

January 21, 1919

The Senate met in the Senate room Monday, January 21 at 3:45, President McVey presiding.

The minutes of the meeting of December 21, also council minutes of January 10 and 17 were read and approved.

The committee appointed to make recommendations in reference to the organization of the University Club reported progress and asked for further time, which was granted.

The following recommendation from the special committee of the Council was adopted:

If not a graduate of an accredited high school the student must present entrance credits for 15 units, including those prescribed, and pass examinations in four subjects as follows:

1. English - (including composition)
2. Mathematics - (including algebra and plane geometry)
3. Two subjects of at least one unit each to be selected by the student from the following subjects:

German	History	Chemistry
French		Biology

If the student is not a graduate of the school from which he comes he will not be admitted to entrance examinations within one year after leaving school unless presents a statement of honorable dismissal.

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- 2. That Matriculation Lectures be omitted for this school year.
- 3. That the Department of Art and Design be authorized to grant a teaching certificate in Fine Arts to those who complete the requirements for the A. B. degree and also Art and Design courses 1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8,9.
- 4. That the University return to the practice of reporting absences weekly.
- 5. That credits for lecture and recitation courses in Military Science be granted on the same basis as for other courses.
