Those present were Pres. Patterson, Messrs J. G. White, W. K. Patterson, Kastle, Pryor, Mathews Miller, Pence, Brooks, and Mackenzie. * Norwood Miss Hodges, the President's secretary making a stenographic report of the testimony.

President Patterson informed the faculty that he had notified Major M: Kee of the meeting of the faculty, and had requested him to be present to "prefer charges", to name witnesses that he wished to have testify" and "to testify himself" He stated that he had sent this communication by a special messenger, who was told by Major M: Kee

Resolved;- "That it is the opinion of this Faculty that provision should be made for more systematic annual visitation of our Accredited High Schools, than has been done in the past, and that the Board of Trustees be urged to authorize the sending out of some member of this Faculty or other accredited representative to visit as many of these schools as possible while they are in session."
