




JULIAN M. CARROLL

Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky

JULIAN MORTON CARROLL became Kentucky's 58th governor on December 28, 1974, succeeding Wendell H. Ford, who was elected to the U.S. Senate. Carroll then won a full four-year term in the 1975 general election. Born in McCracken County in 1931, he attended Paducah Junior College after graduating from Heath High School. He was graduated from the University of Kentucky in 1954 and received his law degree from UK in 1956. Before becoming governor, Carroll served three years as lieutenant governor and ten years as a member of the Kentucky House of Representatives. He is an active member of the Optimist Club and a former Jaycee. He attained the highest office in Kentucky for laymen of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church in 1966-77 when he was named moderator of the Kentucky Synod. The Governor and his wife, Charlann, have four children.

H. FOSTER PETTIT

Mayor Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government

H. FOSTER PETTIT served two years as mayor of the City of Lexington and was a leader in the consolidation of the city and county governments. He was elected mayor of the Urban County Government in November 1973.

President of the Kentucky Municipal League for 1976, Mayor Pettit is also active with the U. S. Conference of Mayors and the National League of Cities. He was awarded the Optimist Cup in 1976 and the Chamber of Commerce Citizen-of-the-year citation for 1975.

As chief executive of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, the mayor is authorized to supervise, administer and control all departments of government.

The mayor is elected on a non-partisan basis every four years. He is responsible for the proper administration of all services of the government. He is assisted principally by the Chief Administrative Officer and commissioners of the six departments.


A native of Lexington, he is an attorney who served three terms as a state representative. He resides on Richmond Road with his wife, Marion, and four sons.



Dr. Otis A. Singletary University of Kentucky President



Now in his ninth year as president of the University of Kentucky, DR. OTIS A. SINGLETARY is a Mississippian whose route to the Bluegrass State curled through Louisiana, Texas, North Carolina and Washington, D. C.

He came to Lexington from a position as University of Texas vice-chancellor for academic affairs. Previously, in Washington, he had been director of the U. S. Job Corps in the early stages of its development before moving to the American Council on Education as vice-president. He had gone to the capital in 1964 after three years as chancellor of the University of North Carolina at Greensboro.

The UNC appointment terminated Dr. Singletary's first association with the University of Texas, this a seven-year stay that saw him, as a young historian, rise rapidly in rank from instructor to full professor and begin the shift to administrative work, first as associate dean and later as assistant to the president.

The Kentucky president, and his wife—the former Gloria Walton, met when both were students at Millsaps College. He later earned master's and doctoral degrees at Louisiana State. The Singletarys have two daughters, Bonnie and Kendall, and a son, Scott.

Cliff Hagan Director of Athletics

"I've been preparing for this all my life," CLIFF HAGAN said before taking over as athletics director at the University of Kentucky in 1975. Hagan succeeded Harry Lancaster as director after serving as assistant director for three years.

Hagan's path to the athletics directorship began in Owensboro, Kentucky, where he established a then state high school tournament record of 41 points in leading Owensboro to victory over Lafayette in the championship game of the 1949 state high school tournament.

At UK, he played on teams that won 86 of 91 games and an NCAA championship (1951). The 1954 team, undefeated in 25 games, elected not to participate in the national tournament.



FRANK HAM Assistant Director of Athletics

FRANK HAM became Assistant Director of Athletics in July 1975 soon after Cliff Hagan succeeded Harry C. Lancaster as Director of Athletics.

A native of Scranton, Pa., Ham came to the University in 1969 as Administrative Assistant to football coach John Ray, and was reassigned to the Athletic Director's staff in 1972 when Ray resigned.

Ham graduated from high school at Niles, Michigan, and completed his undergraduate work at Olivet College. He did graduate work at Indiana University and coached high school football and track at John Adams High in South Bend in 1944-46 and then returned to Olivet as athletic director and head football and basketball coach.

In 1962, he became assistant to the president at Olivet, with responsibilities in public and alumni relations. He was in private business from 1954 until 1968.

