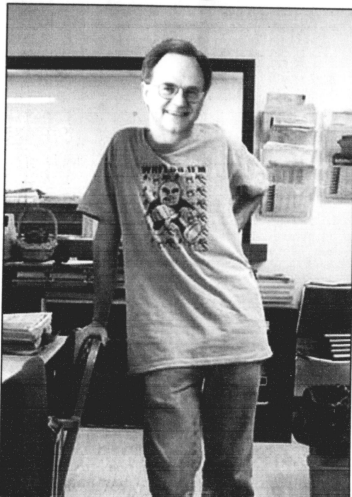

### Dress for success: Experts give advice on how to make a positive first impression

It's sad but true. First impressions in a job interview can outweigh four years of college work. For advice on making good first impressions, the Kernel turned to some local career and business experts. Here are their suggestions.

#### Be prepared

This means getting related work experience long before the interview, doing research on the business, wearing the appropriate clothes and being punctual.

"Have a plan," said Julia Hawkins, an assistant director at the Career Center.

The best way to do this is to learn as much as possible about the job. Alonso Cortez, a financial analyst and recruiter for Proctor and Gamble, suggests getting involved in activities related to the field you're interested in.

"The biggest mistake students make is that they wait too long to get involved," Cortez said.

Another way to impress

is to be knowledgeable of the company before the interview. By doing this, the interviewer will know you are serious about getting the job. Hawkins recommended structuring your resume around the company's goals.

Another way to make sure you're making the best possible impression is dressing properly. Unless specified, an interviewer expects you to wear a business suit.

"Business casual is not true for interviews anymore," Hawkins said.

The last and most important rule concerning preparation is to be on time.

"Being late, even if traffic is bad, is not an excuse," said Diane Kohler, associate director of the Career Center.

#### Be a storyteller

Be prepared to talk about your qualifications in a conversational way.

"Before you go into an interview, you need to review your resume and have stories ready," Kohler said.

Employers said they encourage applicants to share

examples of their accomplishments and experiences.

"Don't sell yourself short," Cortez said.

Cortez uses the acronym "CAR" — Context, Action, Result — to remember how to tell his stories. He gives the background information, what happened and what has occurred because of it.

It is important to know what you can bring to the company. Employers want to hear about your future plans.

"One of the biggest complaints employers have with students is that they don't have clear objectives," Hawkins said.

To prepare for questions about your qualifications, make lists of your positive and negative qualities, and then focus on how to improve on the positives and work on the negatives.

#### Be curious

Don't be afraid to let people know you're interested.

"Questions make a good impression," Kohler said.

You should ask about the biggest challenges you will face, evaluations and opportunities for more training, Kohler said.

Above all, have a concluding statement ready for the end of the interview.

"Don't just stand up and say goodbye," Kohler said.

She said you should always thank interviewers and ask if any more information is needed.

#### Be consistent

If you get the job, it's important to meet the expectations you established in the interview.

"Carry over the same intensity," Brown said.

The attitude and people skills demonstrated in the interview should also be continued.

"The most common reason for people being let go is not a lack of knowledge," Kohler said.

"It is a lack of interpersonal skills."

"If you don't get the job, you should still maintain a level of decorum."

"You don't want to burn bridges," Kohler said.

Human resource people change jobs frequently, so you never know when you will see them again.

The outcome has a lot to do with the interview and first days of work, so students are encouraged to take the first days of work seriously.

"You only get one chance to make a first impression," Kohler said.

## The question: buy or rent?

### Property: Some rent and some own, students decide their living situations

Oh, the decisions to be made after graduation. Should you take the job far away for better money or stick closer to home? Should you opt for graduate school before taking a job at all?

And should you rent an apartment or buy a home? While buying a home at such a young age sounds almost surreal, many graduates choose to make their monthly payments to the bank rather than to the landlord.

"I looked into renting an apartment and a townhouse," said Ryan Leigh Bennett, homeowner and recent graduate of LCC, "but I decided that for about the same payment every month I wouldn't have to wait for the landlord every time something went wrong."

But having a landlord isn't as bad as it sounds, said Melanie Lein, branch manager of National City Bank-Tates Creek. "Many times recent graduates work more than 40 hours per week, and not having to worry about the small things — lawn care would be a good example — can be very important."

"I myself chose to rent after graduation," Lein said, "for the sheer fact that if I was transferred in my new job, I wouldn't be tied down."

But being tied down was not a worry for Steve Lesshaft, a finance senior who has owned a house in Lexington since his junior year.

