The faculty met in the President's room
at 8:30 am.

All present except Prof. Peuce.

The minutes of the two previous meetings
were read.

The meeting was construed to be a regular
meeting of the faculty and the minutes of the
faculty for the last two meetings were
approved.

On motion of Prof. Anderson ordered that
the names of H. C. Anderson, G. F. Blessing
J. A. Bullock, W. H. Collier, S. C. DeBow,
B. W. Duck, W. A. Duncan, and J. C. Kelly
be recommended to the Board of Trustees for
the degree of Bachelor of Mechanical Engineering
and that the name of John T. Faig be
recommended for the degree of Mechanical
Engineer.

On motion of Prof. White ordered that the
names of Miss Elizabeth Cassidy, Miss
Mary E. Clarke, J. C. Frazer, J. T. Geary,
J. H. Hendren, Miss Barbara S. McHargue
G. M. Morgan, Miss L. A. Warner and
Miss M. R. White be recommended to the
Board of Trustees for the degree of Bachelor
of Science, and W. A. Beatty, Miss M. L.
Didlake, G. H. Keuper, and Miss H. H.
Warner for the degree of Master of Science.

Prof. White then proposed the names of
Miss A. J. Atkins, Miss C. B. Gunn and
John T. Haley, as candidates for the degree
of Bachelor of Science.

Miss Atkins had been sick a few days
Mr Haley a longer time so that they had
not finished their work.

Some discussion arose as to whether they should be graduated, a number of motions were made and seconded, discussed and finally withdrawn, when it was

Ordered "that the Dean of the Scientific faculty be instructed to lay the question with all the facts in the case before the Board of Trustees."

In the discussions relative to Miss Gunn's case, it was stated that she had a grade that entitled her to graduation but that she had been often tardy, and had not done her duty as a student.

At this point Prof. Nelson asked if one negative vote prevents a student's graduation. The opinion seemed to be that it does. He then called for the ayes and noes which were as follows:

Aye - Professors Shaakbfard, White, Park, Pryor, Anderson, and Matthews

No - Professors Neville, and Nelson.

Professors Kastle, Miller and Vermicko voted aye on their record, but stated that she had not been faithful in her work and that they voted against her for that reason and for the real reason of establishing a precedent and not on account of any personal feeling in the matter.

Prof. Nelson stated that Miss Gunn had not recited to him but that he voted no because one of the Professors to whom she had recited had voted no. Prof. W. N. Patterson asked to be excused from voting.

Before the vote was announced Dr. Pryor, moved to reconsider.

Motion to ^{graduation} recommend Miss Gunn's ^{reconsideration} was again put and resulted as follows:

Aye - Professors Shackelford, White, Roark, Pryor, Anderson, Mathews, W.K. Patterson, and Wernicke,

No - Neville, and Nelson,

Professor Kastle and Miller voting both aye and no as they did in the first vote taken,

Motion lost.

Ordered that the question of Miss Gunn's graduation with all notes and records relative thereto be referred to the Board of Trustees.

On motion of Professor Roark ordered that the names of G.C. Downing and Miss Lulu Searey be recommended to the Board of Trustees for the degree of Bachelor of Pedagogy,

On motion of Prof. Neville ordered that the names of W.R. Allen, R.L. Gordon, A.L. Hicks, R.L. Pope, John Scott, and J.O. H. Siurall be recommended to the Board of Trustees for the degree of Bachelor of Arts, and the name of Miss E.W. King for the degree of Master of Arts.
