WASHINGTON — Eulogizing three fallen diplomats, President Clinton towed yesterday to carry on a struggle for pene in Bonia and ordered a revamped U.S. diplomatic delegation to return to Europe this weekend.

The group, headed by Assistant Secretary of State Richard Holbrooke, will meet with Bosnia's president and allied governments in Paris, then go on to the Balkans in midweek.

They will be carrying a seven-point U.S. plan aimed at ending the war in the former Yugoslav republic by dividing the country into ethnic zones.







He and 50 other professors and staff, all newcomers to UK, took part in an all-expense paid bus tour across the state.



On-Line partnership gives state access

A partnership between UK and MCI called UK On-Line will provide full Internet access to the UK community and most of the state.

"UK is the first university to

"UK is the first university to represent an Internet access provider," said Doyle Friskney, director of Communications and Network Systems for the school.

Over the past couple of years UK also the receiving requests from the community colleges, UK alumni, agricultural extension agents and farmers who wanted UK to help them gain access to the Internet, Friskney said.

"It wasn't feasible for UK to make the investment to connect them so we asked for bids from commercial providers and MCI

Prior to this arrangement, the only way the UK community could gain full Internet access was by using a computer located on the Lexington Campus.

Current accounts will allow users to log into a campus computer from home to check e-mail and send or receive certain files.

They will not, however, allow them to use services not based them to use services not based on UK's computers. UK On-Line will allow the

University community to pur-chase access to the World Wide

Web as well as most other Inter-net-based services for a dis-counted rate.

Students, faculty, staff and University Alumni Association members can receive 15 hours of access for \$12 per month.

Additional hours are available for 75 cents an hour.

People outside the University community can gain access for

for 75 cents an hour.
People outside the University community can gain access for \$17 per month which will also provide them 15 hours.
UK President Charles Wethington and several MCI officials will be present when UK On-Line is kicked-off Monday at 10 a.m. in front of the Student Center.
"The purpose of the event is to call the service to the attention of all potential subscribers but particularly the students," said John Scharfenberger, assistant director of Public Relations.
"The demonstration will show how through UK On-Line you can access all kinds of information — whether it's originating from UK, from Frankfort, Ky, or Frankfurt, Germany," he said.

"The setup will be there a number of hours most days during the week. Starting Monday, students will have many opportunities to see how the service works," he said.