He is married to the former Rosemary Woods of Niles, Michigan. They have two sons, Michael, of Raleigh, N. C., and Craig, a U. S. Army Captain, and two daughters, Mrs. Andy Hunsberger of Cassopolis, Michigan and Jennifer, a senior at UK. Ham is a son of Mr. and Mrs. Albert B. Ham of Edwardsburg, Michigan.

LARRY IVY Assistant Director of Athletics For Finance

Adding a new dimension to UK athletics was the appointment last year of LARRY IVY as Assistant Director of Athletics for Finance.

Ivy, who came to the University as Director of Housing in 1969, is involved primarily with the administration and management of financial aspects, and develops and initiate policies for accounting procedures and related business management activities of the department.

A native of Alabama, Ivy graduated in 1961 from Huntsville High School, where he lettered in four sports. He is a 1967 graduate of the University of Alabama, and earned his M. B. A. from Alabama in 1968.

He is married to the former Barbara Foster of Huntsville. They have a daughter, Kim.

University of Kentucky Wildcats Head Basketball Coach

JOE B. HALL'S record as Wildcat head coach for the past five years stands at 105-40. Hall became No. 1 varsity assistant and head freshman coach to Adolph Rupp after Harry C. Lancaster was named permanent athletic director on February 1, 1969. His record with the freshmen was 60-15, including an undefeated (22-0) season (1971-72) which resulted in the Kittens being crowned National Freshman Champions by the Basketball News.

During his first season as head coach, the Wildcats won their last nine conference games to sew up the SEC title.

His eleven-year coaching record is 181-96. Broken down, it shows a 57-50 five year mark at Regis, a 19-6 record at Central Missouri, and a 105-40 five year record at Kentucky.

A popular personality on the clinic and convention circuits, Hall also has had much international exposure. In addition to the Globetrotters tour in 1951, and the "Down Under" tour in 1974, he has helped conduct basketball clinics for the U.S. Army in Anchorage and Fairbanks, Alaska (1968) and at Ramstein Air Base in Frankfurt, Germany and the RAF Base at Mildenhall, England in 1975. He also was Olympic Trials coach under Hank Iba at the Air Force Academy in July 1972 and was a member of the 1976 Olympic Basketball Committee.

Coaching Assistants

DICK PARSONS

DICK PARSONS, in his sixth year as Joe B. Hall's No. 1 assistant, returned to the University as baseball coach in 1969. Before giving up his position to join basketball on a full time basis, he molded a baseball team (1971) which established or tied 15 school records.

LEONARD HAMILTON

Much of Kentucky's defensive prowess on the court can be credited to the talent of LEONARD HAMILTON, a fourth year assistant, who came to UK after three years as an assistant at Austin Peay State University.

JOE DEAN, JR.

The newest addition to the Wildcat coaching staff is parttime assistant coach JOE DEAN, JR. Dean, who will be working primarily with the Wildcat guards, is a 1976 graduate of Mississippi State University where he played guard for the Bulldogs and then joined the coaching staff while completing requirements for a masters degree in physical education.











ROY DON WILSON Trainer

Entering his eighth year at UK is Roy Don Wilson, who came to the University after serving two years as trainer at The Citadel. A native of Texas, he is a graduate of Amon Carter Riverside High School in Fort Worth. He received his B. S. degree from Texas A & M with a major in physical education and a minor in business. He is married to the former Patricia Jane Cotter of Houston. They have a son and a daughter.

WALT McCOMBS Trainer

Returning to UK last year after a three-year absence during which he served in a similar capacity at Clemson University is Walt McCombs. Assigned primarily to basketball, McCombs also works with Wilson on the football filed. A native of Belton, S. C., McCombs is a graduate of Parker High School and a 1971 graduate of The Citadel, where he was student trainer for four years. He was assistant trainer at UK in 1972 and '73. He is married to the former Shelby Burris of Belton.