"I bought my house because I have two younger brothers who will be moving in soon," Lesshaft said. "I shouldn't have to sell for at least six or eight years."

He recently refinanced his home, this time choosing an adjustable-rate mortgage to take advantage of the low interest rates. There is more

uncertainty with an adjustable-rate mortgage, Lesshaft said, but the interest rate was capped so that it could not rise more than one percent per year, which alleviates some of the risk.

He added that while most lending companies refuse to lend to certain people based on salary levels or debt-income ratios, there is at least one alternative — the Federal Housing Administration loan program.

Available only to first-time home buyers, FHA loans allow the buyer to put down only three percent of the loan at closing, which can be a big help to those who are only beginning to earn a real income.

"The FHA loan let me build some equity without paying through the nose at closing," said Lesshaft.

But even after financing a home, Lein said the amount of money spent on incidental costs and home repair might be enough to discourage a graduate from buying rather than renting.

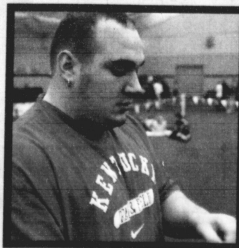
"Once you buy your house, you realize that you basically have to start from scratch," she said. "You need to buy a lawn mower. You need to buy a ladder to get up in the gutters. And then if the furnace or the air conditioner goes out, that's a major investment right from the start."

Bennett agreed that owning your own home has more hassles than renting, but she added that certain luxuries make buying a house worth the investment of time and money.

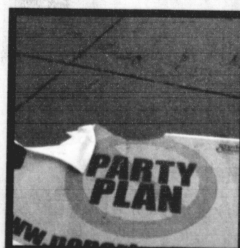
"If you want the real reason I bought a house instead of renting an apartment," she said, "I never have to worry about the person renting the apartment next door accidentally burning the place down."

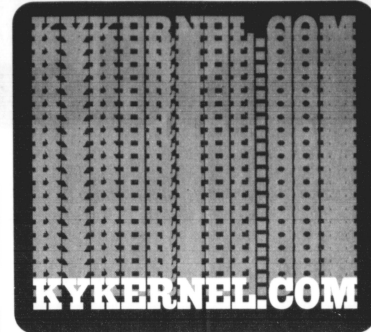

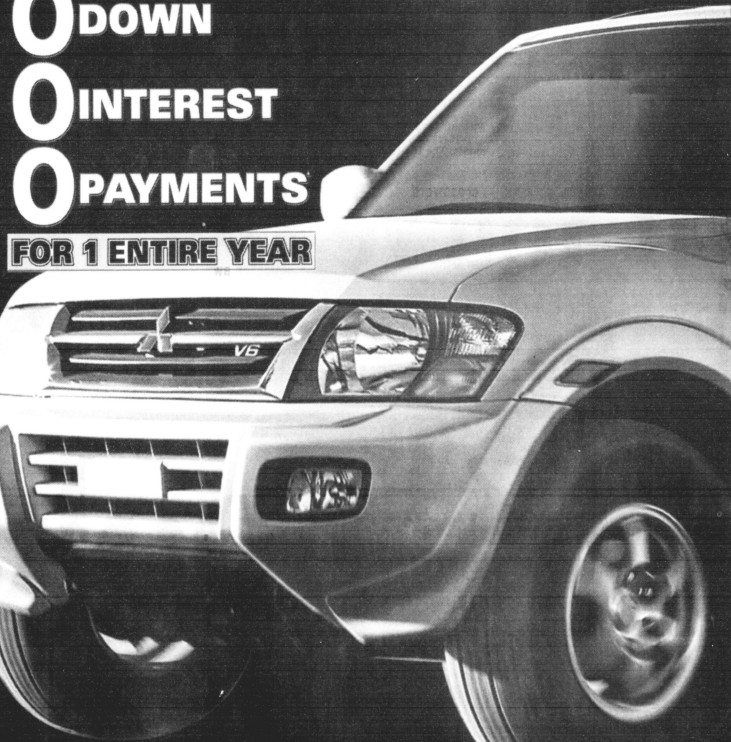

# Graduates should prepare to save

Sure, graduating means a lot of new, fun doors will open: freedom from classes, a life away from Ma and Pa ... heck, even the joy of no longer having to find on-campus parking in the morning.

But there's the bad side (play scary music here): the responsibility of paying bills and saving for the future.

