

Minutes of the Meeting of the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky, Friday, August 24, 1979.

The Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky met in regular statutory session at 2:00 o'clock (EDT) on Friday, August 24, 1979 in the Board Room on the eighteenth floor of the Patterson Office Tower on the Lexington campus with the following members answering the call of the roll: Mr. William B. Sturgill, Chairman, Professor Michael Adelstein, Mr. William R. Black, Governor Albert Benjamin Chandler, Mrs. Betty Pace Clark, Mr. Albert G. Clay, Mr. Tracy Farmer, Mr. George W. Griffin, Mrs. Sally Hermansdorfer, Dr. David A. Hull, Mr. Thomas B. Kessinger, Mr. Zirl A. Palmer, Mr. Frank Ramsey, Mr. Homer W. Ramsey, Mr. Mark Metcalf, Professor Constance Wilson, and Dr. John R. Woodyard. Absent from the meeting were Mr. L. D. Gorman, and Mr. W. B. Terry. The University administration was represented by President Otis A. Singletary; Vice Presidents Lewis W. Cochran, Robert Zumwinkle, Peter P. Bosomworth, Raymond R. Hornback, John Smith, Jack Blanton, and Donald Clapp; Dr. Wimberly C. Royster, Dean of the Graduate School and Coordinator of Research; Mr. John Darsie, Legal Counsel; and Dr. Charles Wethington representing Vice President Stanley Wall. Members of the various news media were also in attendance.

A. Meeting Opened and Oath of Office Administered to Mr. Metcalf

Mr. Sturgill, Chairman, called the meeting to order at 2:10 p.m. following the invocation, pronounced by Mr. Black, Mr. Darsie administered the oath of office to Mr. Mark Metcalf, who will serve as student trustee during his term of office as President of Student Government.

The Secretary called the roll and reported 17 of the 19 members present. The Chairman then declared the meeting officially open for the conduct of business at 2:14 p.m.

B. Minutes Approved

On motion duly made, seconded and carried, the reading of the Minutes of the June 28, 1979 meeting of the Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees was dispensed with and the Minutes were approved as published.

C. Nominating Committee Appointed

Mr. Sturgill named Mr. Homer Ramsey, Mr. Thomas Kessinger, and Dr. David Hull, with Mr. Ramsey as Chairman, as a nominating committee to prepare a slate of officers of the Board and members of the Executive Committee to be presented at the September 18 meeting of the Board.

D. President's Report to the Trustees (PR 1)

Because of the length of the afternoon's agenda, President Singletary did not review the items in PR 1, copies of which were distributed to the members, and recommended that it be accepted and filed. Without objection, it was so ordered.

E. Recommendations of the President (PR 2)

After commenting that the items presented in PR 2 were routine in nature, President Singletary recommended that it be approved as a whole. On motion by Mr. Clay, seconded by Mr. Black, and passed without dissent, PR 2 was approved. (See PR 2 at the end of the Minutes)

F. Supplemental Recommendations of the President (Candidates for Degrees - University System) (PR 3a)

President Singletary noted that there were two parts to PR 3 and recommended that PR 3a, which authorized the conferring of degrees on persons completing requirements in August, and one post-retirement appointment, be approved as a whole. On motion by Mr. Homer Ramsey, seconded by Governor Chandler and passed, PR 3a was approved. (See PR 3a at the end of the Minutes)

G. Appointment of Director, Multidisciplinary Center for Gerontology and Director, Sanders-Brown Research Center on Aging (PR 3b)

At President Singletary's request, Dr. Bosomworth reviewed the background and fitness of Dr. William R. Markesbery for the dual role as the Director of the Multidisciplinary Center for Gerontology and Director of the Sanders-Brown Research Center. Both Dean Royster and President Singletary concurred in Dr. Bosomworth's assessment of Dr. Markesbery, and President Singletary recommended approval of his appointment.

