# LSAT, GRE add to obligations

Study. Study. Study. With finals on the horizon, some of the UK's seniors already have had their share of this activity — and then some.

On Dec. 2 four White Hall Classroom Building lecture halls were packed with test takers. From 8:30 a.m. to 1 p.m., the Law School Admission Test was administered to University students and members of the Lexington community. For many of those participating, the test served as an added stress during a time already hectic because of finals preparation.

"I feel like I have never not been studying for a test this semester," said Cheri Pettit, a communications senior who hopes to go on to the UK College of Law next fall. "But luckily some of my classes have had papers and projects as finals, so I don't have too many tests to study for."

For many other seniors planning their futures, the Graduate Record Exam is also a vital step. The exam, somewhat like the LSAT, is used when evaluating those applying to graduate school. The GRE was offered Saturday, and like many of the LSAT test-takers, stress and hours of preparation were plentiful. With finals falling so close to

the test date, though, some felt they were not as ready for the exam as they had hoped to be.

"Actually, I was unable to study for the GRE like I had planned because I had to concentrate on my classes at the same time," said Christine VonSick, hospitality management senior. "Because I hadn't been able to study as much as I wanted, I was really nervous when I went into the test."

Matt Bowdy, communications senior, plans to pursue a degree in communications or higher education administration at UK or the University of Vermont at Burlington.

"(Studying for the GRE) just kind of fell by the wayside," Bowdy said. "I started studying for it and then other things came up."

In addition to studying for both final examinations and the LSAT or GRE, applicants are busy filling out application forms, writing personal statements and soliciting letters of recommendation. Their nerves won't ease for quite some time either. The verdict is out on the LSAT and GRE scores for at least 4-6 more weeks.

So, students are beginning some more last-minute studying for finals and hoping for the best.

"I'm just glad (the GRE) is over. I can't wait until they all are," VonSick said.

In determining the date of the final examination, "classes which meet first" refers to the initial class meeting of the normal instructional week (Monday through Friday).

NO FINAL EXAMINATION SHALL BE GIVEN BEFORE MONDAY, DECEMBER 11, 1995

If a final examination is to be given, it will be administered during the examination period as scheduled above by the University Registrar.

Final examinations may be given at times other than the regularly scheduled time in the following instances:

**FACULTY:** In the case of conflicts or undue hardship for an individual instructor, a final examination may be rescheduled upon the recommendation of the chairperson of the department and with the concurrence of the dean of the college and the University Registrar.

**STUDENTS:** Any student with more than two final examinations scheduled on any one date shall

be entitled to have the examination for the class with the highest catalog number rescheduled. In case this highest number is shared by more than one course, the one whose departmental prefix is first alphabetically will be rescheduled. The option to reschedule must be exercised in writing to the appropriate instructor two weeks prior to the scheduled examination.

If an examination schedule conflict is created by faculty rescheduling of an examination, the student shall be entitled to take the rescheduled examination at another time during the examination period by mutual agreement with the instructor.

In the case of undue hardship for an individual student, a final examination may be rescheduled by the instructor.

Except for the Colleges of Law, Medicine, and Dentistry, the above schedule of final examinations shall apply to all colleges of the University.

ALL GRADES ARE DUE IN THE REGISTRAR'S OFFICE BY 4 P.M., MONDAY, DECEMBER 18.


To determine the final examination time for a course that meets at time other than the usual MWF or TR meeting pattern (e.g. MWF 8:30 a.m. - 9:20 a.m. or TR 10:20 a.m. - 11:35 a.m.), the course start time will be considered as meeting at the beginning of that hour (e.g. 8:00 a.m. or 10:00 a.m.).

## University athletic teams compete over holiday break

While many students are home enjoying Christmas vacation, the UK sports teams will be competing at various sights around the nation.

The men's basketball team will certainly stay busy. Rick Pitino's Cats will play eight games before classes resume Jan. 10, including a matchup against intrastate rival Louisville in Rupp Arena on Dec. 23.

UK also will travel to New York to participate in the ECAC Holiday Classic Dec. 27-29. The Cats won the four-team tournament in 1993 when Jamal Mashburn was a senior and Rodrick Rhodes was a freshman. Rhodes was named the tourney's most valuable player.

In addition to the New York trip, the Wildcats open their Southeastern Conference schedule Jan. 3 at South Carolina. Following the showdown with the Gamecocks, Pitino's Cats play two more conference games in six days, culminating in a showdown with highly-touted Mississippi State and its powerful center Erick Dampier in Starkville Jan. 9.

The Wildcats certainly have a wealth of talent on the roster, and the time away from school and classes will give Pitino the chance for some extra practice time.

With the extra time for teaching, the Cats are sure to be improved as they prepare for the clash with SEC archrival Arkansas Feb. 11 and the post-season tournaments.

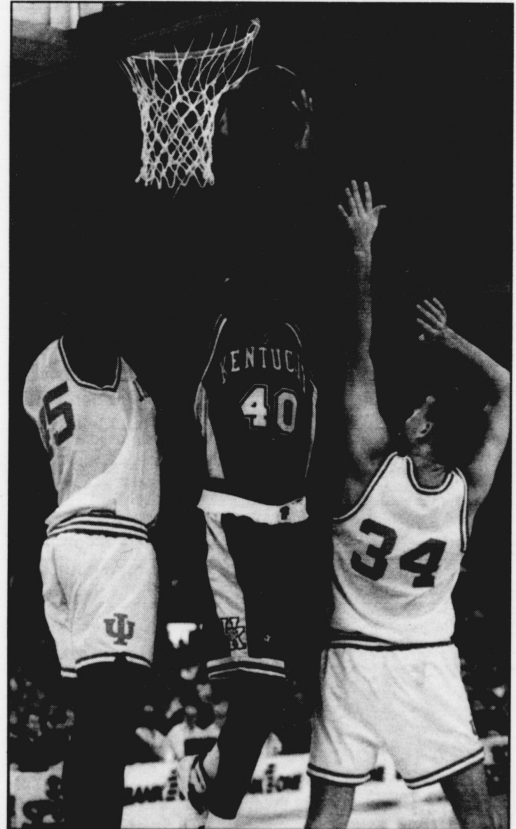
This men's SEC Tournament moves this season to New Orleans' Super Dome and will be played March 7-10.

