

WILL OF MRS. JENNIE WITHERS SMITH

I, Jennie Withers Smith, of Lexington, Kentucky, make this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all former wills.

FIRST.- I desire that all my just debts be paid.

SECOND.- I devise to the three brothers of my deceased husband to-wit, Franklin B. Smith, Marcus A. Smith and James J. Smith and to Agnes B. Smith, daughter of his deceased brother Higgins C. Smith the farm situated in the edge of Harrison and Bourbon Counties, Kentucky, that I bought of my father-in-law, F.C. Smith, including that portion thereof which was inherited by my husband from his father and which passed to me as devisee under the will of my husband: to have and to hold, in equal moieties, unto my husband's said three brothers and the daughter of his deceased brother above mentioned, and to their heirs and assigns forever in fee simple.

THIRD.- I will and direct that the note or obligation of Bailey D. Berry for two thousand dollars (\$2,000) executed by him to me, together with the stock pledged as collateral thereon, be surrendered to him by my Executor without payment or charge against him, in recognition and appreciation of the services rendered by him to me in my lifetime and in the management of my business and property.

FOURTH;- I give to my niece, Ida Withers Harrison, my dining room set of furniture; to my niece and namesake, Jennie Withers Ashbrook, my pair of diamond earrings; to all my nephews and nieces jointly, including the two named herein, all the remainder of my tangible personal property and effects, to be divided among them as they may agree. If they can not agree upon a division among themselves, my Executor is empowered and directed to make a division among them in such a manner as said executor may think just and proper, with the view of giving <sup>to</sup> each a substantially equal share in value.

FIFTH.- All the remainder of my property of every kind and wherever situated, I give devise and bequeath to Security Trust Company, a corporation organized under the laws of Kentucky, with its
