Ed McClanahan Reads in the Gallery

Ed McClanahan, visiting lecturer in the Department of English, will give a public reading of Work-in-Progress in the Gallery, King Library North, at noon on Friday, 31 March. McClanahan is an alumnus of UK and was a Wallace Stegner Fellow at Stanford University. He has taught at Stanford, and the universities of Oregon and Montana. His fiction has been published in Playboy, Esquire, and Whole Earth Catalog.

Conservation Committee Meeting

Of the various reports of readings discussed at the March 8 meeting of the Conservation Committee, one of the most helpful to the Committee in organizing a planning document was Judy Sackett's summary of the Cornell University disaster of 1970. Seven inches of standing water damaged 4,200 volumes of the Cornell collection. The disaster made Cornell aware of the necessity of planning for emergencies, because:

- There was no single individual at the University available and equipped to deal with this type of emergency.
- 2. There was no formal plan for emergencies.
- 3. There was no easily obtainable source of information on dealing with the emergency.
- 4. There was no list of names of building and maintenance personnel from whom to obtain equipment to perform emergency services (such as removal of the standing water).
- Extra personnel had to be found and hired for salvage work.