Bernadette Locke-Mattox and her women's team also will stay occupied over the break. The women have eight games during the three-week break, including three contests in the friendly confines of Memorial Coliseum.

The women play three SEC games over the vacation including a road game with Florida in Orlando and home games with LSU and Ole Miss.

Some other highlights are games with North Carolina State and Duke at the Big Four Classic in Greensboro, N.C., and a showdown at home with Big East power Syracuse.

Locke-Mattox will be looking to get her inexperienced squad some valuable experience before the meat of its conference schedule and the SEC Tournament which will be played this year in

In other sports action, the UK gymnastics team will be gearing up for its season. The flippers take to mat for Excite Nite, an intrasquad exhibition Jan. 12.

The gymnastics team and Coach Leah Little will be looking to qualify for the NCAA Tournament and senior Jenny Hansen will be looking to win her fourth-consecutive NCAA all-around title, an unheralded feat in NCAA history.

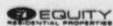

Although his employer has worked with him arranging convenient hours, he's not convinced things couldn't be better.

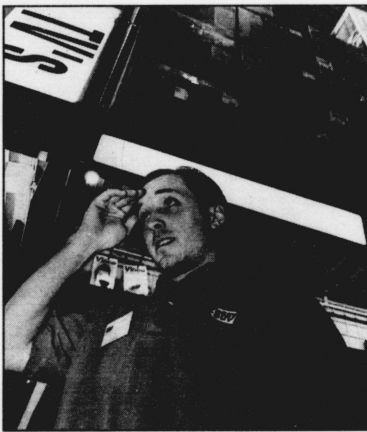
"It's been good but not as good as it could be. We don't have enough people working to take care of the customers we serve daily," Slagle said. "So sometimes they have no choice but to schedule you."

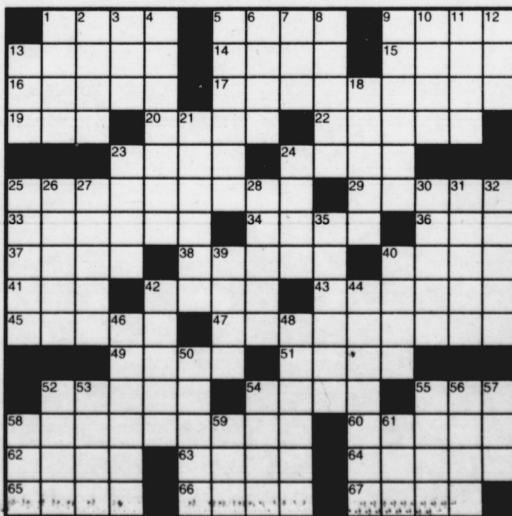

## Thieves abound during holidays

Most people think of the holiday season as a time of kindness and good will toward others, but for robbers and thieves, the season of joy can be the season of big profits.

Unfortunately, while many are busy giving and receiving, others are busy pick-pocketing and stealing.

Knowing how to protect yourself and your valuables this holiday season may save you from falling victim to theft around campus.

"We usually see the most increase in book theft and auto larceny during the holiday season," said Crime Prevention Coordinator Stephanie Bastin.

Because the winter holiday season also marks the end of a semester, students will be rushing to bookstores, selling back their books.

Students need to keep an extra eye out in order to keep their books out of the hands of a thief.

Bastin suggested never leaving books unattended in the library or campus eateries.

"If you leave your table to go get something to eat or a drink of water, take your books with you," Bastin said.

Car break-ins are the second most prevalent form of campus crime during this season.

Bastin said students and faculty should take extra time to make sure all valuables and presents are out of sight before leaving the car. Also make sure to lock all doors.

"If you leave anything of value such as CDs or cellular phones in the car, you're just inviting (robbers)," Bastin said.

### Safety tips

- ◆ Don't walk alone at night.
- ◆ Stay alert of surroundings.
- ◆ Walk in well-lit areas, away from large shrubbery.
- ◆ Don't leave purse, books, backpacks unattended.
- ◆ Always lock your car.
- ◆ Make sure valuables are well-hidden.
- ◆ Don't flash your money around.

Not only can valuables be stolen from your car, but thieves may snatch purses right out of your hands.

Bastin recommends walking around campus in numbers, especially at night.

Keep purses and bags tucked securely under your arm, to make them difficult for thieves to grab.

Because students will be walking back and forth from the library at night before and during exams, the same sort of precautions should be taken.

Discouraging a thief can be as simple as walking with confidence, Bastin said.

Walk with your head up and be aware of what is going on around you. Someone walking alone slumped over with their head down is an easy target to

thieves, because thieves know that the person is unaware of their surroundings and will be caught off guard.

Along those same lines, drivers should have their car keys ready and in hand before they even get to the car. A speedy car entry will allow a thief less time to sneak up on someone.

Although these tips may help safeguard students from thieves and attackers, the best bet (when walking alone) is to utilize the escort system sponsored by Student Government Association, she said.

By taking a few of these simple precautions, students can ensure their own safety and enjoy the holiday season without the worry of theft.
