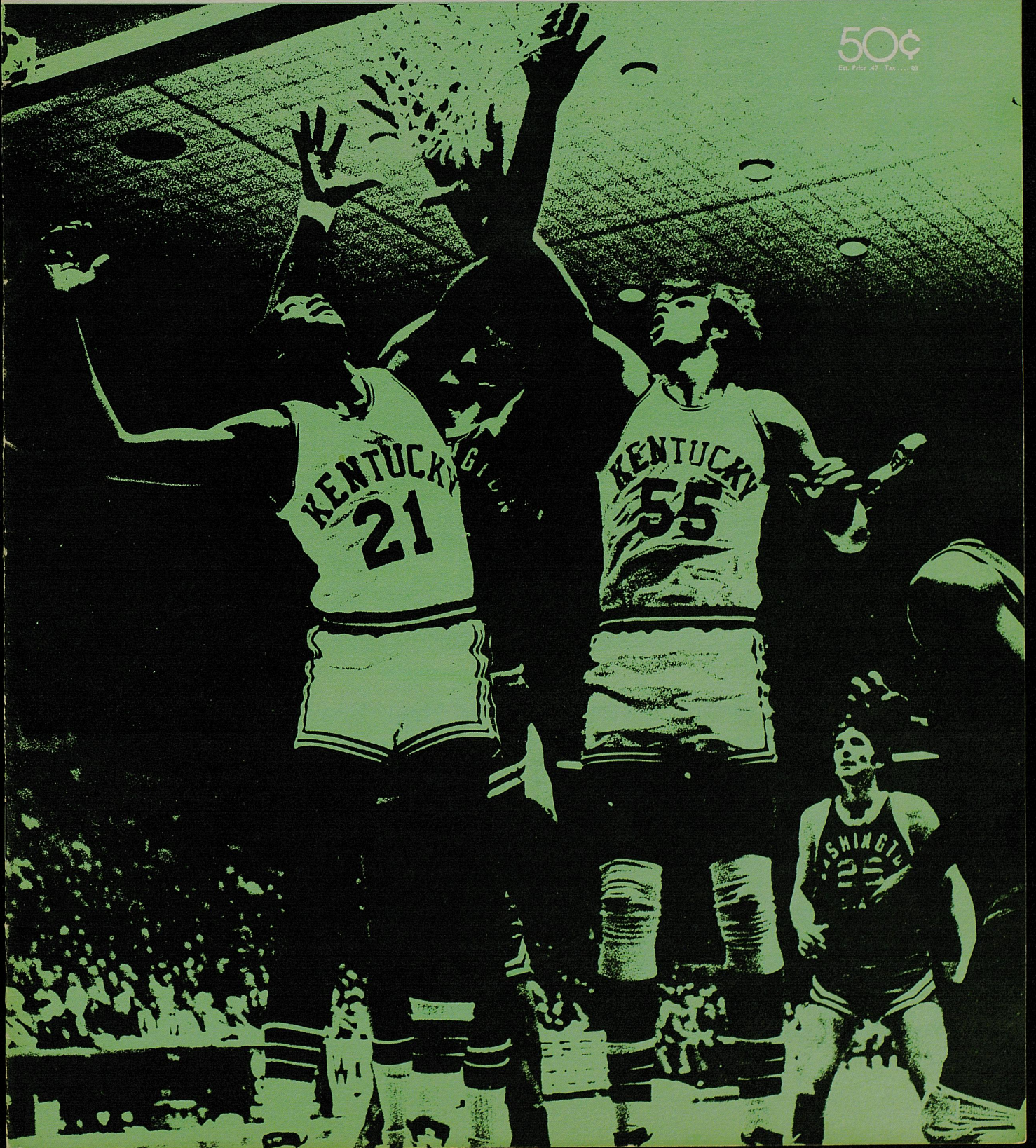

WILDCATS SCHEDULED FOR THREE TV APPEARANCES IN SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE SERIES

The Kentucky Wildcats will play at least three games on the Southeastern Conference television "Game of the Week" series this year. In fact, they are the only team which is so scheduled—a "wildcard game" March 8 could change that facet of this year's schedule. The Cats have appeared at least three times every year since the series was inaugurated in 1965-66.

