On August 31 another worker with her collection was placed in a country church. The firth book collection is ready and awaiting permission of school authorities for installation anti the state of September 2. For two weeks previous, workers had been interviewed and trained and instructed. They had been allowed a good deal of freedom in selection of book collections singe we chose workers who would fit into the various kinds of communities and wanted to have their judgment (to some extent) on the books they were to circulate. The book truck was taken to one school pichic for the purpose of advertisement.
