

Forget tobacco road. This big man from Tar Heel country has made a name for himself right here in the Bluegrass.

Jason Parker may have taken a round about way of coming to UK, but it paid dividends. After starting every game as a freshman, the first time that has happened under coach Tubby Smith, and averaging 19.1 minutes, 8.6 points and 4.7 rebounds per game, he was named to the 2000-2001 All-SEC Freshman Team.

Unfortunately, the UK faithful won't be able to see the powerful Parker right out of the starting gate this season. An offseason knee injury suffered during a pickup game on June 24 has sidelined this future star until at least January.

Parker's best performance came in his biggest game yet as a Wild-cat. He logged a career-high 22 points, along with 13 rebounds in the Southeast Region Semi-final against Southern Cal in last year's NCAA Tournament.

If Parker continues to improve and is able to return in January, watch out SEC opponents.

Call him the consummate team player. After agreeing to give up his athletic scholarship to help the Cats remain under the NCAA's 13 scholarship limit, Marquis Estill proves that the team comes first. He shed 50 pounds between his senior year in high school and his sophomore season at UK. He endured knee surgery and saw limited minutes as a back-up behind freshman Jason Parker.

Now, after all his hard work and sacrifice, the team may be looking to him to help them even more.

After logging 22 points, six rebounds and two blocks in a 22 minute performance for the ages against lowa in the second round of the NCAA Tournament, Estill looks to shine even brighter as a junior. He is poised to play a significant amount of time after the off-season knee injury to Parker. With the extra playing time come lofty expectations.

Many see him as a potential All-SEC player at either center or power forward and expect him to be a major force in UK's national title hopes. Estill has averaged 13.8 minutes and 7.3 points per game while shooting 60 percent from the field in one year at UK.



# Bush says Taliban is "on the run"

WASHINGTON — President Bush said Thursday night "it may take a year or two" to track down Osama bin Laden and his terrorist network in Afghanistan, but asserted that after a five-day aerial bombardment, "we've got them on the run."

them on the run."

At a prime-time news conference at the White House, Bussaid he did not know whether bin Laden was dead or alive. "I want him brought to justice." he said of the shadowy figure believed behind the terrorist attacks in New York and Washington that killed 5,000 people one month ago.

The president said that an FBI warning issued earlier in the day was the result of a "general

threat" of possible future terrorist acts the government had received. "I hope it's the last, but given the attitude of the evildoers it may not be," he added.

At the same time, he sought to reassure Americans the government was doing all it could to make them safe.

"If we receive specific intelligence that targets a specific building or city or facility I can assure you our government will do everything possible to protect the citizens," he said.

He urged all Americans to re-

He urged all Americans to re-port anything suspicious to law enforcement authorities. Despite the aerial pounding, Bush held out a carrot to the Tal-iban rulers of Afghanistan har-

And yet the president looked ahead to a day when the Taliban would be pushed from power. He suggested the United Nations could help form a new government for Afghanistan after the U.S.-led military mission is completed.

Asked whether he envisioned expanding military action beyond Afghanistan to Iraq or Syria, Bush said that the United States would 'bring to justice' nations that harbor terrorists. In particular, he called Iraqi leader Saddam Husselin an 'evil man' and added, 'we're

watching him very carefully."

While the current focus is on Afghanistan, he said "we're looking for al-Qaida cells around the world"—and if the United States find any, it will pursue them.

Bush spoke at the first prime-time news conference of his presidency, but more importantly, one month to the day after terrorist attacks in New York and Washington murdered thousands, damaged the nation's economy and shattered its complacency.

In the month since, the presi-In the month since, the president has labored to construct a foundation for an international war on terrorism, moving to choke off the funding essential for terrorists to carry out their

strikes, lining up support from other nations, creating a new Office of Homeland Security and — beginning on Sunday — unleashing the nation's military.

The news conference capped a national day of remembrance.

There were memorial services around the nation to remember the more than 5.000 people killed when suicide hijackers seized four commercial airliners and crashed them into the World Trade Center in New York, the Pentagon and the Pennsylvania countryside.