For many students, nothing can be harder than a new job, apartment and car bills, let alone considering what they'll do when it's time to plan a wedding or retirement.

Many people think, "Man, talking about savings and all that jargon is boring," but for those graduating, experts say this is as good a time as ever to consider saving the moolah.

Listed below are some steps that several UK professors who deal with personal finance on a daily basis recommend.

This is how you get rich, baby.

### End credit card debt

According to economics professor Aaron Yelowitz, the first important step to saving is to pay off credit card debt.

"Before saving a dime, pay off credit card bills that have an 18 percent annual interest rate," Yelowitz said. "It makes no sense to save in one account and have another account where debt is collecting."

Students often charge too much on their cards, and many end up with large debts when they graduate, he said.

### Plan retirement

Yelowitz said that planning retirement right away is key to having money when the time comes.

Investing in a 401(k) retirement fund or an individual retirement account are ways to save money by avoiding taxes, he said.

Most jobs offer 401(k) plans, and if they aren't offered, 408(b) and 457(b) plans, which work in the same way, are often available. Through these plans, a worker can invest money that their employers will match.

Also, workers only pay taxes, when their money can be pulled out (at age 59 and a half). This way, taxes are low compared to what they would otherwise be.

"Money saved young has much more time to compound," Yelowitz said.

### Save up for the basics

From a house to a wedding and children, the need for money can be much more immediate than retirement.

For these kinds of investments, an index mutual fund (visit vanguard.com) can be helpful, Yelowitz said.

In index mutual funds, the amount you make depends on how the stock market does.

And even though the market has had its downtime lately, there's still reason to trust it, he said.

"My philosophy is to put money in each month, regardless of whether the market goes up or down," Yelowitz said.

An investment of \$10,000 can become \$100,000 over 25 years, he said.

### Don't blow your money

One of the hardest things for students to start doing is saving, says Ray Forgue, a family studies professor.

"When they get out of college, students think they have to go buy a new car," he said. "They fail to understand that the way to get rich is over time."

Ross Crawford, a graduating civil engineering senior, is planning to buy a new car and get a better apartment.

But saving is something he will look into, he says.

"I'm planning on upgrading but in the same sense saving," he said.

Crawford will also need to pay off the couple hundred dollars of credit card debt he's gathered while in school.

Students are rarely in his position, Crawford said. While he already has a good job lined up, many graduates do not.

"A lot of students are not in the same situation," he said.

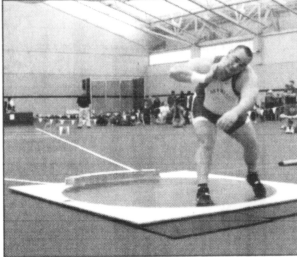
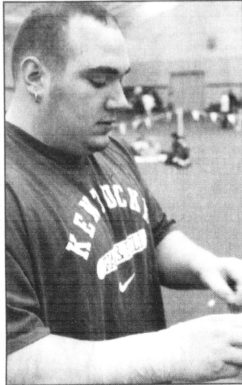

## Shot put star aims for 2004 Olympics

Still the guy to beat: UK sophomore won two consecutive conference shot put titles

Jeff Chakouian has competed at every level his sport has to offer, but he won't be happy until he wins an NCAA title and makes the U.S. shot put team. Chakouian, a UK sophomore and two-time Southeastern Conference Indoor Shot Put Champion, was a three-time national champ in high school and won the Massachusetts state title five times. He is a world-class athlete and wants to compete against the world's best shot putters.

"I want to throw for as long as I can," Chakouian said. "In 2004 I want to make the Olympic team. There are five or six guys competing for three spots and hopefully I can work myself into that position."

John Kennesson, Chakouian's coach at UK, said the young star's most conspicuous weakness is his fitness. That is something former UK hammer

thrower and fellow New Englander Matt Kavanaugh is working with him to improve. "Matt's a guy who's mostly helped me out in the weight room," said the Seekonk, Mass., native. Kavanaugh is from Rhode Island. "He's been to Olympic trials and was a four-time All-American," Chakouian said. "It helps to know I can be like him and I can do more than him."

Chakouian was an All-American last year when he placed third at the NCAA Indoor Championships. Since then he has won two junior international titles, one in England at the Junior World Championships and the other at the Pan Am Games in Argentina, where he broke the meet record in October.

"The sky is the limit for this kid," Kavanaugh said. "He's the most naturally gifted thrower I've ever been around. And he's just a baby in this sport."

