Dear Mr. Bax.

Pursuant to the provisions of Sections 3, 4 and 5 of the enclosed copy of the Resolution of the State Central Executive Committee adopted June 20, 1940, which contains "OFFICIAL CALL FOR STATE, DISTRICT AND COUNTY DEMOCRATIC CONVENTIONS", as Chairman of the Democratic County Executive Committee, I have designated the East End Democratic Club, 648 South Shelby, Iouisville Kentucky, as the place for the voters of your District to assemble on Saturday, June 29, 1940 at 2:00 p.m., Central Standard Time, to elect thirty-six (36) delegates and alternates to the Third Congressional District Convention July 2, 1940 at 10:00 a.m., and State Convention, both to be held at the Armory Building, July 2, 1940 at 2:00 p.m., Central Standard Time.

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 5 of said enclosed official call, I have named you as the member from the 55rd legislative District of the County Executive Committee to call this legislative District Mass Convention of voters to order at 2:00 p.m., sharp, and to preside until a permanent organization is perfected.

I suggest that as soon as the convention come to order, the Secretary should read the official call of the State Central Executive Committee (sections 3, 4 and 5 of the resolution) and the first two paragraphs of this letter.

Nominations should then be offered for Chairman. If more than one person is nominated, the supporters of each of the candidates should be separated into groups so they may be counted. If tellers are requested the Chairman should appoint an equal number of tellers for each candidate and the candidates should be permitted to name the tellers that they desire to represent them at the count of voters.

A secretary should then be named in the same manner as the Chairman.

The newly elected Chairman should then preside over the meeting and the newly elected secretary should act as secretary of the meeting.

The Delegates and Alternates should be elected in the same manner as the Chairman and Secretary.

Resolutions that may be offered may be voted on and then the meeting should be adjourned.

Mimrtes of the Convention and all resolutions adopted should be completed at the place of the meeting and signed by the elected chairman and secretary of the meeting and submitted to me for signature.