Six teams—Alabama, Auburn, Florida, LSU, Tennessee and Vanderbilt are scheduled twice, while Georgia, Mississippi, and Mississippi State will be seen only once.

The 10-week series over a regional network again will be produced by TVS Television of New York. All games will be played Saturday afternoon.

Mississippi State opens the series at Florida, Jan. 4.

The Wildcats play at Ole Miss, Jan. 18, at Alabama, Feb. 22, and host Vandy Mar. 1.

Kentucky has won 22 and lost only 12, for a 64.7 per cent win average during the eight-year series. The year-by-year breakdown: Won three of four games in '65-66, two of four in both '66-67 and '67-68, three of five in '68-69, all four in '69-70, three of four in '70-71, two of three in both '71-72 and '72-73, and one of three in '73-74.

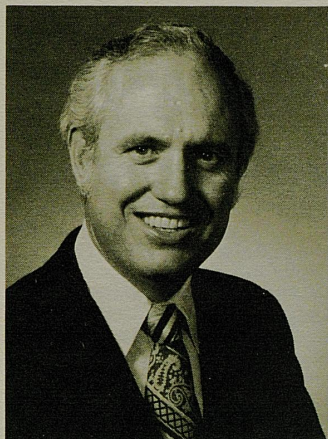

JULIAN MORTON CARROLL became Kentucky's 58th governor on Dec. 28, 1974, succeeding Wendell H. Ford, who was elected to the U.S. Senate. Born in McCracken County in 1931, Carroll attended Paducah Junior College after graduating from Heath High School. He was graduated from the University of Kentucky in 1954 and received his law degree from UK in 1956. Before becoming governor, Carroll served three years as lieutenant governor and ten years as a member of the Kentucky House of Representatives. He is an active member of the Optimist Club and a former Jaycee. He attained the highest office in Kentucky for laymen of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church in 1966-67 when he was named moderator of the Kentucky Synod. The Governor and his wife, Charlann, have three children.

PRESIDENT OTIS A. SINGLETARY came to Lexington in August, 1969, from the University of Texas, Austin, where he was executive vice chancellor for academic affairs. Dr. Singletary, who is eighth president of the University, served a total of eight years at Texas, progressing during seven (1954-61) of those years from instructor to professor, associate dean of Arts and Sciences and assistant to the president. Then for five years (1961-66), he was chancellor of the University of North Carolina, although he was on leave from October 1964 to January 1966 to serve as director of the Job Corps, Office of Economic Opportunity.

HARRY C. LANCASTER was named acting Athletics Director at U.K. in September 1968 and permanent AD three months later. He previously had been associated with Adolph Rupp since 1946 and remained as Rupp's chief assistant until the end of the 1968-69 season. A native of Paris, he is a graduate of Georgetown College with a master's degree from U.K.

JOE B. HALL

Kentucky Head Coach

Entering his third and pivotal year as head coach of the Wildcats, Joe B. Hall's mission is to blend a fine crop of new talent and some outstanding veterans into a basketball machine that will face one of the nation's toughest schedules.

The 1973-74 season pointed up missing ingredients for a championship team and Hall responded by supervising the recruiting of a freshman squad that has been rated best in the nation by some experts.

While realizing the tremendous task involved in turning green youngsters into skilled players who will meet the likes of Northwestern, Miami (0), Indiana, North Carolina, Kansas and Notre Dame in December, Hall also has challenged his seven seniors to perform in the fine style that was predicted for them when they entered the University.

Although the 1973-74 Wildcats failed for the first time in six years to win or share in the Southeastern Conference championship, they did have some fine moments, including the annexation of their 15th UKIT championship in 21 years and a 17-2 record on a tour of Tahiti and Australia.

A master of defensive as well as offensive basketball, Hall places much stress on the former as the Wildcats seek the team unity and unselfishness needed for the task ahead.

In his two years as Wildcat head coach, Hall has won two UKIT titles, a Southeastern Conference championship, a berth in the Mideast Regional Finals and Southeastern "Coach of the Year" designation (1972-73) by his fellow coaches and by Coach and Athlete Magazine, honors no other rookie coach had attained since the league was formed in 1933.

Hall has made a habit of gathering such honors during a coaching career that began at Shepherdsville, (Ky.) High School in 1956 and continued through Regis College and Central Missouri State College before he returned to Lexington July 1, 1965, as an assistant to his former coach Adolph Rupp.