On motion by Mr. Clay, seconded by Professor Adelstein, and passed without dissent, William R. Markesbery, M.D., Professor, Department of Neurology and Pathology, College of Medicine, was named Director of the Multidisciplinary Center for Gerontology, University of Kentucky and Director of the Sanders-Brown Research Center on Aging, College of Medicine, effective September 1, 1979. (See PR 3b at the end of the Minutes)

H. Report on Neo-Natal Expansion Project

Because of the recent adverse publicity in the news media relative to the neo-natal program at the University, President Singletary requested Dr. Bosomworth to report on the progress being made in attaining the eventual goal of 45 beds in the neo-natal intensive care unit.

Dr. Bosomworth indicated that the management of neo-natal care in the University Hospital has been a four-phase program because construction must be carried out in existing patient care areas. Phases I and II have been completed and the unit currently has 31 beds (an increase from 17 to 23 and from 23 to 31). Phase III will increase the capacity from 31 to 39. The planning and architectural programming are completed and bids are ready to be awarded in Frankfort. The project should be completed in early May, 1980. Phase IV, which will add the remaining 6 beds, cannot be begun until renovation of the north wing is completed. Hopefully, this phase can be initiated in May or June of 1980.

Relative to the transportation system, which has also received criticism, Dr. Bosomworth reported that the neo-natal transport service of the University Hospital began in February, 1979. The program was funded by the Department of Human Resources and it was the intention at that time to transport infants to Fayette County, either to the Medical Center or to Central Baptist Hospital. In the event that both of these facilities were at full capacity, infants were then transported to other hospitals in Louisville or Cincinnati. In April, 1979 the Director of the neo-natal care made the decision to curtail this service for infants not being transported to Fayette County. This decision was made due to a reduction in staff and a growth of service beyond the original expectation, which resulted in a lack of capacity to handle all infants requiring transportation. The decision to curtail this facet of the transport system was made without the knowledge of Dr. Bosomworth. However, since learning of the change, he has indicated that the service will be resumed as expeditiously as possible. Renewal of the system will involve the addition of specialized nursing personnel who need to be both recruited and trained. The earliest possible date for resumption under optimal circumstances is a period of 90 days.

I. Proposed Amendments to the Governing Regulations (PR 4)

President Singletary recommended that the proposed amendments to the Governing Regulations as presented in PR 4 be received for consideration and placed on the agenda for action at the next meeting of the Board of Trustees. On motion by Governor Chandler, seconded by Mr. Black and passed, it was so ordered. (See PR 4 at the end of the Minutes)

J. Joint Program in Food Science (PR 5)

Because of the increasing demand for individuals with training in the area of food resources and nutrition, greater emphasis has been placed on this study in both the College of Agriculture and the College of Home Economics. To bring visibility to the area and increase scholarship and employment opportunities for the student, it is felt that it would be desirable to offer a joint program leading to the degrees of Bachelor of Science in Agriculture or Bachelor of Science in Home Economics with a major in Food Sciences. President Singletary recommended that the Board of Trustees authorize such a program for transmission to the Council on Higher Education.

On motion by Professor Wilson, seconded by Mr. Kessinger and passed without dissent, authorization was given for submission to the Council on Higher Education of a joint program at the undergraduate level leading to the degree of Bachelor of Science in Agriculture or Bachelor of Science in Home Economics with a major in Food Science. (See PR 5 at the end of the Minutes)

K. Capital Construction Projects (PR 6)

President Singletary recommended that the Board approve for transmission to the Council on Higher Education the four capital construction projects as recommended in PR 6. The projects are as follows: (1) Seaton Center floor replacement; (2) Euclid Avenue flag plaza; (3) Structural repairs - Hopkinsville Community College Academic Building; and (4) Parking lot paving - Jefferson Community College.

On motion by Mrs. Hermansdorfer, seconded by Mr. Metcalf and passed without dissent, the four capital construction projects were approved for transmission to the Council on Higher Education. (See PR 6 at the end of the Minutes)

L. Board Delegation for Handling Contract and Grant Awards (PR 7)

President Singletary explained that it has been necessary to await Board of Trustees authorization for expenditure in the area of grants and contracts which has caused some delay in meeting obligations under the contract. He, therefore, requested that the Board delegate to him the authority to authorize expenditures from these accounts with such authorizations being reported to the Board at its next regular meeting following the authorization. Governor Chandler so moved, his motion was seconded by Mr. Black and passed without dissent. (See PR 7 at the end of the Minutes)