Athletes in throwing events

like the shot put, hammer and discus do not typically reach their peak until their late-20s or early-30s. But Chakouian is approaching world-class throwing distances at the age of 20.

He has a throw of 66-1 which provisionally qualifies him for the NCAA Outdoor Championships. But Chakouian wants to break 67 feet this season. Kennesson said anything close to 70 feet would put Chakouian in Olympic competition, but it's a goal Chakouian is aiming for by graduation.

"He's already surpassed a lot of records," Kennesson said. "And the records he's surpassed are by world-class people."

For now, Chakouian would be pleased with one — maybe two — NCAA Championships, but the Olympics are what drive him. The 2004 Olympics, and more realistically the 2006 games when Chakouian will be a mature 26-year-old, are goals he can only see a serious injury derailing.

"I would always rather go to a big meet against top competition," Chakouian said. "I just want to get as much experience at high level as I can."



Clayton Moss

Moss, a junior UK diver, won his second consecutive Southeastern Conference Championship in the one-meter springboard competition and finished third in the three-meter springboard. Moss also placed second at the SEC Championships on the platform. At the NCAA Diving Championships Moss placed second on the one-meter, fifth on the three-meter and sixth on the platform. He is a five-time All-American combined in the three events.



Tayshaun Prince

UK men's basketball's seventh all-time leading scorer with 1,775 points was named an All-American by the Associated Press for the second consecutive year. Prince, the 2001 Southeastern Conference Player of the Year, led UK in scoring in 2002 and scored a career-high 41 points against Tulsa in the East Regional. The senior ended his career fifth all-time in blocks with 142 and twelfth all-time in assists with 311.



Joseph Blanton

UK's ace pitcher is a probable first-round draft pick in this summer's amateur baseball draft. The junior from Brownsville, Ky., was 3-5 heading into play this weekend and had a 4.20 earned run average. He was ranked No. 37 on Baseball America's list of top professional baseball prospects by class.



Jesse Witten

Witten, a freshman and the No. 1 singles player on UK's tennis team, was ranked in the nation's top 10 the majority of the 2002 season. Witten led UK to a berth in the Southeastern Conference Championships Semifinals and was named SEC Men's Tennis Freshman of the Year. He is currently ranked No. 7 in the nation in singles.



Dennis Johnson

Johnson led the Southeastern Conference in sacks in 2001 with 12 during his junior campaign. The Harrodsburg, Ky., native was named All-SEC at defensive end and Honorable Mention All-American. He opted to leave school early and enter the NFL Draft where he was selected with the 98th pick in the third round by the Arizona Cardinals.



Ilkka Jantti

Jantti, a senior midfielder from Finland, led UK to a third consecutive NCAA Soccer Tournament appearance and was named Mid-American Conference Player of the Year. Jantti finished his career with 10 goals and 12 assists. He was also named first-team All-Great Lakes Region and second-team All-American.



Bradley Wheeldon

Wheeldon, a sophomore and member of the UK rifle team which placed second at the NCAA Championships for the second consecutive year, finished fifth in the nation in the smallbore competition. Wheeldon also finished fourth in the air rifle competition at the 2002 NCAA Rifle Championships at Murray, Ky., in March.



John Holmes

UK's top golfer as a freshman finished in the top 25 at the Southeastern Conference Championships April 21. Holmes had the lowest individual average on the UK golf team and earned medalist honors at the Marshall Invitational and the Johnny Owens Invitational this season. The Campbellsville, Ky., native led the Cats to an eighth place finish at the SEC Championships, their best finish since 1991.



Greg Raber

Raber, a junior goalkeeper, transferred to UK in 2001 after two seasons at UNC-Wilmington. After winning a starting position Raber finished the season 10-2-0 with a .40 goals against average, which ranked second in the nation. Raber was named second-team All-Mid-American Conference and recorded seven shutouts on the season. He also recorded the first ever assist by a UK goalkeeper during the 2001 season.

## Tennis tandem forms winning combination

In the fall of 1999 sophomore Sarah Witten won the Rolex Regional Indoor Doubles Championship in Winston Salem, N.C. It was the first major doubles tournament the duo won, but it certainly wasn't the last.

A lot has passed since that doubles victory at Wake Forest, but one thing remains certain: Mayorga and Witten are as good a doubles team as you will find in the college ranks.

Mayorga, now a senior, and Witten, a rapidly rising junior, come from different backgrounds. Mayorga hails from Bogota, Columbia, and Witten traveled to UK from Naples, Fla. They've been partners for three years and have established quite a resume all-the-while remaining modest enough to defer compliments to the other doubles teams on the Cats roster.