The Wildcats, led by Jay Shidler and Larry Johnson with 20 points each, overwhelmed the Indiana Hoosiers by a score of 66 to 51 to end Indiana's 35 game winning streak in Assembly Hall in Bloomington on Monday, December 6, 1976. The 15 point margin was the worst suffered by a Bobby Knight coached team in Assembly Hall history. Notre Dame has claimed a 73-67 win in December of 1973.

In addition to the combined 40 point effort of Shidler and Johnson, Jack Givens tossed in 18 on a 50 per cent shooting mark from the floor. Indiana's Kent Benson finished the game with 21 points and was followed by Wayne Radford with 9 and Derek Holcomb with 8.

According to Coach Hall, "We did what we wanted to do early-taking and hitting our outside shots." The Kentucky zone worked so well that it permitted the frustrated Hoosiers back-to-back baskets only twice during the entire contest while forcing 24 turnovers.


the basketball heights two and three years ago.

They were freshmen when Indiana blazed through a 29 game schedule undefeated, ranked No. 1 and national champions by United Press International Board of Coaches, but fell in the Mideast Regional finals to Kentucky, 92-90. Few doubted that the Hoosiers would have gone all the way had they not lost All-American Scott May with three games left in the season.

And both played bigger roles the following year when the Hoosiers went all the way on a 32-0 season to the National Collegiate title. It was Wisman who bailed out the Hoosiers when Bobby Wilkerson went down in the early minutes of the championship game with Michigan, operating the offense to an 86-68 victory.

And both have experienced the depths as Indiana fell from that achievement to more mortal stature last fall, a 14-13

season and a fifth-place finish in the Big Ten.







JIMMY WISMAN

The two now inherit a leadership role in helping the Hoosiers start the long road back. They now have the opportunity of leaving their imprint on Indiana basketball.

Wisman's strength is managing the offense, moving the ball from side to side, probing for the opening, getting the ball to the open man. But he can score if needed. Last year when Purdue took away Indiana's inside game, Wisman hit 12 of 18 from the outside for 25 points, a performance that won him the NBC player-of-the-game scholarship award for I. U. in a losing cause.

Radford has seen a lot of play ever since his freshman year. A .531 career shooter, Wayne has played at both forward and guard and is getting a a full-blown shot at forward this year. His lack of what is normally construed to be forward height is not that much of a minus to Knight. He thinks Radford plays better around the basket and in Knight's movement-style of basketball, no player gets fixed to a particular area of the court.

Wayne has had some great clutch performances at Indiana. They remember the glory days. They're hungry for more.

COACH BOBBY KNIGHT

Bobby Knight's six year tenure at Indiana, long known for its basketball tradition, has spawned the Hoosier's most prosperous years. During that span, Knight has led the Hoosiers to 139 wins against just 33 losses, a remarkable .808 winning mark. In both 1975 and 1976 the Hoosiers posted undefeated regular seasons.

Knight's teams have won 77 of 96 games for a .802 mark in Big Ten play. From 1973 through 1976 the Hoosiers won the conference championship four consecutive years, a feat surpassed by only one other team in Big Ten history.


In tournament play the Hoosiers, in three NCAA appearances, have won 10 of 12 games. Knight has won the Big Ten's Coach of the Year award three times in five years. In 1975 he was unanimous selection as Coach of the Year on the national level and in 1976 he was accorded the same honor by the Associated Press and Basketball Weekly.

Knight's 12 year coaching record reads 241 wins against just 83 loses. Before coming to Indiana, he coached for six seasons at West Point, where his teams twice won over 20 games, including a record 22 in 1970 and four times won their way into the NIT, placing third in 1970 and fourth in both 1966 and 1969. His overall record at Army was 102-50.

A basketball perfectionist, Knight's style is aggressive nose-to-nose defense and movement on offense.

Hoosiers Are New Team

The Hoosiers are a team that has a lot of growing up, a lot of maturing to do before it becomes an important factor in collegiate basketball and in the super-tough Big Ten.

With nine of 13 players either freshmen or sophomores, Coach Bob Knight has the youngest and least experienced team of his 13-year career as a head coach; it starts him out this season with more unanswered questions than ever before.