M. Budget Revisions for 1979-80 (PR 8)

President Singletary recommended that the revisions in the 1979-80 budget be authorized and approved. Without discussion, on motion by Mr. Palmer, seconded by Mr. Kessinger and passed, the proposed revisions in the 1979-80 budget were authorized and approved. (See PR 8 at the end of the Minutes)

N. Biennial Budget Request for 1980-82 and Five-Year Plan 1979-84 (PR 9)

President Singletary said that the biennial budget request presented for consideration was a part of the 1979-84 Five-Year Plan and provided total funding for the 1980-81 fiscal year of \$313.3 million dollars, a 17% increase over the current year's budget and \$341.5 million dollars for the 1981-82 fiscal year, a 9% increase over 1980-81. If approved, the state appropriations would amount to approximately \$351.2 million dollars over the two year biennium. The remainder of the budget comes from tuition and fees, federal appropriations, gifts and grants and other such sources.

Through the use of charts, President Singletary summarized the manner in which the proposed increases in state appropriations of \$39.6 million dollars in the first year and \$24.2 million dollars in the second year would be allocated. The major part (89% - 1980-81 and 86% - 1981-82) would be spent on continuing and improving present programs and salary catchup. Only 10% the first year and 12.8% the second year would be spent on program expansion, and new programs would amount to .8% and 1.2% respectively. Capital construction funding includes a new Architecture Building, Mining and Minerals Coal Center, expansion of the Seaton Center, a Primary Care Center, and Pharmacy Building, as well as additional facilities at the Community Colleges.

After a brief discussion of the proposed budget, Mr. Homer Ramsey moved that the biennial budget request 1980-82 and the Five-Year Plan 1979-84, including the capital construction request, be approved for submission to the Council on Higher Education for review and recommendation to the Governor of the Commonwealth. His motion was seconded by Governor Chandler and passed with all present voting "aye". (See PR 9 at the end of the Minutes)

O. Lease to the Appalachian Regional Commission (FCR 1)

Mr. Clay, Chairman of the Finance Committee, said that the Committee had met on the morning of August 24, and had only one recommendation to make to the Board. He then moved that the Vice President for Business Affairs and Treasurer be authorized to negotiate and execute an 11 year lease of a .79 acre site on Coldstream Farm to the Appalachian Regional Commission. His motion was seconded by Mr. Palmer and passed without dissent. (See FCR 1 at the end of the Minutes)

P. Report of Investments (ICR 1)

Mr. Griffin, Chairman, reported that the Investment Committee had met on the morning of August 24, and approved the report of changes made in investments. He then moved that the report of the changes made in investments for the University of Kentucky and its Affiliated Corporations for the quarter ended June 30, 1979 be accepted. His motion was seconded by Mr. Kessinger and passed with all present voting "aye". (See ICR 1 at the end of the Minutes)

Q. Meeting Adjourned

Mr. Sturgill reminded the members of the Board that the next meeting would be held on September 18. He then called for a motion for adjournment which, being duly made, seconded and carried, the meeting adjourned at 3:12 p.m.

II. Assignment of Letters of Patent - Triplett and Smith

Recommendation: that the Board of Trustees, by and through its chairman, William B. Sturgill, execute the assignment of rights for the Letters of Patent of John W. Triplett and Randall B. Smith entitled "Synthesis and Use of Diagnostic Radio-Pharmaceuticals Comprising Radioactive Isotopes of Bromine with Dyes" to the University of Kentucky Research Foundation.

Background: Professors Triplett and Smith have assigned their rights to the invention mentioned above to the University. In accord with usual practice, it is recommended that the University assign the patent to the University of Kentucky Research Foundation.

APPOINTMENT OF DIRECTOR, MULTIDISCIPLINARY  
CENTER FOR GERONTOLOGY AND DIRECTOR,  
SANDERS-BROWN RESEARCH CENTER ON AGING

Recommendation: that William R. Markesbery, M.D., Professor, Departments of Neurology and Pathology, College of Medicine, be named Director of the Multidisciplinary Center for Gerontology, University of Kentucky, and Director of the Sanders-Brown Research Center on Aging, College of Medicine, effective September 1, 1979.