The key to the duo's success is a mixture of familiarity and a vast arsenal.

"Lauren (Rookledge) and Leigh (Bradwell) are every bit as good and strong, but Carolina and Sarah have a more varied way of doing things," UK Coach Mark Guilbeau said. "Playing together for so long is an advantage they've had and it separates them."

The duo first met when Witten arrived at UK and began showing her skills. It didn't take long before Witten showed

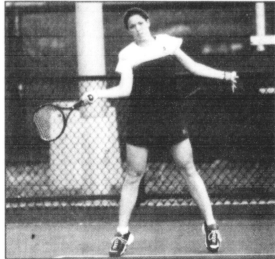

she could play with the best, and Guilbeau paired her up with Mayorga to form the Cats' toughest doubles tandem.

The move has paid off. The twosome is No. 8 in the country. They have enjoyed success in the past reaching the quarterfinals of the NCAA Doubles Championship last season and earned All-America status. As the doubles championships loom on the horizon the partners hope for a top eight seed and a performance that would outdo last year.

Mayorga praised Guilbeau and a steadfast relationship with Witten for the duo's success.

"We've made huge progress," Mayorga said. "We've worked so hard with (Guilbeau) ... he knows a lot."

The duo will compete in the NCAA Doubles National Championship beginning May 16 in Palo Alto, Calif. and believe they have as good a chance to win as anyone.

Guilbeau said if Mayorga

and Witten play to their capability, then they have a great chance to advance to the semifinals or finals.

"If they rise up and peak like they did last year I think they've got every chance in the world to make it to the semis or finals," he said.

Guilbeau has seen vast improvement in the two players. He has seen them mature and become better individually, as well as a doubles pair.

He said Mayorga has shown the most improvement along the way, while it was merely a matter of time before Witten would show her natural skills on the court.

Mayorga and Witten steadily improved individually the last three years, but their success as partners is a result of how they compliment each other.

"I love playing with Carolina," Witten said. "Our game styles go well together and winning always makes things go well in the end."



### Aronda Primault

Primault finished sixth in the vault at the NCAA Championships April 18 to earn her first All-America honor. The sophomore was UK's top all-around gymnast in just her second collegiate season and the first GymKat to compete at Nationals since 1998. She did not record a fall in 2002, and in 2001 barely missed Nationals by placing seventh in the all-around at the Central Region Championships.



### Simidele Adeagbo

Adeagbo, a junior long jumper and triple jumper, placed 14th in the triple jump at the 2002 NCAA Indoor Track and Field Championships. In 2001 Adeagbo won five of seven indoor triple-jump meets and placed third at the Southeastern Conference Indoor Championships. She earned All-America honors with a fourth place finish in the triple jump at the 2001 NCAA Championships. She runs on the UK 800-meter relay team.



### Annie Gage

Gage led the women's soccer team to the semifinals of the Southeastern Conference Tournament and an NCAA Tournament berth. Moving between defensive and offensive positions, Gage was named to the All-Great Lakes Region and All-SEC teams during her senior season. She led UK in goals with 11, assists with 8 and is UK's all-time career assist leader. She finished her career second on UK's all-time goal list.



### Trisha Tumlinson

Tumlinson, a freshman diver, placed 13th on the platform at the NCAA Women's Diving Championships after finishing fourth in the same event at the Southeastern Conference Swimming and Diving Championships. She also finished 31st on the one-meter springboard and 27th on the three-meter springboard at the NCAA Diving Championships.



### Whitney Sample

Sample finished her volleyball career fourth on UK's all-time assists list with 2,880, passing former Cats Terri Crabb and Ainsley Grimes. She led the Cats in assists her senior season and was a team captain. Sample, one of two seniors, led the Cats to a 12-win season.