During Hall's two years at Shepherdsville, the Cougars won a Mid-Kentucky Conference title and he was named "Coach of the Year" in 1958. He then served one year as freshman coach and five years as head basketball coach at Regis College in Denver, Colo., where he was also athletic director and earned special recognition as coach of the champion independent team in the area.

While in Denver, he also coached the Capital Federal host team in the 1964 AAU tournament and was selected as head coach of the AAU Stripes in the Olympic trials at Jamaica, N. Y.

His next move was to Central Missouri, where he coached the

Mules (19-6) to their first MIAA Conference championship since 1951 and their first Christmas Tournament title in history. He was named MIAA "Coach of the Year" (1964-65).

A three-letter winner and team captain in both sports in high school at Cynthiana, Ky., he played freshman basketball and one year of varsity basketball in the "Fabulous Five" era at the University before transferring to the University of the South at Sewanee, Tenn., where he set a school single game scoring record and was team captain. Coach Lon Varnell, upon retirement, rated Hall as No. 1 of the three best players he ever coached.

After touring Europe with the Globetrotters in 1951, Hall returned to U.K. in 1955 to complete requirements for his B.A. and later (1964) received his M.A. at Colorado State University.

Returning to U.K. again in 1965 as assistant coach and head recruiter, he was instrumental in adopting a running-conditioning program which obviously paid huge dividends as the Wildcats capitalized on speed and endurance to offset a lack of size and advance to the championship game of the NCAA Finals. Hall then successfully recruited six prep All-Americans, including all-time U.K. scoring leader Dan Issel, to form the nucleus of a varsity team that won three straight conference championships and was followed by a team that won three more consecutive SEC titles.

Hall became No. 1 varsity assistant and head freshman Coach to Rupp after Harry C. Lancaster was named permanent athletic director Feb. 1, 1969. His record with the freshmen was 60-15, including an undefeated (22-0) season (1971-72) which resulted in the Kittens being crowned National Freshman Champions by the Basketball News.

During his first season as head coach, the Wildcats won their last nine conference games to sew up the SEC title.

His eight-year coaching record is 109-77. Broken down, it shows a 55-50 five-year mark at Regis, a 19-6 record at Central Missouri, and a 33-21 two year record at Kentucky.

A popular personality on the clinic and convention circuits, Hall also has had much international exposure. In addition to the Globetrotters tour in 1951, and the "Down Under" tour last summer, he has helped conduct basketball clinics for the U.S. Army in Anchorage and Fairbanks, Alaska (1968), was Olympic Trials coach under Hank Iba at the Air Force Academy in July 1972 and is a member of the 1976 Olympic Basketball Committee.

He is married to the former Katharine Dennis of Harrison County, Ky. They have three children—Judith, 18; Kathy, 17, and Steve, 14.

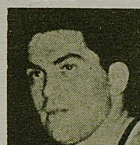

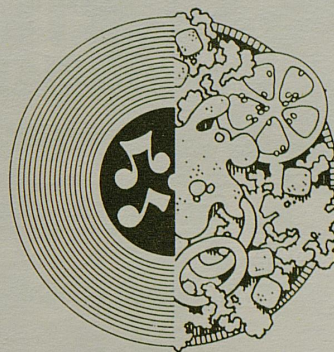

WHO WERE THE 'FABULOUS FIVE'?

The most frequently asked question tossed at basketball historians and sports authorities is "Who were the 'Fabulous Five' of Kentucky?" The answer is Alex Groza (center), Ralph Beard and Kenny Rollins (guards), Wah Wah Jones and Cliff Barker (forwards). This famous 1948 team, captained by Rollins, won 36 and lost 3 while sweeping to Kentucky's first NCAA title and went on to participate as a unit in the Olympic Games—helping the USA team capture the world championship. Rollins graduated after the '48 season, but the remaining foursome continued to play havoc with collegiate basketball and copped another NCAA title for Kentucky in 1949 on a record of 36-2.

