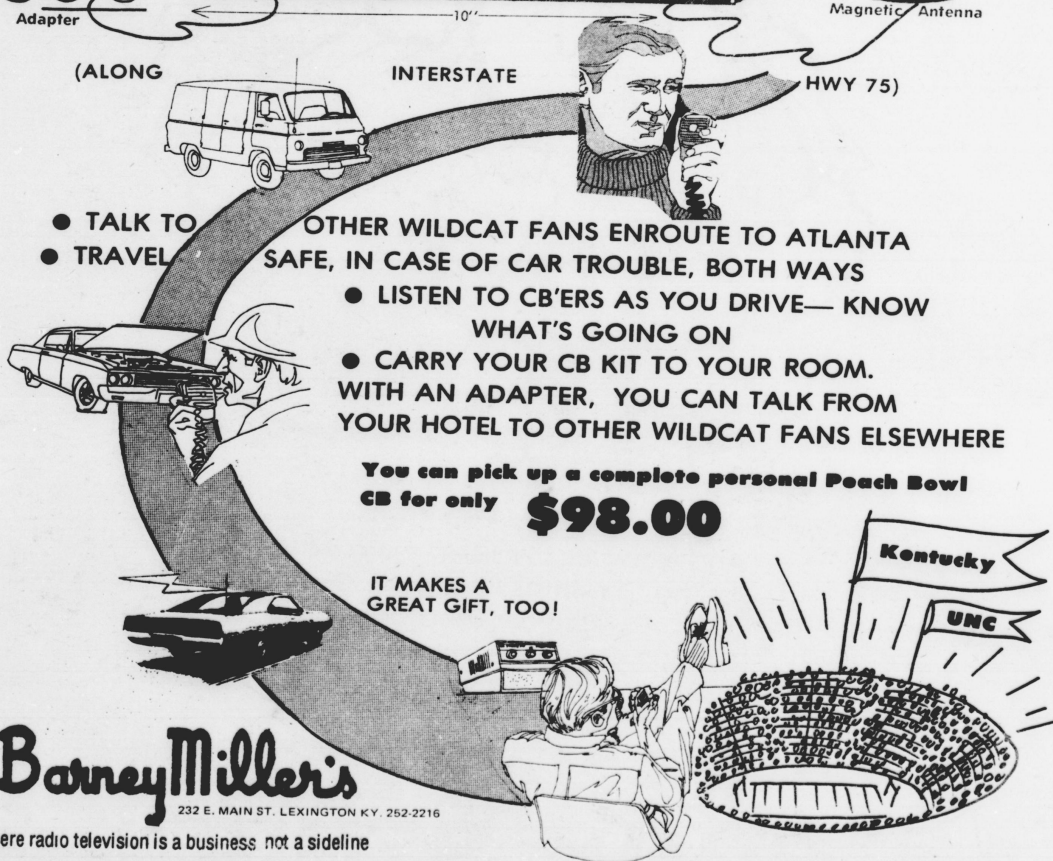