Background: During this past year, the Board of Trustees authorized the creation of the University of Kentucky Multidisciplinary Center for Gerontology and the Sanders-Brown Research Center on Aging facility for basic biologic research was completed. Development of both the Multidisciplinary Center for Gerontology and the Sanders-Brown basic research program will provide effective coordination and administration of multidisciplinary programs for research, instruction, and service in gerontology. The selection of a permanent director for the Sanders-Brown Research Center and the availability of the facility will allow for consolidation and expansion of basic research in the biology of aging.

Dr. Markesbery is an Honors graduate of the first class of the University of Kentucky College of Medicine. After graduation and completion of his residency training, he served as a faculty member at the University of Rochester. Since his appointment to the College of Medicine faculty in 1972, he has been a dynamic force within the College and has become a widely recognized research scientist in neuropathology with an emphasis on problems that affect older people. A number of his studies have focused on problems experienced by patients with presenile and senile dementia as well as cerebral-vascular strokes. His basic research in this and other areas has resulted in more than 80 publications in distinguished scientific journals. He has demonstrated outstanding scientific, clinical, and teaching skills and has received many honors, including the University of Kentucky Research Professor award and the Kentucky Medical Association's Faculty Scientific Achievement Award in 1977, and the University of Kentucky Research Foundation Award in 1979.

Dr. Markesbery's appointment has the support of the Dean of the Graduate School and Coordinator of Research, as well as the Dean of the College of Medicine and the Vice President for the Medical Center.

Ninth Amendment- Change the second paragraph of Part X,C,5,a (page 38) to read:

[Academic appointees] Faculty members who have full-time non-tenured or tenured appointments in the regular, special title, extension, or librarian series with the rank of assistant professor or higher, or of equivalent rank for this purpose as determined by the President, are eligible for leaves of absence after six years of continuous service in the rank of instructor or higher at the University, or for leaves of absence under a different option after three years of continuous service. All such leaves of absence shall be approved by the President or his designated representative.

Background: This changes provides better clarification about faculty members who are eligible to apply for sabbatical leave.

Proposed Amendments to the Governing Regulations

Recommendation: that the following proposed amendments to the Governing Regulations of the University of Kentucky be received at this time for preliminary consideration and, at the next regular meeting of the Board of Trustees, be included on the agenda for action.

(Note: Proposed additions are underlined; proposed deletions are bracketed.)

First Amendment - Change the third paragraph of Part IV (page 11) to read:

The 160 elected faculty members shall be apportioned each spring among the colleges and the University Libraries according to the following two equally weighted factors based on data for the preceding fall semester: (1) the number of full-time teaching and/or research faculty, except those appointed in the research title or visiting series, with the rank of assistant professor or higher in the college or the University Libraries; (2) the number of full-time students enrolled in the college, computed so that students enrolled in the Graduate School shall be assigned to the college in which they are pursuing their studies. Each elected faculty member shall serve for a term of three years and shall be eligible for reelection for a second consecutive term, but ineligible for further reelection until one year has elapsed. If a faculty member of the Senate should at any time during his term become ineligible to serve (e.g., by reason of assuming an administrative title, resignation, or [by] official leave which precludes attendance), the administrative head of the group represented shall declare a vacancy and designate that member from the eligible faculty who at the last election received the next highest vote to serve for the duration of the elected faculty member's ineligibility.

Background: This change is consistent with the principle that full-time faculty members who hold appointments in the research title or visiting series are not eligible for membership in the University Senate.

Second Amendment - Change the first paragraph of Part VII,A,4 (page 20) to read:

The faculty of a college shall consist of its dean, any assistant and/or associate deans and all its full-time faculty personnel having the rank of assistant professor, associate professor or professor in the regular, special title, or extension series. Membership, with or without voting privileges, may in addition, be extended by a college faculty to any other person assigned to it for administrative work, teaching or research. An individual may be assigned to more than one faculty. In this instance, one assignment shall be designated by the President or his designated officer as the primary one.

Background: This change provides needed clarification about faculty who directly qualify as voting members in the faculty of a college.

