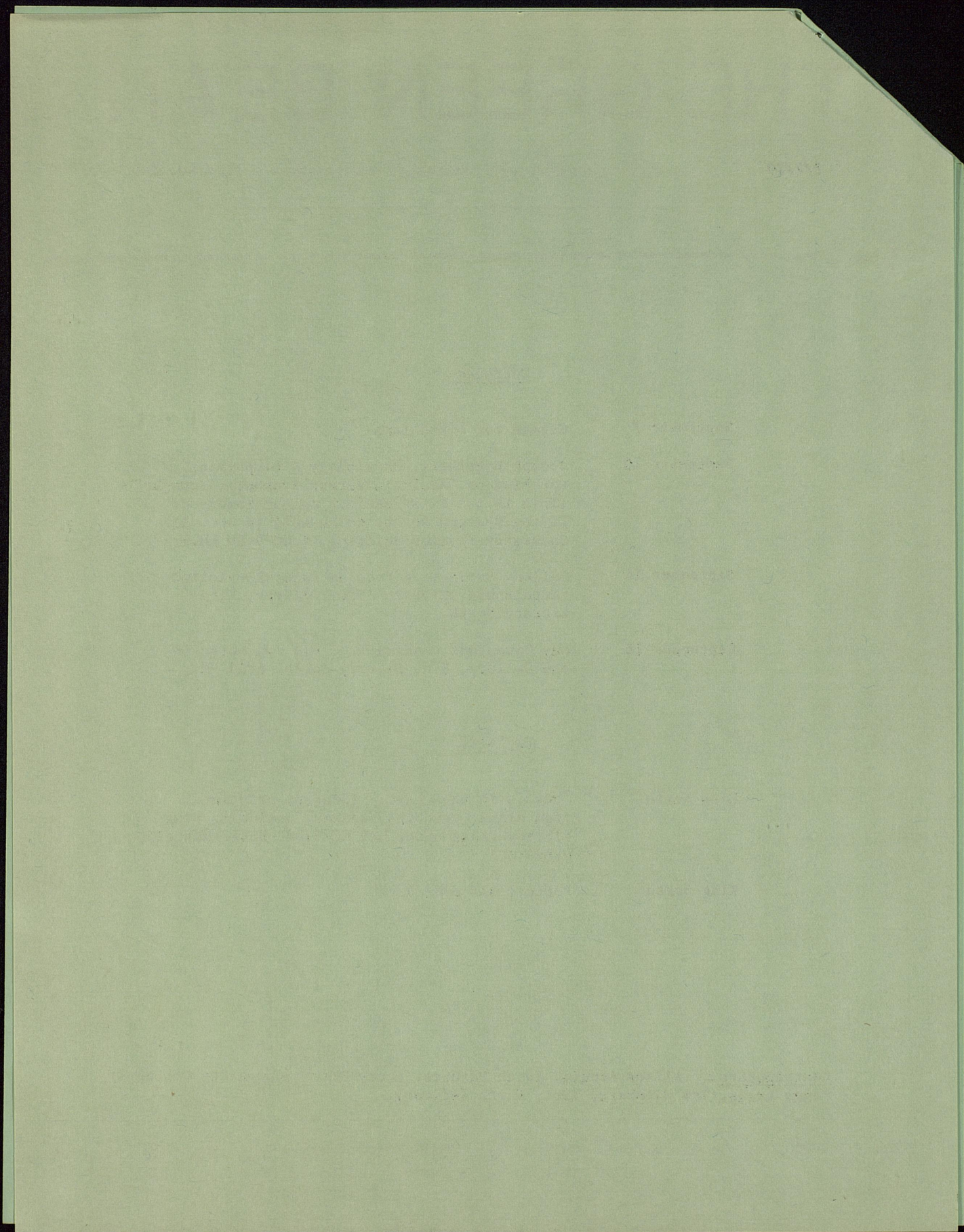

MEDIA SUPPORT

The Instructional Services/Media unit of the Reference Department has the following equipment:

Anyone in the Library who wishes to use equipment housed in Instructional Services may contact the Assistant to the Instructional Services Librarian to reserve the item(s) and make arrangements for pick up and return. Instructional Services is, however, neither staffed nor equipped to deliver and pick up equipment. Moreover, requests for equipment not listed above cannot be handled by Instructional Services and should be directed to the department or unit from which the needed equipment can be obtained. This latter may be accomplished either directly by each individual contacting the appropriate source and making independent arrangements, or indirectly by channeling requests through a department of the Library which has the resources to convey heavy, bulky equipment to and from locations on campus.

COMMUNITY COLLEGE LIBRARY NEWS

Representatives of several community college libraries met in Louisville to discuss the formation of a system-wide committee to plan for the advances and changes that come about with new technology.

It was suggested to Dr. Wethington that the committee be composed of the Head Librarians at each community college library and a liaison from the main campus.

The purpose of the committee should be to plan, promote, and implement technological advances for the community college system libraries; thereby improving services through effective and efficient use of resources - equipment, materials, funds, personnel, and space.

The immediate objectives of the committee would be COM catalogs, interlibrary loans, a union list, on-line search systems (Lockheed Dialog, SOS Orbit, etc.), and an automated circulation system.
