Titles I and III of the Bill are safe enough, and need not cause you concern; they merely include technical amendments of minor consequence. But if Title II should be passed, then only the most providential good fortune can save this country from the evil consequences which are almost certain to flow from a politically-controlled banking system.

Let us all do our part in an attempt to prevent the passage of this measure.