Third Amendment - Change the first paragraph of Part VII,A,5 (page 21) to read:

The faculty of a school shall consist of the dean of the college of which it is an administrative unit, the associate dean or director who is the chief administrative officer of the school, and the members of the faculty of the college who have been assigned duties in the school. [In addition,] It also shall include members of the faculties of other colleges who have joint appointments in the school or departments of the school. (The faculty of a college is defined in Part VII,A,4 of these regulations.) In addition, membership, with or without voting privileges, may be extended by the school faculty to any other person assigned to the school for administrative work, teaching or research.

Background: This change provides needed clarification about faculty who directly qualify as voting members in the faculty of a school and also about other persons who may be extended membership with or without voting privileges.

Fourth Amendment - Change the first paragraph of Part VII,A,6 (page 21) to read:

The faculty of a department shall consist of a chairman and the members of the department who are members of the faculty of the school and/or college of which it is a member. (The faculties of a college and a school are defined in Part VII,A,4 and Part VII,A,5, respectively.) In addition, membership, with or without voting privileges, may be extended by the departmental faculty to any other member of the departmental faculty or staff or to any person assigned to it for administrative work, teaching, research or service.

Background: This change provides needed clarification about faculty who directly qualify as voting members in the faculty of a department.

Fifth Amendment - Change the second paragraph of Part VII,B,6 (page 25) to read:

The department chairman is responsible for recommendations on the appointment of new members of the department, promotions, reappointments, terminal appointments, decision not to reappoint, post-retirement appointments [(X-C-8)] and the granting of tenure. Procedures and criteria used in preparing recommendations shall be those established by the University, the college and the departmental faculty. As a minimum, the procedures must include consultation with all tenured members of the department and with all [those] full-time non-tenured faculty members, except those appointed in the research title or visiting series, with the actual or equivalent rank of assistant professor or [equivalent] higher who have been members of the department for two years, except as noted below. All recommendations on matters listed above, excepting reappointments and post-retirement appointments, must include the written judgment of each consulted member of the department along with the recommendations of the chairman. The following exceptions may be made: (1) faculty members need not be consulted on recommendations for promotion affecting members with equivalent or higher rank, except that all faculty members with tenure shall be consulted on recommendations for granting of tenure; (2) faculty members without tenure need not be consulted on recommendation for granting of tenure; (3) the right to make recommendations on temporary appointments and/or appointments at the assistant professor level or below may be delegated, with these appointments to be reviewed by the tenured faculty of the department during the second semester of the first year of appointment; (4) in a large and diverse department, upon prior recommendation by the departmental faculty and approval by the President, consultation with faculty members may be restricted to those associated with the concerned, previously-defined academic division or program area in the department.

Background: This change is consistent with the principle that full-time, non-tenured faculty members who hold appointments in the research title or visiting series are not eligible to vote or to provide written judgments relative to recommendations on appointments, promotions, reappointments, etc., and, therefore, need not be consulted.

Sixth Amendment - Change Part X,B,1 (page 31) to read:

Types of Appointment

[Full-time academic appointments shall be of three kinds: (1) non-tenure appointments; (2) appointments with tenure; and (3) post-retirement appointments (X-C-8).]

Faculty appointments shall be of three basic types: (1) non-tenured appointments; (2) tenured appointments; and (3) post-retirement appointments.

There are two types of non-tenured appointments. One type of non-tenured appointment is that in which a faculty member is ineligible for tenure as a consequence of having been appointed: (1) in the research, adjunct, visiting, or voluntary series of academic ranks and titles; or (2) on a part-time or temporary basis. An appointment on a temporary basis involves an individual who has assigned duties and responsibilities which should be completed within one year or less.

A second type of non-tenured appointment is that in which a faculty member has been appointed on a full-time, year-to-year basis in the regular, special title, extension, or librarian series of academic ranks and titles. In such an appointment, the faculty member does not have tenure but may be considered for tenure if recommended for such by the appropriate University administrators.

A tenured appointment is one in which a faculty member is on full-time continuous appointment.