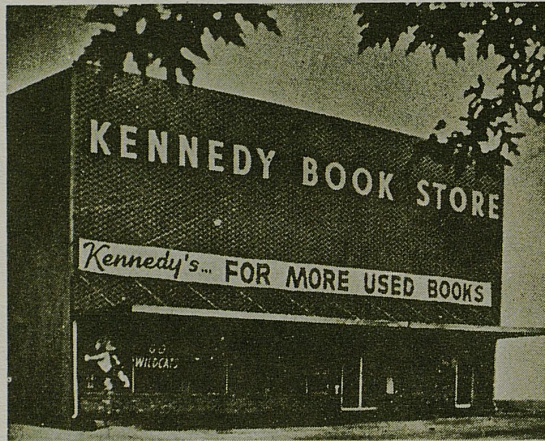

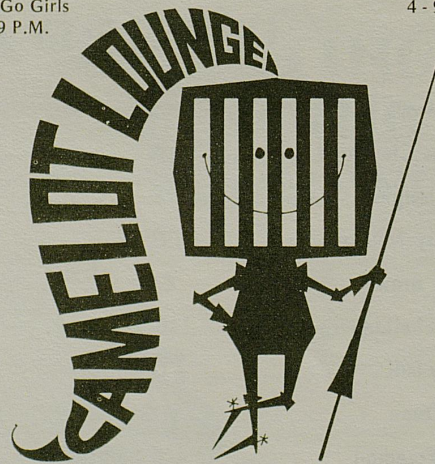

WILDCAT COACHING ASSISTANTS

DICK PARSONS, Assistant Coach

In his third year as head assistant and junior varsity coach is Dick Parsons, a former Wildcat baseball and basketball star who returned to the University as baseball coach in 1969.

Before giving up his position as baseball coach, Parsons molded a team (1971) which established or tied 15 school records.

He first came to the University from Harlan, where he was a four-sports star with a three-year basketball scoring total of 1,276 points.

Starting three years as guard for the Wildcats, he was a fine outside shooter also known for quickness and alert defensive play. He had a career high production of 21 points against Mississippi his sophomore year.

A two-time (1960, '61) recipient of the coveted A. B. Chandler award, given annually for the player best exemplifying the qualities of leadership, scholarship, character and ability, he holds the distinction of serving as captain in two U. K. varsity sports—basketball and baseball.

Holding more Wildcat baseball records than any other player, he was an All-Conference shortstop in 1959 and 1961, All-NCAA District 1960, '61, and All-American '61. He hit .400 his senior year.

He was an assistant football coach at Glasgow High two years and baseball and basketball coach at Boyle County High from 1963 to 1968.

While working on his Master's Degree at the University in 1968-69, he scouted, recruited and helped with the Wildcat freshman team, later accepting a part-time assistantship in basketball in addition to his baseball job.

He is married to the former Miss Celia Cawood of Harlan. They have a daughter, Kathy, 8, and a son, Ed, 10.

LEONARD HAMILTON, Assistant Coach

A native of Gastonia, N. C., Hamilton joined the Wildcat staff last July after serving three years as an assistant coach at Austin Peay State University.

In high school at Gastonia, he was a three-year football letterman at quarterback and a two-year letterman and team

captain in basketball. He was also basketball team captain two years at Gaston Community College in Dallas, N. C., where he scored 54 points in one game, set a record for most field goals in a season and was All-Region and All-Tournament.

He was team captain at the University of Tennessee at Martin, where he led in assists and steals, was most valuable defensive player, All-Conference and All-Tournament, elected as "Mr. Volunteer" by the student body and selected to the Tennessee-Kentucky All-Star Team.

His duties during his first year at Austin Peay included coaching the freshman team, scouting and recruiting. During his three years there, the Governors went from last place to first in the Ohio Valley Conference, appeared in two NCAA tournaments and were nationally ranked in scoring.

Hamilton is married to the former Miss Claudette Hale. They have a 4-year-old son, Lenny.

LYNN NANCE, Assistant Coach

A former All-Coast and All-Pac 8 Conference forward at the University of Washington, Nance had coaching experience at his alma mater and was with the FBI and the NCAA briefly before he was hired by Joe Hall last August to head up Wildcat recruiting along with regular coaching and scouting duties.

A four-sports high school star in his native Granby, Mo., he was an All-State and All-District performer who began his collegiate basketball career at Southwest Baptist Junior College in Bolivar, Mo.

He starred for Washington in 1963-64 and 1964-65 and spent most of one exhibition season with the St. Louis Hawks before an injury ended his pro aspirations.