### Janet Crawford

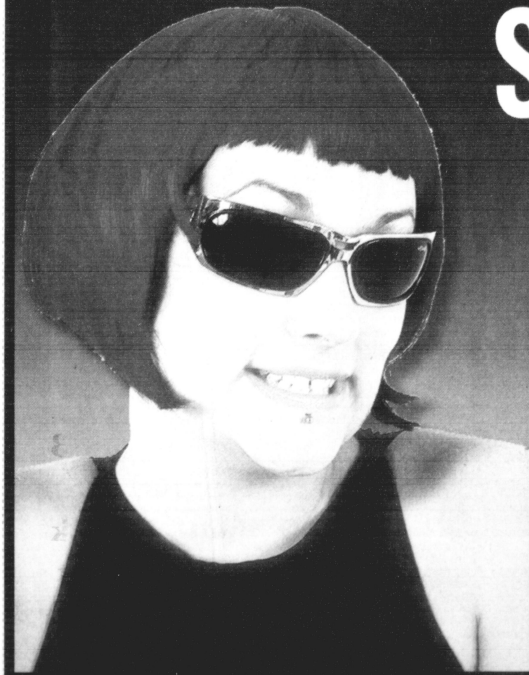
Crawford followed up her fourth place finish in the high jump at the 2001 Southeastern Conference Indoor Track and Field Championships by winning the event this season. The junior from Fleming County also finished fifth in the high jump at the 2001 SEC Outdoor Track and Field Championships.

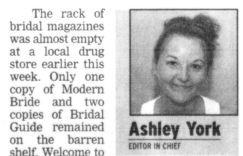

It's a man's world, even in marriage



The rack of bridal magazines was almost empty at a local drug store earlier this week. Only one copy of Modern Bride and two copies of Bridal Guide remained on the barren shelf. Welcome to wedding season. Crunch time is here—brides are frantic, fathers are melancholy and wedding planners are getting rich. Most women spend the days before their wedding worrying if they'll get the vows right or if they'll fall on their face because of the mile-long trains on their dresses when they walk down the aisle. And while it is tradition, it's also problematic. Don't get me wrong. I believe in love, monogamy, honeymoons and all the other fun stuff that goes along with getting married. I just can't help but wonder if it is necessary to sign a legal document, change my name and have a \$10,000 ceremony to enjoy those things. After years of contemplation, I decided it's not. The only purpose of marriage, with the exception of succumbing to tradition and appeasing parents who oppose cohabitation, is that it grants people benefits like

health insurance and tax breaks. The discussion about why two people have to form a legal union to enjoy these benefits is a discussion for another time, as is the debate about why marriage is a formality only available to straight couples. "Why should people get things like health care benefits because of who they sleep with?" asked Joan Callahan, a philosophy professor. "Especially when it's mandated by the law that they have to sleep with someone of a certain sex."

After engaging in an enlightening conversation with Callahan about marriage and its traditions, it became clear to me that when looking at marriage within a patriarchal framework it just seems that the institution itself serves certain purposes that place women in a subservient role to men. Historically, it has been an institution that guarantees a man exclusive access to a woman.

Just think about the way traditional marriages work today. The father walks the bride down the aisle and gives her away to the groom. Of course, everyone in the church is too busy smiling at the beautiful bride standing there in her white dress, which, of course, she wears for the sake of tradition, to even notice the property exchange going on. It's also important to note that the dress is white to signify virginity (i.e. she's a virgin), when we all know that

the couple standing in front of the church probably slept together the night before.

"I'll never forget the vows from the last wedding I attended. The preacher had done this gig a million times. 'She came from man so we call her woman,'" he said. "In his house she will serve him." And the finale—"I now pronounce you man and wife." Why is she referred to as the "wife"? Maybe it's because that's a nice prelude to the way the preacher often times ends the ceremony. "Ladies and gentlemen, Mr. and Mrs. I'm gonna vomit." They may as well say this, since the woman just lost her identity right there in front of God and everybody.

While traditional ceremonies certainly deserve some critical analysis, the changing of the name happens to be the most significant aspect to the argument against marriage. Think about it. Changing your name under any circumstance is very significant. And in a wedding setting, the woman changes her name from her father's to her husband's. I suppose that's the completion of the transfer from father to husband.

Perhaps it's extreme to say women become the property of their husbands in contemporary weddings, but historically this is where the tradition came from when institutions used to forbid women from buying or owning property.

But today, it's funny how women justify things like changing their names, often

Making the case for marriage in modern world

To some, a defense of marriage might seem as necessary as a defense of puppies. But to others, apparent marriage is as outdated as polyester. Heck, marriage has only been a functional institution since the founding of the ancient world.

By no means should this imply that a long history provides justification (tyranny and despotism both have long histories), but one should be careful before casting aside an institution through which billions of people have found, and will continue to find, a source of happiness, comfort and success.

There are problems with marriage, of course. But I seriously doubt that any couple standing at the altar is thinking about the health care benefits they are about to receive, or the joint tax return they will file next April. I doubt they read up on the historic nature of marriage, the dowry and all of the patriarchal notions associated with a wedding.

