### UK's home page: Some students and faculty say site has demeaning overtones

The UK web site's home page has undergone a change, but some are not pleased with the new look.

A group of students and faculty members believe the new display of pictures on the site is demeaning.

"The problem is you have with the male ... sort of looming over two subordinate figures," said Joan Callahan, a philosophy and women's studies professor at UK. 'One of them is a black female student and she is the smallest of the three. She certainly doesn't look like someone who might be a protegoe of this professor, while the young man might be."

Callahan said the image of the black female student is self-defacing, because she is shown laughing while the two males have serious expressions.

Sara Todd, a biology senior, is also uncomfortable with the new home page. Important, she said. Prospective students will go there and see this. I feel it very much gives the first impression of UK."

Todd says she believes there are ways to make changes and keep everyone satisfied.

She suggested having an image that represents different departments or majors that changes daily. Something that the constitution of t

## **Administrator retires after devoting** career to campus and community

Joe Burch: His dedicaton will not end after spending over 40 years working for students and faculty at UK

About 50 friends, family and col-leagues gathered at the Student Center Friday to honor Joseph Burch, who is retiring as UK's Vice President for Uni-versity Relations.

"The strange thing is you wonder how long it will take you to get to re-tirement, and then when it happens you realize how quickly it came," Burch said during his remarks.

Burch, 62, is a UK graduate who has worked, in some form or another, for UK since 1959. Among the many jobs he has held are dean of students, deputy general counsel, assistant to the vice president for business affairs and acting director of athletics.

Burch's accomplishments and awards at UK have been many including a 1997 Alumni Association Alumni Service Award.

Burch also helped author UK's first

Service Award.

Burch also helped author UK's first student code, helping to ensure that student rights were protected on campus. The retirement celebration was attended by a number of UK administrators, including UK President Charles T. Wethington Jr., who spoke at the event.

"Joe's love and commitment to this."

Burch's departure did not come before his own, so he would not have been faced with replacing him.

"I'm delighted he stayed as long as I did," Wethington said. "He will be missed by me and a lot of other people. He is absolutely a first-rate administra-

Lee Todd, UK's incoming president, has expressed concern over the phrase, so it has been scrapped in favor of another, according to UK Public Relations. Michelle Ripley, UK's national marketing director, said UK Public Relations employees will meet with Todd over the next month to determine his outlook for UK, so they can create a suitable slogan and marketing cam-

It's about time someone recognized the stupidity of this slo-gan. Students, professors and Lexingtonians have ridiculed it since its inception.

Some say it demeans the students already here, as if they make up a "mediocre" university that will only be great in the future. Others object to the phrase's goal of becoming a top 20 research institution by 2020.

We know that UK is already a great university. There's no "next" about it. UK has 24 programs and grants ranked in the nation's top 25 in their respective fields, including the Patterson School of Diplomacy, the Martin School of Public Policy and Administration, and the College of Pharmacy. UK's basketball team has won the NCAA championship seven times, second only to UCLA. UK's home page boasts that students from every state in the nation, as well as 114 other countries, attend the University. UK's old slogan suggested these accomplishments weren't "great" enough. While the idea of improving UK is a noble one, the old slogan was discouraging for students already attending UK. It was almost as if current students were just stepping stones to achieving a top 20 status.

So we say to the old slogan — Don't let the door hit you on the way out.




