

Todd said that he and his wife, Patsy, have gone on walks around campus in order to pinpoint spots that need to be made safer, such as dark pathways with lots of brush. Being a parent himself, Todd said he realizes how important the safety of students is to other parents.

"You do understand when you have your own children they feel invincible until something happens," he said. Elighty-one percent of women surveyed avoided specific "unsafe" locations. A list of these have been compiled and given to police in order to increase patrols in those areas or look to improve safety in other ways, Jordan said. Jordan and Todd both noted that the current across-the-board effort, opposed to individual efforts, by all departments on campus has finally allowed UK to properly address campus safety.

"If you've got issues, you have to declare war on them," Todd said. "We could easily try and hide this problem and say, "We're not worse than anyone else."

While many of the initiatives do not

While many of the initiatives do not directly address prevention of the assaults on women by someone they know — which is the majority of the incidents — Todd said he hopes that initiatives such as setting up the Women's Place and getting the dialogue started will in turn trickle down to reduce the number of these instances. "The culture is what you want to change," he said.

How does the senate interact with the UK Board of Trustees?

A. It's been a long, time-hon-ored tradition for the Board of Trustees to solicit our advice and recommendation on a host of issues. Although I do not sit on the board, we do have two faculty repre-sentatives and they are the voice of the faculty community.

Those two representatives also sit on the Senate Council and although they do not vote, they contribute in an active way to the debate about important issues.

And do they take your suggestions to the Board of Trustees?

A. That's correct. On issues like the Boone Center, for example, both of the representatives solicited advice and views from the Senate Council, which they then took to the various forums that related to the Board of Trustees.

So there's a fluid discussion that goes on among the various faculty representatives, and while we don't always speak as one, it's very impor-tant to have this kind of dialogue go-

Do you think putting an em-phasis on research takes anything away from in-class instruc-tion?





Which Tradition is Cooler?

MICHIGAN'S THE VICTORS

WHEN JOHN PHILIP SOUSA declares a song to be one of the best he's heard, it's worth a listen. And that's exactly what Sousa said more than 100 years ago about *The Victors*, the only fight song in the country that is guaranteed to lift 110,000 fans out of their seats and prompt them to sing in unison. Tennessee's *Rocky Top*, you say? Sounds more like a dog's plaintive wail.

After a 12–11 win at powerhouse Chicago in 1898, Michigan music student Louis Elbel decided that "such an epic should be dignified by something more elevating," so he wrote the song on his way back to Ann Arbor. Two days later *The Michigan Daily* ran the final words of Elbel's classic—CHAMPIONS OF THE WEST— as the headline above its Page One game story.

Ohio State's weak dotting of the *i* does not even compare to *The Victors*. On each "Hail!" fans pump a fist in the air. Our song has phrases such as "victors valiant," "the leaders and the best" and "conqu'ring heroes" that—unlike a lot of other Hotty Toddy fight songs—have real meaning. And it's easy to learn; even the dopiest freshmen figure it out by the end of the home opener.

And Buckeyes, chew on this: Your "great" tradition wouldn't even exist if it weren't for us. The Michigan marching band created the script Ohio when the teams met in 1932. Sure, from there you came up with the dotted i, but that's like claiming to have erected the Eiffel Tower when all you did was add some lightbulbs.

And if this goes down to a tiebreaker, we're busting out the head-to-head record: 57-37-6, Michigan. Hail to the Victors.

OHIO STATE'S DOTTING OF THE

THE REASON THE dotting of the *i* is the greatest tradition in college sports is that no matter where you're from or for whom you cheer, when you see that senior sousaphone player take his place at midfield to the roar of 100,000-plus, you remember it. Forever.

The Victors is a great fight song, no doubt about it. But how deep a mark does it really leave? The assigning editor of this piece—a college football junkie, no less—initially called it The Victory March, which is Notre Dame's fight song.