A post-retirement appointment is a type of appointment which is used in a very limited number of retirement cases, when it is essential to a University program or office or when it is otherwise impossible practicably to fill a position with a fully qualified person. Such an appointment may be part-time or full-time, requires approval by the Board of Trustees, and is made for periods not to exceed one year each, but in no case will such an appointment extend beyond the fiscal year in which the employee attains age 70.

Notwithstanding the prohibition relating to appointments beyond age 70, however, a former employee who has attained age 70 may be employed, subject to conditions specified in the Administrative Regulations (Section II.B.2 of AR II-8.0-4), to perform duties for which fee schedules have been established and approved by the President of the University.

More detailed information on the various types of appointments is provided in the Administrative Regulations (AR II-1.0-1, AR II-5.0-2 and AR II-8.0-4).

Background: An expansion of this section of the Governing Regulations has been needed to provide more information and better clarification on types of appointments.

Seventh Amendment - Change Part X,B,2 (pages 31 and 32) to read:

#### Probationary Periods

Probationary periods (or maximum non-tenure periods) are not applicable in cases where faculty members are appointed: (1) in the research, adjunct, visiting, or voluntary series of academic ranks and titles; or (2) on a part-time or temporary basis. In all such appointments, faculty members are ineligible for tenure.

However, probationary periods are applicable to non-tenured appointments of faculty members on a full-time year-to-year basis in the regular, special title, extension, or librarian series of academic ranks and titles. Such non-tenured appointments may be for one year or for other stated periods, subject to renewal, but the total non-tenure period shall not exceed seven years, including previous full-time service with the rank of instructor or higher in other institutions of higher learning, provided that in the case of a faculty member with more than three years in the academic profession, who is called from another institution and appointed at the rank of associate professor or below, it may be required that he serve in a probationary status for a period not to exceed four years, even though thereby [his] the individual's total [probationary] non-tenure period in the academic profession is extended beyond seven years. However, in any case where a period of prior service of a prospective faculty member involves significantly different institutional

objectives or significantly different professional activity, all or part of the period of prior service may be eliminated from consideration in determining the maximum non-tenure period at the University of Kentucky. Except as provided in Part X-C-7, time spent on leave of absence shall count as probationary period service unless the University in granting the leave and the individual in accepting it agree to the contrary. Individuals initially appointed to the rank of full professor may be given non-tenure status for a period not to exceed one year. An individual shall not remain at the rank of instructor in the University for more than three years. If after that period, promotion to a higher rank cannot be justified, the individual's appointment at the University shall not be renewed.

Following appropriate probationary periods not exceeding in duration those described above, all persons of associate professor or higher rank shall be given tenure or shall not have their appointments renewed; all persons of assistant professor rank (or equivalent as adjudged by the President) shall: (1) be promoted to associate professor with tenure; [(2) be transferred to a non-research rank with tenure; or (3)] or (2) not have their appointments renewed. Established appointment, promotion, and review procedures shall be followed in making these decisions.

Existing tenure appointments are not affected by any of the foregoing regulations.

Background: The changes in the first and second paragraphs are intended to provide better clarification about the non-applicability or applicability of probationary periods to various types of non-tenured appointments. The deletion in the third paragraph is in conformity with current University practice and provides consistency between the Governing Regulations and the Administrative Regulations.

Eighth Amendment - Change the first paragraph of Part X,C,2 (page 36) to read:

All full-time [appointees] faculty members on a ten-month or a twelve-month [academic] assignment basis shall be entitled to [a one month] one month of vacation leave with pay during an assignment period. Vacation leave cannot be accumulated from one assignment period to another, except to the extent that a faculty member on a twelve-month assignment basis may, with advance approval of the dean or the director of the college, take vacation either during the assignment period in which the vacation is earned or within the first two months thereafter. All members of the teaching faculty shall be in actual attendance at least until after commencement and until all reports have been made, and at least three days prior to the first day of registration for the fall semester unless for special reasons special leave is approved.

Background: This change is needed in some organizational units of the University to achieve better balance and more effective use of faculty resources throughout the summer period. In the Medical Center colleges, for example, patient care and some teaching requirements can be met better through having slightly greater flexibility in scheduling vacation leave.