If I could venture a guess, I would say they are thinking about love. Call me naive, but while marriage may have been created for what today seem like ulterior motives, that does not necessarily mean it is a wholly unworthy institution in contemporary society. After all, Rogaine was created to help those with high cholesterol, until doctors noticed all they got were really hairy people with heart problems.

Should marriage roll with the times? It already has, to a great extent. Divorce was once grounds for execution, but today people seem to get married for the express purpose of filing for divorce (especially in the celebrity world, where the two proceedings might as well be combined into one).

Should it roll even more? Sure, but not without due cause and deliberation. There are very persuasive arguments for opening up marriage to homosexuals (although many gay and straight people would agree the two are inherently incompatible), but the immediate lack thereof should not lead to the termination of marriage as a whole.

The simple point is that we as a society should always be wary before making radical changes in our institutions and traditions. We should kick the tires on new ideas, letting them simmer a little while to discover their validity, because those traditions, and those institutions, are more entangled in our everyday lives than we can fathom.

As Friedrich Hayek noted, such institutions are the real storehouses of human knowledge; "[M]ore 'intelligence' ... is incorporated in the system of rules of conduct than in man's thoughts and surroundings." What this means is that by destroying the institution of marriage, we might be throwing a whole lot more out of the bath water than just the baby.

The argument against marriage cannot be based solely on reason, as many postmodern anti-marriage advocates would suggest. No, two people need not wear a ring or sign a piece of paper to remain monogamous and endure decades of struggles. But many people aren't that strong. To them, marriage provides not only a legal, but an emotional union as well. It bestows a sense that they are in this thing together. To view this from a purely rational standpoint completely discounts the nasty parts of human nature.

One analogous example would be the judge in a courtroom. Those who adhere strictly to reason would criticize the manner in which a judge sits elevated relative to everyone else, donning a solid black robe. After all, everyone knows who the judge is.

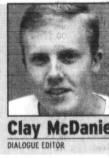
But the robe symbolizes impartiality, the elevation confers authority and both serve important purposes.

Likewise, a wedding ceremony, the exchange of vows and all the pomp and circumstance are not merely obligations on the path to state recognition of marriage—many choose to have their nuptials at the courthouse. It is much more than the changing of a name or the signing of a document.

As it exists today, marriage might be seen as the backbone of our culture. It provides stability in a rapidly changing world, and while changes will and should be made in the coming years, discarding it out of hand would be a shortsighted solution to an underdeveloped and poorly thought-out problem.

And that is not progress.