Listen, fans from Miami, Kansas State and Washington have, at the sight of the Best Damn Band in the Land, put their beers down, stopped booing and watched, transfixed, as the band spells out Ohio with perfect precision. Crusty, cynical radio broadcasters from Miami were mesmerized as the band performed it at the 2003 Fiesta Bowl and said, "That was really cool." It's the truth.

The tradition becomes even more special on those rare occasions when the band invites a VIP to dot the i alongside the sousaphonist. Only two people in 68 years have received the honor—entertainer and college football fan Bob Hope and legendary OSU coach Woody Hayes. When a retired Hayes returned to Ohio Stadium for the first time, to dot the i in 1983, there was hardly a dry eye in the house, including Hayes's.

Those who were at the Horseshoe that day won't ever forget that moment. Hail to the true victors of college football's finest tradition.





He appears taciturn, brooding, until we ask him about being a musician here.

"The thing about Athens," Stanley says, "is that you can be a f---up at 32. Everyone else is. It's the Island of Misfit Toys of musicians."

Does Stanley know where I can find a Glands disc, or will I just have to beg Bennett to burn one for me? "Oh, wow," laughs Stanley, whose band tours nationwide out of a van. "I dunno, you know? I just play."

Depending upon how you pronounce the i, the term "live music" can either be a magnet or a maxim. In Athens, it is both. G



black colleges such as FAMU. Opposing schools, such as Illinois and Temple, have insisted on the band's presence as a condition for scheduling the FAMU football team. At halftime, concession stands are empty—fans would sooner miss a lost weekend with Beyonce than the band's show. With an amused air, FAMU director of bands Dr. µlaina White recalls a Ratters game at Florida last year, after which Gators concessionaires complained that the band's halftime show had seriously cut into their revenues. And after the football game is done, the two bands play =fifth Quarter, trading tracks in a show of one-upmanship that can last deep into the night. When FAMU faces its archival, Bethune-Cookman,

these battles can last for hours, until someone runs out of music. "Sometimes the stadium folks will turn out the lights on us," Dr. White says.

Hence the relentless preparation. At the first night of full practice the upperclassman drummers stand on the upslope of a hill, executing a series of rapid-fire routines as the freshmen stand beneath them. The upperclassmen bang their drums, snap their heads in unison and, for a periodic flourish, simultaneously clack drumsticks with the person to the left and to the right, executing the musical equivalent of the no-look pass. The message: If you think you can play, watch us play. Every couple of minutes the music stops, section leader Demario Cromity shouts, "We'd love to have you," and the others finish, "But we don't need you!"

All this talk of drills and discipline is not to suggest



that the band members don't have their fun. Along the way they laugh, they sing, they make friends for life. But that happens during the breaks and the in-between moments. During the opening music rehearsal dozens of members, from burly tuba players to petite piccolo players, are called out in front of the band to do 25 pushups, punishment for one transgression or another. And while the band's music directors are

all faculty members, it's the band's senior members-its section leaders and nine drum majors, many of whom go on to direct high school bands after graduation-who mete out the discipline.

The drum majors are known for the flamboyant splits they perform at halftime shows, but in rehearsals they are the agents of law and order. The head enforcer is Antonio Drayton, a brooding senior

with a shaved head and a linebacker's build. Drayton was the first person in 20 years to make drum major as a sophomore, and he has been head drum major for the past two years. "For band, there is no NFL, no NBA, no pro league," he says. "This is it. This is as good as it gets. And this is why it means so much to us."

There is no doubt how much it means to Drayton. On my third and last night of camp, the full band took to the field for four hours of drills. Most players work up a healthy sweat wearing T-shirts and shorts. Drayton had come to practice in a sauna suit: a heavy black rain poncho with matching hat and pants. After an hour he looked as though he was on the verge of liquefying, but he chose to wear the outfit so that when game day comes and he is in full uniform, he'll be ready for the heat.

When he comes off the field for a moment, I thank him for the band's hospitality. As we shake hands, our palms meet with a splash.

"Sorry," he says. "I'm a little wet."

"No problem," I say, walking away with the knowledge that the FAMU tradition is in good, albeit sweaty, hands. And, once again, wishing I'd brought a towel. G
