The request of Throop & Byrne to be allowed to eat in their rooms was referred to Regent Bowman. Creswell was excused from Chapel service on Sunday afternoon. Milam was allowed to drop History & the French.

Dec. 1<sup>st</sup>

The following resolution was then offered and adopted, viz: "Each member of any club on the grounds of Ireland or Woodlands is entitled to equal rights and privileges with every other member, and no action looking to the expulsion of any member shall be initiated except for a violation of the club regulations framed under the sanction of the Executive Committee and promulgated by them; and such action shall be taken only after complaint shall first have been made to the Faculty and the ground of complaint fully set forth."
