UK (24, 0.4 Southeastern Conference) committed

and sparked UK. Boyd completed seven of 14 passes
for 81 yards and one touchdown.

"We weren't ready for Shane Boyd," said USC
head coach Lou Holtz. "He had us scrambling."

game to eight yards on six plays.