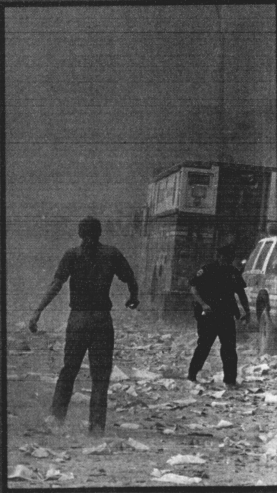
## Salvaging

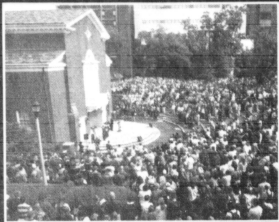

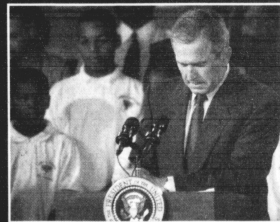

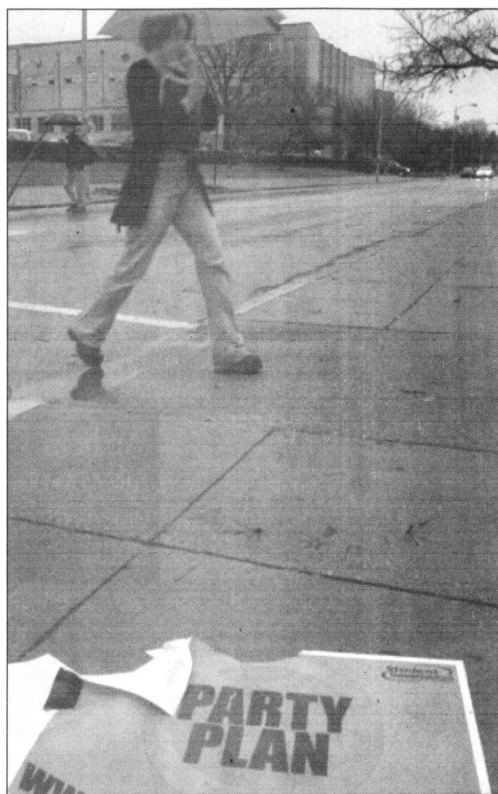

More than 300 students came to the Lexington Government Center in December to show opposition to the Lexington-Fayette Urban City Government's proposal to pass the Lexington Area Party Plan, a plan that would curtail residential parties. Under LAPP, residents who get two neighborhood disturbances that require police enforcement get their home capped as a no party property for one year. If the resident makes another disturbance that requires the police, that resident must pay a \$500 fine. More than 70 campus-area business owners signed a petition opposing the plan. Students said this legislation was aimed to push them out of neighborhoods, but proponents of LAPP said it was instituted only to get rid of perpetual offenders. Despite student intervention, LAPP was passed in December.

Among other things, SG bought TV and radio advertisements, posters and stickers, had student voter registration drives and organized carpooling to get students to the Government Center downtown. Tim Robinson, SG President, and other SG members tried to compromise the plan with the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government. Robinson said, "We see this as a tool to move us out of here." Despite SG's campaign and the student body's intervention, the Lexington-Fayette Urban City Council passed LAPP in early December.

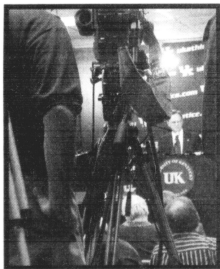

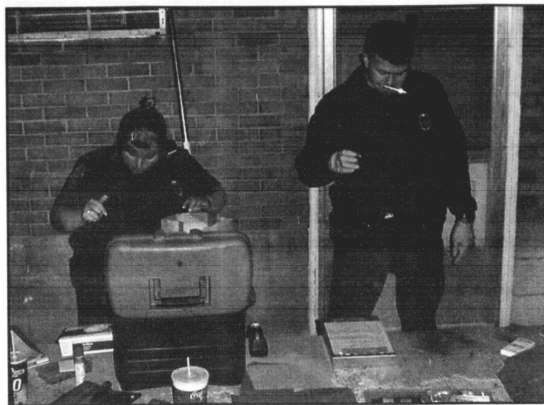

Moore agreed to enroll in a pre-trial diversion program and avoided sentencing.

**Football players charged with arson**

Freshman football players Jeremy Darveau, Brett Hamblen and Benjamin Scott were charged with arson in December after they allegedly burned a bulletin board, two plastic trash cans and some ceiling tiles in Kirwan 1. Charges against Darveau and Scott were dropped because of lack of evidence. Hamblen waived his right to a preliminary hearing and transferred his case to the Fayette County Grand Jury.



**Pro-life group sparks peaceful abortion demonstrations**

The Genocide Awareness Project, a pro-life abortion group, brought 25 graphic murals to campus and displayed them in front of the Whitehall Classroom Building for two days in April. Images on the murals included dismembered human fetuses and pictures comparing abortion to historically recognized forms of genocide. Student groups, such as the Feminist Alliance, peacefully objected to GAP's presence on campus. Both days were peaceful.

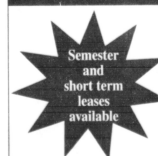

## After midnight

The Resident Student Council is planning on having a final proposal finished for 24-hour visitation sometime next semester, said Noah Friend, chairman of their visitation committee.

Action was taken in March students and members of Student Government expressed their concern that UK's policy needed to be updated to more closely reflect the policies of other universities in Kentucky, as well as other benchmark institutions.

For instance, the visitation policies of Murray State University and Western Kentucky University are much more open than UK's — both allow members to come in during 24 hours a day.

SG President Tim Robinson agrees that UK's visitation policy is behind the times and doesn't give students enough credit as adults.

"We are an aspiring Top-20 university, but have an incredibly paternalistic policy," Robinson said.

In early April, Resident Student Council's assembly approved a resolution to change UK's visitation policy, but it did not include the 24-hour plan because they said they ran out of time.

"I'm looking forward to hearing from student leaders on this after Student Government and the Resident Student Council have found a compromise, said Tony Ralph, associate director of Residence Life.

But even if a change is made next semester, housing agreements are made for a full school year. This means that a switch to 24-hour visitation would have to wait until at least 2003, said Jim Wims, director of Residence Life.

But for the policy to change, there is still work to be done, said Senate Chairman Edwin Orange. "... (There is still some red tape."