# **Building names honor campus greats**

Funkhouser. Patterson. Singletary. No, these are not just the names of familiar campus buildings, they are also names past UK presidents.

presidents.

A nine-member Committee on Naming University Buildings considers nominations for names of new buildings. The president and board of trustees approves

and board of trustees approves recommendations.

UK Law Professor Robert Lawson, a member and past chairman of the committee, said in most cases, he said, buildings are simply named after people who donate large sums of money to UK.

"This is nothing anybody lob-

bies for," he said.

Jack Blanton, UK's senior vice-president for administration, said the president and trustees almost always agree with the committees findings.

"I can't recall a single instance when the president didn't follow through with one of the committees choices," he said.

Blanton said the committee serves as a formal "screen" for building name proposals.

The committee is unusual because it convenes only when the need arises. Member Kimberly Anderson said sometimes the committee simply discusses it business on the phone.

Here are interesting stories behind some building names:

«Funkhouser Building:

named for William D. Funkhouser, a professor of zoology who taught at UK from the 1920s until the 1940s.

«Kinkead Hall: for Judge W.B. Kinkead, an "ardent union man," who helped keep Kentucky from succeeding to the Confederacy, urged unity after the war.

»Patterson Office Tower: in honor of the first UK president, James K. Patterson, who served from 1878-1910. He refused to vacate the president's home when he retired, forcing his successor, Henry S. Barker, to live in a student dormitory.

WASHINGTON — American bombing has yet to eliminate the danger to U.S. warplanes over Afghanistan, and the United States is working with anti-Tailban forces on the ground to pin-point threatening military targets. Defense Secretary Donald Rumsfeld said 'Thursday. Five days of bombing Osama bin Laden's al-Qaida network and the Tailban rulers who shield it, have taken aim at major targets. But the attacks have not suppressed all the anti-aircraft guns, surface-to-air missiles and portable missiles like the Stinger that riddle Afghanistan. Rumsfeld was asked if the United States was getting information from the rebels in the northern alliance that could be used to strike at al-Qaida and the Tailban.

### FBI says more terrorism expected

FBI says more terrorism expected WASHINGTON — In a stark warning, the FBI said Thursday it has received information there may be additional terrorist attacks inside the United States or abroad in the next several days. The bureau said its information does not identify specific targets, but it has asked local police to be on the highest alert and for all Americans to be wary of suspicious activity. Certain information, while not specific as to the target gives the government the reason to believe that there may be additional terrorist attacks within the United States and against U.S. interests overseas over the next several days," the FBI said.

### Female scientists paid less than males

Female scientists paid less than males about one-third less than men colleagues in the health and biological fields, according to the largest survey ever of life sciences workers salaries. Salaries for women averaged about \$72,000 compared with \$84,000 for men, or almost \$11 percent more, the American Association for the Advancement of Science said. The association said the higher pay for men was explained, in part, "by the fact that more males are further in their career cycle, have worked longer and are in the high-income field of medicine." The survey found that gender difference in salaries was high-est among physicians and executives in life science companies and organizations.

Laden.

### Uganda bubonic plague outbreak kills 14

Uganda bubonic plague outbreak kills 14
KAMPALA, Uganda — An outbreak of
bubonic plague believed caused by an influx of
rats into several Ugandan villages has killed 14
people in the last three weeks, a government
health official said Thursday. The rats have entered four villages in the northwestern Nebbi distriet near the Congo border, said Dr. Dam Okware, who is coordinating the government's efforts to halt the spread of the fatal disease. The
tasts normally live outside the villages but seek
shelter during the annual rainy season, he said.
So far, 23 people have been infected with the disease, which affects the lymph nodes, and 14 have
died, but no new cases have been reported since
Oct. 3, Okware said.

Meadowthorpe Cafe brings back memories of times past. Linoleum checkered floors, vince the early 1950s. In a time when almost everything is corporately owned, Meadowthorpe Shopping Plaza offers something difference. Larry Green, 56, who has been frequenting the cafe for the past eight years, said he eats at Meadowthorpe Cafe at least once a week. Green was having lunch before he went in for the second shift at Square D Corporation.






