### Students sponsor petition for peace and non-violence class

More than 500 UK students and Lexington residents have signed a petition urging UK to implement a course on peace and alternatives to violence by the fall 1989

and alternatives to violence by the fall 1989 semester.

The petition asks for a course that "would explore the use of non-violent force— its history, methods, and practitioners—and the promotion of peace." Interest about the possibility of such a class was sparked by Washington Post columnist Coleman McCarthy, who spoke at the Newman Center last month as part of the Distinguished Speakers Program. McCarthy, who teaches classes in alternatives to violence at high schools in Washington D.C. and has taught at American and Georgetown universities, is encourag-

ing universities across the country to start peace studies programs.

About 70 universities in the United States offer degree programs in peace studies, and about 200 offer courses in that area. Since McCarthy's talk, the Newman Center has been the main organizational base for support of a non-violence course. #### Man charged with threatening Bush

OWENSBORO, Ky. — A 21-year-old man accused of threatening the life of Republican presidential nominee George Bush was advised of his rights in a hearing here yes-

David Allen Russell of Owensbo-ro appeared before U.S. Magistrate

Stewart Elliott, said U.S. Attorney Joseph M. Whittle.

Whittle said Russell is charged with two counts — threatening to take the life of Vice President George Bush or inflict bodily harm on him, and sending a threatening letter through the mail.

Following the hearing, Russell was taken back to the Daviess

County Jail, where he was being held without bond, Whittle said.

A hearing has been scheduled for 11 a.m. Thursday before Magistrate Ellihott determine whether bond should be set for Russell.

A preliminary hearing also will be held at that time to determine whether the case should be bound over to a federal grand Jury, Whittle said.

#### **Sutton defends program**

Berst said that if an institution made positive changes — increased monitoring or personnel switches, for example —those steps would be looked on as a "mitigating factor" by the infractions committee. 



### **Supreme Court** should not review civil rights case

About 30 people — many of them UK students — participated in a rally last week protesting the Supreme Court's decision to reconsider of the 1976 case, Runyon v. McCreary, which said a private school's refusal to admit a black student violated his civil rights.

The Supreme Court decided to reconsider the decision after reviewing the April 1988 case of Patterson v. McLean Credit Union.

We applaud the UK students, primarily law students, who took the time to make their feelings known on this very important topic.

For the Supreme Court to even think about reconsidering Runyon is a travesty. The Runyon case has been a significant ally for people seeking civil rights.

While by no means does it ensure that discrimination in schools or the work place will no longer take place, it does put into effect some legal recourse for those people who have been discriminated in private.

Overturning this decision could set a dangerous precedent for other civil rights cases. Runyon is a fundamental part of maintaining and progressing civil rights in this country.

Many people contend that programs such as Affirma-

Many people contend that programs such as Affirmative Action and legislation such as the Civil Rights Act ensure civil rights. That's just not the case.

Maintaining and progressing civil rights is something we must constantly strive for. Even reconsidering Runyon is a serious setback because it represents an arrogant attitude about civil rights.

But what is even more troubling about the Supreme Court's decision to reconsider Runyon is the trend toward conservatism on the court it points to.

The ideology in the nearly eight-year administration of President Ronald Reagan had grown decidedly more conservative in its views toward civil rights.

And with at least two of the more liberal justices on the Supreme Court contemplating retirement, coupled with the growing certainty of a George Bush administration at hand, the possibility of an even more conservative court is increasing.

While the Supreme Court cannot be legislated into decision-making, it must pay attention to the tenor and mood of the country. Expressing our feelings and convictions is one way students make sure the Supreme Court pays at-

Some people may find it hard to live up to praise like that, but not Canadian gutaris Jeff Healey. What makes See The Light, Healey's debut, all the more astounding is the fact that he is blind. Healey began playing gutar when he was three years old asson he discovered a different way to play the instrument.

beyond the capabilities of his instrument is immediately evident on the opening track. "Confidence Man." Healey takes his guitar through more aerial twists and turns than a doglight scene in "Top Gun."

Another plus for Healey is that, at 22 years old, he already has the bluesman's voice of experience. It calls for a gruff yet eloquently. It is usually acquired after years of playing roadhouse dives and dings bonky-tonks and experiencing too many love affairs through a bottle of bourbon.

Healey's songs don't get quite into that "low-down-dirty-woman-done-me-wrong" mode. Healey instead cranks out some understated guitar ballads such as "Angel Eyes" and "I weed To Be Loved."

Of course, being a voung guitarist with a reputation is, as Healey puts it in a song, a "Nice Problem
