

This is to remind you of an obligation that you, John Dugan and I assumed during the recent campaign, when we promised ~~certain awards~~ and certain rewards in the form of war bonds to the precinct workers for campaign funds collected and reported by them.

As far as I know, these awards have not yet been made, and I believe we would be remiss in our pledges if we failed to see that those to whom the bonds should go receive them.

It is quite possible that John Dugan has the record, and it should not be difficult to determine to whom the awards should be made.
