

MINUTES OF THE UNIVERSITY SENATE
January 20, 1930

The University Senate met in the Lecture Room of McVey Hall, Monday January 20, President McVey presiding.

The minutes of the December 19¹⁵, meeting were read and approved.

The following recommendations of the Committee on Duplication of Courses were approved:

↓ Psych. 202 - Clinical Psych. changed to Psych. 119

Change:

↓ Farm Economics 5, Rural Community Problems - 3 credits

To:

↓ Farm Economics 120, Rural Community Problems - 3 credits

Prerequisites: Principles of Economics, Agriculture / Economics (either before or concurrently with)

Add:

↓ Home Economics 144 - Advanced Home Management - 3 credits

Prerequisites: Sociology, Economics 1a, Home Economics 42

↓ Law 170 - Introduction to Study of Law - Summer Session

Daily - 2 hours credit

↓ Law 169 - Law of the Air - 2 hours a week, 2 credits

The Committee in Duplication of Courses made the following recommendations concerning prerequisites:

1. That prerequisites be considered under two headings:
 - a. Classification
 - b. Prescribed
2. That the University Senate define prerequisites as to classification, and that the departments concerned specify the courses.
3. If the above view is accepted, the Committee recommends
 - a. That junior classification be required for admission to all courses that may be counted for graduate work;
 - b. That the departments concerned prescribe the courses required, and transmit them to the Registrar for publication in the University catalog.

The Senate voted that the above recommendation be mimeographed and sent to the members of the Senate and considered before the next meeting.

The Senate approved the request for Board of Control of Student Publications constitution to be presented at a later meeting of the Senate for approval.

 The following recommendation of the Graduate Committee was approved:
 Members of the faculty of the University of Kentucky having a rank higher than that of instructor may not be considered as candidates for ~~candidates for~~ advanced degrees at this institution.

Here
 At the December meeting of the University Senate, the University Council was asked to make recommendations at the next meeting concerning the time of conferring degrees. The Committee made the following recommendation which was approved:

The Council voted to recommend to the Senate that degrees be conferred, at the close of the first semester, the close of the second semester, and the close of the summer session.

MINUTES OF THE UNIVERSITY SENATE
 February 10, 1930

The University Senate met in the lecture room of McVey Hall Monday, February 10, President McVey presiding.

The minutes of January 20 were approved as read.

The Senate considered the recommendation of the Committee on Duplication of Courses concerning prerequisites which was held over from the last meeting for consideration. After an amendment, the recommendation was approved as follows:

1. That prerequisites be considered under two headings:
 - a. Classification
 - b. Prescribed
2. That the University Senate define prerequisites as to classification, and that the departments concerned specify the courses.
3. If the above view is accepted, the Committee recommends:
 - a. That junior classification be required for admission to all courses that may be counted for graduate work. Exceptions to this rule in particular cases may be made by the Dean and the Head of the Department concerned.
 - b. That the departments concerned prescribe the courses required, and transmit them to the Registrar for publication in the University catalog.
