Sunday June 6

Started from Camp 7 O'clock after bringing our Horses 3 or 4 Miles from the back track, got bewilderd a little between the Rowling fork & ~~the~~ <sup>the</sup> Creek passed a fine Buffalo lick near the dividing ridge supposed to be water of ~~the~~ 44

Howling fork. Encamped on a branch of  
Professors  
Pitman's Cr. Travell'd about 2 1/2 miles  
Hunters turn out & two Deer are brought  
ht to Camp. Warm & like for rain

Monday June 7. 1784

A very rainy morning. Three Horses  
lost. At 2 O'clock found & started bearing  
about a West course to Pitmans Creek  
pretty good land all the way being about  
10 Miles. Encamped ~~on~~ Pitmans Creek

Started & went as far as the Elk lick  
being about 2 Miles. tarried there till one  
O'clock then met with the line runners & retr

ned back with them and encamped on the  
bank of Little Barran, which is about half  
a miles distance, Horse flies exceedingly  
plenty

Thursday June 10

Started from Little Barran, in Comp.  
with the line runners and returned toward  
Green R. as far as Sulphur lick Creek &  
went up the same as far as the Lick where  
there is two excellent Springs then  
turned Eastwardly & struck Green R.

-lick around which is pretty good Land. Head S by S.E

about 2 miles & struck the creek again where there is a good  
Bottom in a large bent of the creek at the upper end of  
which there is a Buffalo ford at the mouth of a branch  
and some trees marked on corners, a Maple & Elm on  
two of them. Steered then a southwardly course about 2  
miles & half through tolerable good high land well watered  
with Springs. Killed a Bear about one or two o'clock  
Spent the ball of the day in tanning it by way  
of ~~Barbaticue~~ Barbaticue

Saturday June 12

Started early up the course of Buffalo Creek,  
Crossing & recrossing it often. saw one or two to-  
lerable bottoms (see the location) about two o'clock

Sunday June 13

Steered up the creek crossing the branches some-  
times on and sometimes off. the day being  
cloudy & unfavorable for business we could not  
<sup>keep</sup> proper courses. about twelve o'clock cleared up  
we made for the head of the creek & crossed over  
a high ridge to the waters of Little Barran & about  
2 miles from the head got into pretty good bottom

thro narrow but kept widening till it emptied  
into the main Branch, Computed to be about  
3 Miles. then turned up the Main branch ~~for~~  
about one & half mile & took a westerly branch  
and went a small Distance up the same Gen-  
-camped at a Rock lick in the side of the branch  
(a little Salty) The Days travel about 16 or 18 Miles  
Very good Bottoms are on little Barran as far  
as I have yet seen, much superior to Russell  
Creek