JOINT PROGRAM IN FOOD SCIENCE

Recommendation: that the Board of Trustees authorize for submission to the Council on Higher Education a joint program at the undergraduate level leading to the degrees of Bachelor of Science in Agriculture or Bachelor of Science in Home Economics, with a major in Food Science.

Background: The Colleges of Agriculture and Home Economics have, for a good many years, offered course work in food science, but there has never been identified a separate undergraduate major. The ever increasing demand for individuals with training in the areas of food resources and nutrition has led to increased emphasis on this study in both colleges. It is felt that the proposed program will bring visibility to the area and increase scholarship and employment opportunities for students. Although the program is joint between the colleges, there are significant differences in program emphases. However, the cooperative nature of the program will result in a stronger, more substantive program than either college could alone provide.

CAPITAL CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

Recommendation: that the Board of Trustees approve for submission to the Council on Higher Education four capital construction project proposals: 1) Seaton Center Floor Replacement; 2) Euclid Avenue Flag Plaza; 3) Structural Repairs, Hopkinsville Community College Academic Building; and 4) Parking Lot Paving, Jefferson Community College.

Background: 1) The Seaton Center is among the most heavily used facilities on campus (1,100 students per day during the last period October through February), and after seven years of such use, it is necessary to replace the synthetic floors. The project cost is estimated at \$195,000.

2) The proposed flag plaza will help to relieve the congestion in the Euclid Avenue/Rose Street area by providing a vehicular pull-off area to serve both the Coliseum and the Fine Arts Center. It will be located on Euclid Avenue directly across from the Coliseum and will be integrated in design with the plans for the grounds area on the west side of the Fine Arts Center. Cost of the project is estimated at \$121,000.

3) The structural repairs proposed for the Hopkinsville Community College Academic Building are required as normal maintenance items, but the cost is estimated at \$100,000 so the repairs are proposed as a separate capital construction project.

4) The proposed lot will be on Broadway between Second and Third Streets and will provide approximately 220 parking spaces. This lot will replace a lot under an I-65 expressway overpass that must be closed due to repairs to the overpass. Estimated cost of the project is \$175,000.

Cost of the first three projects will be borne from University Plant Funds. The fourth project will be funded from parking revenues.

BOARD DELEGATION FOR HANDLING CONTRACT AND GRANT AWARDS

Recommendation: that the Board of Trustees delegate to the President authority to authorize expenditures from accounts created as a result of a contract or grant agreement between the University and an outside agency with such authorizations being reported to the Board of Trustees at its next regular meeting following the authorization of such expenditures.

Background: Delegation already exists to enter into such contracts with outside agencies. However, in the past expenditures for all restricted funds (including contracts and grants) have been summarized by budgetary unit in the operating budget with each account separately established and administered. Expenditures have not been authorized until the Board of Trustees has acted to authorize an increase in the expenditure level. The delay associated with the wait for Board authorization for expenditure in the area of contracts and grants has created some problems in meeting obligations under the contract.

A distinction between restricted gifts on the one hand, and grants/contracts for sponsored programs on the other, is necessary for management and accounting purposes. Restricted funds include (1) gifts for specific program objectives, and (2) gifts designated for discretionary use by a specific organizational unit. Grants/contracts for sponsored programs represent a contractual obligation between the sponsor and the University for the performance of a specific activity through which the sponsor receives services or other identifiable benefits. The contractual obligation is documented by a proposal/award combination, contract or written memorandum of agreement.

3. Comments - The decrease in the College of Education is a result of an organizational change moving a portion of the Curriculum Development Center to the Bureau of Vocational Education. The increases in the Agricultural Experiment Station and the Agricultural Cooperative Extension will be supported by increased federal appropriations. An increase in the grant from the Fund for the Advancement of Education and Research in the UK Medical Center will support faculty salary supplementation for the College of Dentistry and the Health Service. The increase in the Behavioral Science budget will be supported by an increase in other gifts and grants. Increased Departmental Sales and Services income will support the expenditure increases in Home Economics, Cultural Resources Assessment, Paducah and Madisonville Community Colleges, Pathology, Radiation Medicine, Pharmacy, Medical Center Vice President, and the Medical Center Library. The increase in fund balances will support the expenditure increases in General Research Support and the Nonrecurring Contingency.