He was coach and athletic director one year at Versailles, Mo., High School, where he compiled a 28-2 record, won the conference championship and advanced to the regional play-offs.

Nance was freshman coach under Mac Duckworth at Washington one year and freshman coach and recruiter two years under Tex Winter, with varsity coaching assignments on defense and with the big men.

He spent three years with the FBI before joining the NCAA headquarters staff of Walter Byers. He is married to the former Miss Sally Ann Scholes of Granby. They have a son, Kevin, 11.

RAY EDELMAN, Graduate Assistant

A three-year letterman for the Wildcats, Edelman graduated from UK last year with a degree in Business Administration and gained admission to the UK College of Law. During his playing career, he was credited by Coach Hall as like "having a coach on the floor." Edelman will be in charge of the junior varsity squad this year. A native of Ardmore, Pa., he set 49 records at Haverford High School and earned All-State honors. He scored a UK team high 46 points against the Gippsland All-Stars during the Australian tour last summer. He is married to the former Barbara Barnstable of Louisville.

ATHLETICS AT KENTUCKY

Kentucky's athletic program, a well-balanced and ambitious activity featuring intercollegiate competition in ten different sports, is organized under the Department of Athletics and a corporation known as the University of Kentucky Athletics Association.

The program is conducted without overemphasis or sacrifice of educational objectives and in strict compliance with the rules of the University, the Southeastern Conference and the National Collegiate Athletics Association.

A board of directors, headed by the President of the University in the capacity of chairman, maintains overall policy supervision of the athletic program.

In addition to the UK President, board officers include the Vice-President for Student Affairs as vice-chairman and Dr. W. L. Matthews in the capacity of secretary. Fourteen other men, drawn from the University faculty and the general public, also serve on the board as appointees of the president as do two student representatives.

Supervising the steady growth and balanced development of the athletic program is Athletic Director Harry C. Lancaster.

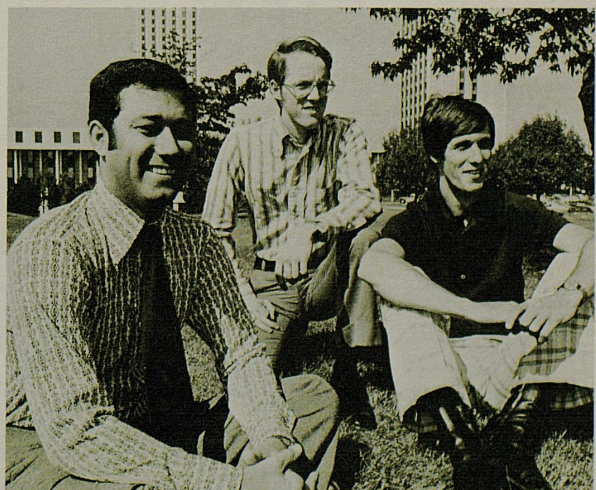

CLIFFORD O. HAGAN, Assistant Director of Athletics



Cliff Hagan became Assistant Director of Athletics at his Alma Mater June 1, 1972, and, on Dec. 10, 1974, was selected to succeed Harry Lancaster as athletic director, effective July 1, 1975. After a glittering basketball career, during which he was twice a consensus All-American at UK and a five time All-Pro with the St. Louis Hawks of the NBA, he returned to

Lexington in 1970 and went into private business. He later became President of a successful restaurant chain, Cliff Hagan Ribeye, Inc.

During Hagan's college career, the Wildcats won 86 of 91 games and the 1951 NCAA championship. He was co-captain of the 1954 team, which with a 25-0 record, became the University's second unbeaten team.

A native of Owensboro, Ky., Hagan gained immortality in Kentucky High School annals when he scored a then-record 41 points in the final game of the 1949 State Tournament to give the Red Devils the championship over Lexington Lafayette.

During a 10-year career at St. Louis, the Hawks won the NBA Western Division six times and defeated the Boston Celtics in 1958 for the World Championship. He joined the Dallas Chaparrals as player-coach in 1968 and was selected as Texas Professional Coach-of-the-Year. He wound up his playing career only 92 points shy of a career total 15,000 points.

