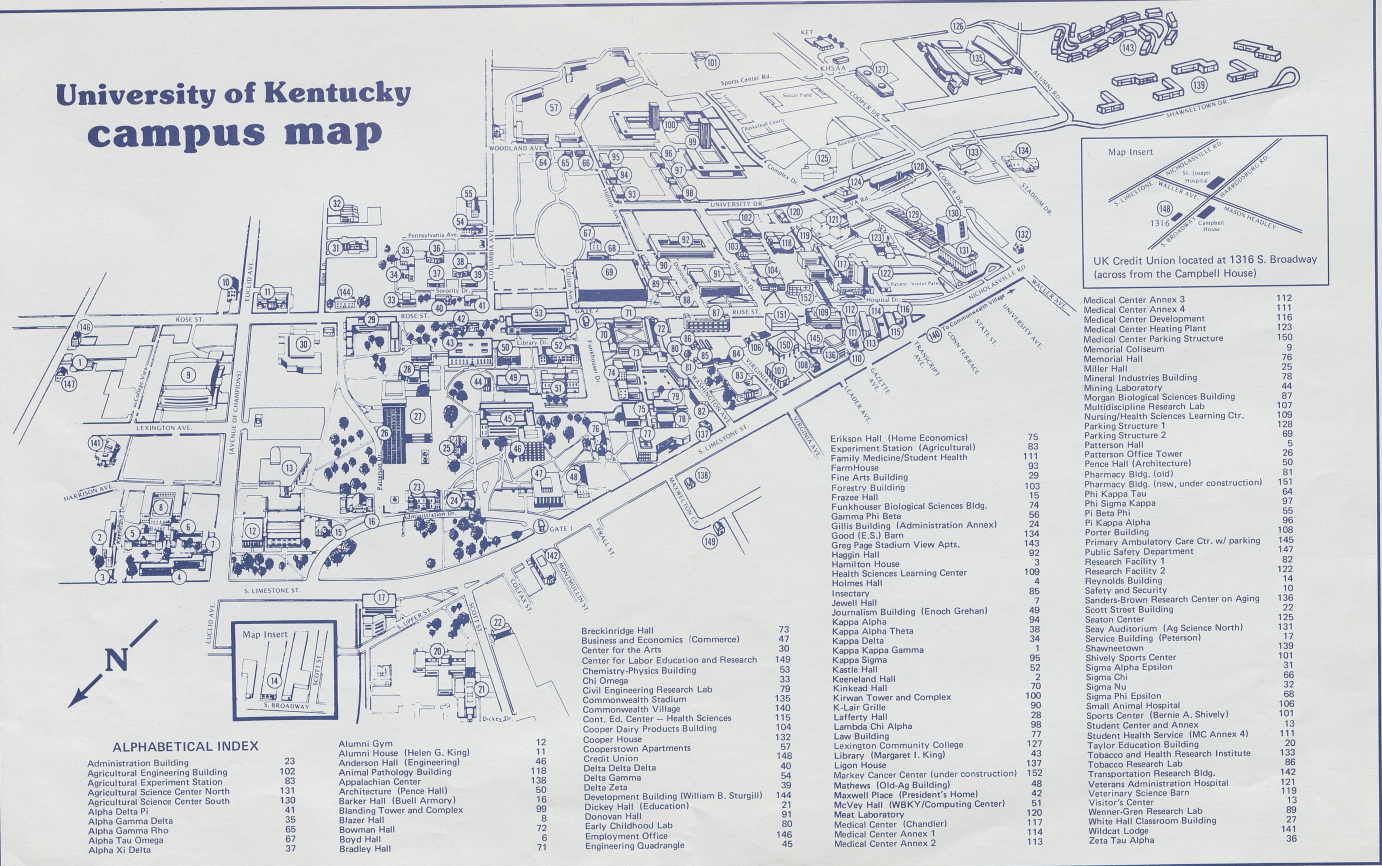


# University of Kentucky campus map

Thirty-three percent of UK's undergraduates receive some sort of financial aid, which in 1982-83 totaled more than \$20 million.

**Student Body**

Enrollment on UK's Lexington campus is more than 22,000. The students come from every county in Kentucky and 48 other states and the District of Columbia and 78 foreign countries.

About 5,400 students live in UK's residence halls with another 3,000 students in UK's 26 fraternities and 16 sororities.

**Alumni**

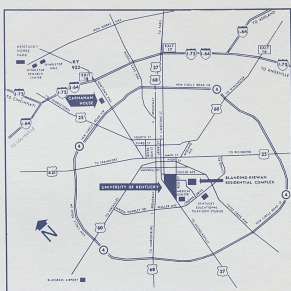
The University has about 91,000 alumni around the world with about 22,000 paid members of UK's Alumni Association including 7,300 life members. There are 65 alumni clubs across the nation, with 34 of them in Kentucky and 31 outside the state from California to New York.

