To the Honorable J. C. D. T. Moore,
of the State of New York,

the honor to receive a copy of the Will of Col.
John T. Moore, deceased, which was probated
in the Probate Court of the County of New
York, on the 20th day of December, 1827, and
that it is my desire to have a copy of the same
sent to me by mail, at the earliest convenience.

About the year 1826 or 1827, in looking over the
papers of Col. Thomas Truitt, I saw among them a
Deed (printed, on Parchment) from Saddy Owen and
wife to Col. Thomas Truitt for 50 acres of land, situ-
ated in the Todd road some two miles from Lexing-
ton, on which Col. Truitt erected a stone house. The
date of the above deed was very ancient, hence not
say in what year. Inclosed in the above deed I
found a copy of Col. John Todd's Will. He appoint-
ed in said will, his brothers Robert and Levi
Todd his executors, and directed them to convey
by deed the above 50 acres of land to Saddy Owen.
The only other clause in the will, gave the whole
of his estate besides, to his own children or their
representatives, and in the event of their death, to
go to the children of his two brothers Robert
& Levi Todd. I am not positive these were the
terms used by the testator, but am certain it was
the idea conveyed in that clause of the will.

Within the last five or six years, I made diligent
search for the copy of the Will & seal but have
not been able to find them. The copy of the
Will was a certified copy from my best recollec-