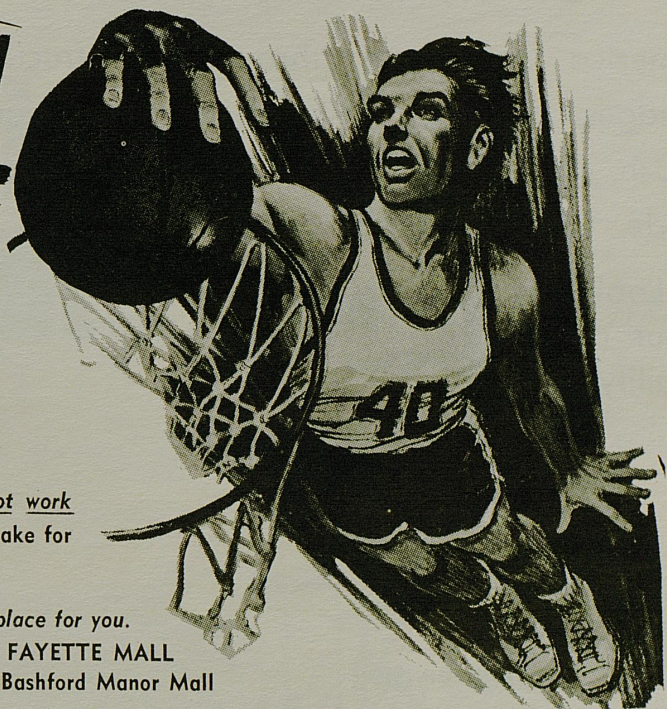

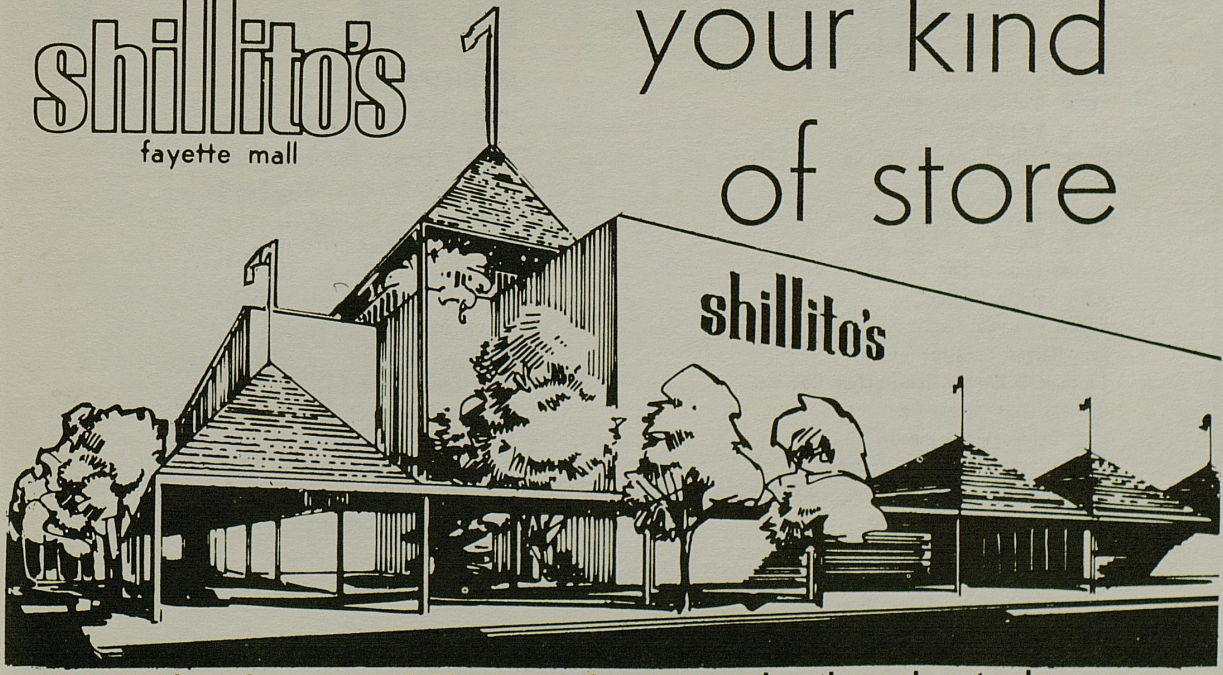