**Athletics**

In athletics, UK has a total of 19 sports — 10 men's sports and 9 women's sports — while competing on the highest level of national collegiate competition.

The Wildcats basketball team plays in the downtown Lexington Civic Center's Rupp Arena. It seats more than 23,000. Joe B. Hall succeeded Adolph Rupp as head basketball coach in 1972 and has kept alive a tradition that includes 5 NCAA championships, 2 NCAA runner-up trophies, 2 NIT winning trophies, 5 Sugar Bowl and 35 SEC championships.

Wildcat football teams play in the 58,000-seat Commonwealth Stadium on campus and in recent years have shared an SEC championship, won a Peach Bowl and compiled a 10-1 record. They are coached by Jerry Claiborne.



**Community Colleges**

The Lexington campus also is the headquarters for UK's Community College System. UK has 13 of these two-year colleges across the state which offer both the first two years of the baccalaureate program or an associate technical degree, as well as a variety of continuing education and community service programs. Enrollment at the community colleges is more than 24,000 students.

**Medical Center**

UK's Albert B. Chandler Medical Center has a wide range of programs in education and research. The five colleges — Medicine, Dentistry, Nursing, Pharmacy and Allied Health Professions — have more than 2,000 students pursuing bachelor, master's and doctoral degrees in health-related fields.

The Medical Center also has the 486-bed University Hospital as part of its teaching and service programs.

**What to See**

There are free tours of the campus each Monday through Friday at 2 p.m. on "Old Blue," a double-decker bus. (Walking tours only from Dec. 15 to March 1.) Bus tour leaves from Administration Building and takes about 30 minutes. No advance reservation necessary.

The UK Art Museum, located in the West Wing of the new UK Center for the Arts at the corner of Rose and Euclid streets, is open daily except Mondays and University holidays from noon to 5 p.m.

The UK Museum of Anthropology is open Mondays through Fridays from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. It is located in Lafferty Hall on the campus. A cultural history of Kentucky is the featured exhibit.

Visitors to the UK campus may also want to take advantage of the breathtaking view of Lexington and the University campus from the 18th floor of the Patterson Office Tower on campus. It is open from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Mondays through Fridays.

## Campus Map and University Facts

**History and Governance**

The University of Kentucky was founded in 1865 under the provisions of the Morrill Land-Grant Act.

For the first 40 years, enrollment remained small, but by the turn of the century the University was becoming one of the most important institutions in the state.

UK took its present name in 1916 and at the same time assumed the responsibility of being the state's principal institution for teaching, research and service.

The University of Kentucky is governed by a 20-member Board of Trustees.

Dr. Otis Singletary, the eighth president of the University of Kentucky, has headed the University since 1968.

**Physical Campus and Plant**

The University of Kentucky's 716-acre campus is located just south of downtown Lexington, Ky., which has a population of more than 200,000. There are about 200 buildings and other structures, walks, malls, gardens, playing fields, recreation space and parking areas on campus.

**Academic Program**

The University of Kentucky has 17 academic colleges. They are: Arts and Sciences... Agriculture... Engineering... Business and Economics... Education... Home Economics... Library Science... Social Work... Architecture... Communications... Fine Arts... Law... Medicine... Dentistry... Nursing... Allied Health Professions... Pharmacy. On the graduate level, 60 programs lead to the master's degree and 47 to the doctorate in the Graduate School.

**Research**

The University of Kentucky library system contains about 1.8 million volumes and ranks 14th in the nation in microform holdings. The University receives more than \$36 million in sponsored research and sponsored program funds each year. Among the major areas of research at the University of Kentucky are energy, engineering, medical (especially cancer research and research on the aging) and agriculture (especially in tobacco and equine).

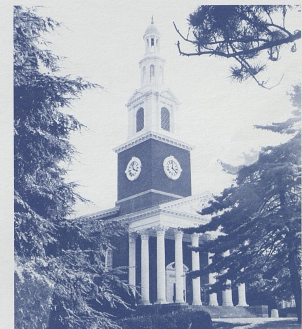
**Faculty**

UK's faculty numbers 1,459 on the Lexington campus including a graduate faculty of about 1,000.

**Admissions and Enrollment**

Freshman admission to UK will be based upon the probable academic success as predicted by the student's high

school grades and performance on the American College Test (ACT). Applicants whose test scores and high school grades indicate a high probability of achieving a 2.0 or "C" grade-point standing in their freshman year at UK will be automatically admitted. The University will admit a limited number of applicants who are not automatically acceptable after a review of their academic record and a number of other criteria.



Some academic colleges and programs with colleges at UK have admission standards and criteria which are higher than those for general admission to UK and may have different deadlines.

**Tuition and Financial Aid**

The 1984-85 undergraduate tuition is \$562 per semester for residents of Kentucky and \$1,601 for non-residents. Estimated room and board for the school year range from \$2,140 to \$2,450 depending on the meal plan chosen.
