

#### Treatment program to benefit from fines

FRANKFORT — Dependency-treatment officials and court administrators have high expectations for a new law that channels fines paid in public-drunkenness arrests to

that channels fines paid in public-drunkenness arrests to programs for counseling alcoholies.

"This new law is a big step in providing care to alcoholics," said Robert Walker, director of the Comprehensive Care Center in Lexington. "There's really not a great deal of treatment across the state now."

The law, effective July 1, requires that anyone guilty of alcohol intoxication, or drinking alcoholic beverages in a public place, be fined not less than \$25 for a first or second offense.

For a third or subsequent offense within a 12-month period, the conviction carries a \$25 to \$100 fine, a jail term of five to 90 days, or both.

#### High Court rules on libel case

WASHINGTON — The news media do not have to prove the truth of defamatory statements that prompt libel lawsuits, the Supreme Court ruled yesterday.

By a 5-4 vote in a case involving *The Philadelphia Inquirer*, the justices said the Constitution requires people who sue the news media to prove that the defamatory statement about them is false.

Past rulings had established that public officials and public figures who sue for libel have the burden of proving the allegedly libelous statements were untrue. But until yesterday, state laws varied over who — a plaintiff or defendant — has the burden of proof when a private citizen sues the news media.

#### Gorbachev addresses East Germans

BERLIN — Soviet leader Mikhail S. Gorbachev stepped up his courtship of Western Europe yesterday by saying he would support disbanding the Warsaw Pact and NATO alliances.

At the same time, Gorbachev voiced readiness to meet again with President Reagan if "the appropriate international atmosphere is created."

The Soviet leader, on a visit to East Germany, also charged that the United States had ignored the opinion of its West European allies by sending warplanes to bomb Libya last week.

Head of Libya's Catholic Church freed TRIPOLI, Libya — The leader of Libya's Roman Catholics, freed after 10 days of detention, said yesterday that he was questioned about church activity in this Mos-lem country and that the U.S. air strike probably delayed his release.

Bishop Giovanni Martinelli, arrested April 10 in Benghazi with four priests and a nun, said he was released Saturday and returned to the Libyan capital Sunc the other clerics were released over the weekend. ned to the Libvan capital Sunday, and that

Martinelli spoke guardedly and would not go into detail about the reasons for his arrest or elaborate on his interro gation. He would say only that the Libyans "questioned us about our presence and work as Roman Catholic priests."

The Libyan government apologized for the said it had been a mistake, Martinelli said.