"This is the first time in three years we're not starting with things fairly well set. I think it's obvious that positions are more wide open than at any other time since I've been here. Our lineup could go a lot of ways under competitive conditions. I'd say the key word is emergence. Certain players are going to have to emerge in certain areas if we hope to be competitive."

Bulk of the experience rests in seniors Wayne Radford and Jimmy Wisman. Juniors Jim Roberson and Scott Eells have played little. Sophomores Butch Carter, Glen Grunwald, Billy Cunningham—all but Mike Woodson—were greatly restrict-

ed by injury their freshman seasons.

Woodson goes into the season firmly established as an offensive player, a 500-point scorer as a freshman and the Big Ten's runnerup for the scoring title. Knight makes no secret that he feels Woodson's defense has to become better and more consistent.

Obviously there are possibilities for freshmen to crash the lineup. In 6-9 Ray Tolbert, Indiana's Mr. Basketball in 1977; 6-8 Steve Risley, and 6-1 Tommy Baker, Knight has some

potential for frontline players.

"This is a team I've enjoyed working with," says Knight. "They're hard-working, they've learned it takes a lot of hard work and thought and I think they're better prepared than a year ago."

FIRST AID


The University of Kentucky and the Lexington Center provide for your convenience and welfare, a First Aid Station on the Purple Concourse. Persons with any type of chronic medical problem are requested to leave their name and seat location with the nurse on duty at the First Aid Station. A person in need of assistance with a health emergency should report the situation immediately to an usher. Doctors on call and other individuals who might expect an emergency call are requested to leave their name and seat location at the will call window of the box office prior to entering Rupp Arena. In the event of an emergency, you will be notified at your seat. In order that the activities and program in Rupp Arena not be disrupted, paging over the public address system is not possible. CARDIAC CARE

In cooperation with the University Medical Service, the University of Kentucky provides a cardiac resuscitation program at all UK basketball games. LOST AND FOUND

Lost and found articles should be reported or turned in to an usher or a security officer. You may wish to write to the director of arena security and describe lost articles which will be returned if found.

NO HORNS

Horns are not permitted in Rupp Arena and will be picked up at the entrances. Be considerate and allow your neighbor to enjoy the game. Keep portable radios at a low volume.



GATE INFORMATION

Rupp Arena will normally open one hour prior to any scheduled event. Please do not leave the arena until the conclusion of an event or game or at halftime if you plan to re-enter. No "Pass-out" tickets will be issued and you will not be permitted to re-enter.

COURT REGULATIONS

Spectators must keep off the court at all times. Spectators must use the arena stairs and vomities. There are no public facilities located on the arena floor level. Public facilities in Rupp Arena are located on the entry concourse level. You will find all refreshment stands, drinking fountains, public telephones, restrooms, vending machines and first aid on the concourse level.

LIQUORS

Alcoholic beverages are strictly prohibited within the arena as are all food and drink containers including hard surfaced materials of any type, bottles, cans, thermos bottles, ice bags, ice chest, and any object related to above. Arena personnel are instructed to enforce this rule in the interest of safety. PUBLIC ADDRESS

Messages for the public address announcer are acceptable only in emergencies and must be approved by the Sports Information Director at University of Kentucky basketball events. SIGNS

Signs and barriers are restricted in Rupp Arena in accordance with policies established by arena management and public safety officials.

GENERAL TICKET POLICY

- All persons must have a ticket
- No pass out checks permitted at any exit
- All sales final
- Tickets cannot be refunded or replaced if lost, stolen or destroyed.
- The University of Kentucky Athletic Association reserves the right to revoke tickets by refund of purchase price.
- Holder of tickets to University of Kentucky athletic events agree to abide by Arena and University Policies.
- For Arena events other than University of Kentucky basketball all tickets are sold by the Lexington Center Corporation and its authorized outlets. Box Office hours are 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Saturday and commencing 90 minutes prior to the event on event days. No telephone reservations. Check will not be accepted within seven days of an event.




U. K. Student Code of Sportsmanship




