

My dear Mr. Donaldson: Some few weeks ago I discussed with you the possible reinstatement of Mr. Charles G. Kipp, formmerly attached to the Workmen's Compensation Board and during the last year of his employment, until May 1940, with the Wage-Hour Division of the Department of Industrial Relations. At that time it was my understanding that his reappointment would have to be deferred until such time as the Federation of Labor could make additional investigation of him. I am now informed that such additional investigation has been made and completed. Its result was transmitted by long distance telephone in your absence to Miss Hays, who, at that time, was asked by Mr. Edward Weyler, to prepare a written memorandum for your inspection to the effect that his organization had no objection to Mr. Kipp being reinstated and, if thought necessary by you, to confirm the same by long distance at his expense. No doubt Miss Hays will recall the conversation.
