#### Kentucky: Then and Now

When Negroes were admitted to UK, the Director of Libraries asked which tables in the Reference Room should be set aside for them. The Library Staff (i.e. Faculty) opposed any setting aside of tables. Whitney Young's sister, Eleanor Gaillard (now a different name) worked in Gifts and Exchanges during the summer of 1951.

Lyman T. Johnson brought intergration to the University of Kentucky in 1949 when he became its first black student. His long career as educator and civil rights leader will be recognized when he receives honorary doctor of letters degree at the University's May 12 commencement.
